# FOR CITIZENS OF THE UAE

**Entry in Montenegro** - (<https://www.gov.me/en/diplomatic-missions/embassies-and-consulates-of-montenegro/united-arab-emirates>) <https://pickvisa.com/visa-policies/montenegro-visa>

Nationals of the United Arab Emirates may enter, pass through the territory of and stay in Montenegro up to 90 days, with a valid travel document, without a visa.

UAE citizens (locals) do not need a visa to enter and stay in Montenegro for up to 90 days in a period of 180 days.

Residents need a visa for which they can apply at the **Embassy of Montenegro in Abu Dhabi. (Villa 1, Building 69, Rabdan street 29, Al Mushrif, Abu Dhabi, P.O. Box 95083)**

The consular fee for a visa application is 160 AED, which is approximately 40 euros. **Additionally, when Fly Dubai operates a direct line, according to Article 8 of the Visa Regulation, holders of valid foreign travel documents with a residence permit in the United Arab Emirates can enter, cross the territory and stay in Montenegro for up to 10 days without a visa. They need to have a certificate on the tourist arrangement (insurance, accommodation, funds), return air ticket on the direct route United Arab Emirates – Montenegro, provided that the residence permit is valid for at least 30 days from the date of leaving Montenegro and have evidence of adequate travel history. You can enter Montenegro with your Schengen visa, provided the visa still has valid entries left as well as remaining days of stay. This also applies to holders of residence permits for a Schengen country.**

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**For holders of diplomatic and official passports:**

No visas required

**For holders of ordinary passports and other travel documents:**

No visas required for visits of up to 90 days within a 6 months period

The Protocol between the Government of the Republic of Serbia and the Government of the United Arab Emirates on the amendments to the Agreement between the Government of the Republic of Serbia and the Government of the United Arab Emirates on the exemption of visas for holders of diplomatic and official/special passports, signed in New York on 26 September 2018, entered into force on 12 May 2019.

Under the Protocol, nationals of either State, holders of diplomatic, official, special, ordinary and service passports, and members of diplomatic and consular

missions, other than those in the territory of the State of the other Party, shall enter, exit, transit and stay in the territory of the other Party without a visa and free of charge, for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days, through border posts for international passenger traffic.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** There are no restrictions on entering the Republic of Serbia. The recommendation to wear masks indoors remains in force, while wearing masks in health facilities is mandatory.

**Entry in Bosnia and Herzegovina- Citizens of the United Arab Emirates are exempted from visa requirement** for entry, exit, transit and stay on the territory of **Bosnia and Herzegovina** up to 90 days, for a period of six months, starting from the day of entry.

**Holders of diplomatic and service passports of the United Arab Emirates are exempted from the visa requirement** when entering, exiting or travelling through Bosnia and Herzegovina up to 90 days. The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150,00 (ore equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) for each day of intended stay.

Nationals of the following states may enter into Bosnia and Herzegovina with a passport or a valid identity card proving identity and citizenship of:

- Member State of the European Union
- State signatory to the Schengen Agreement
- Andorra, Montenegro, Liechtenstein, Monaco, San Marino, Serbia, the Holy See and Swiss Confederation

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** The Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina has adopted a Decision on declaring a natural or other disaster on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina ('Official Gazette of BiH', 18/20), due to the danger of an epidemic of infectious disease caused by new coronavirus (COVID-19), in order to reduce the risk of accelerated spread of infection in Bosnia and Herzegovina and enable the engagement of additional resources to respond to this public health threat.

In order to prevent and suppress the spread of the SARS-COV-2 virus, the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina also adopted a **DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA**, as well as **DECISION ON AMENDMENT OF THE DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA** ('Official Gazette of BiH', 36/21').

**(Article 2) A foreigner who meets conditions for entry to BiH prescribed by Law on Aliens, may enter BiH if he/she at the BiH Border Crossing Points presents any of the following:**

- negative PCR test or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, not older than 48 hours if he/she comes from a European country, and if he/she comes from another country, not older than 72 hours until arrival at the border crossing point of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- certificate that a person has received the second dose of vaccine for COVID-19 before more than 14 days before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH or has received one dose before 14 days and more before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH, if it is a single dose vaccine
- certificate issued by doctor showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19 in the previous period from 14 to 180 days until the arrival to a Border

## Crossing Point of BiH.

### **(Article 3) Exemptions from Article 2 of the Decision, foreigners who may enter Bosnia and Herzegovina without presenting a negative test result or certificates are:**

- citizens of Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and the Republic of Serbia, when they enter Bosnia and Herzegovina directly from the country of which they are citizens, as well as their minor children and spouses who are citizens of other countries,
- the crew and cabin crew of the aircraft whose final destination is Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- drivers and co-drivers of freight vehicles when performing international transport of goods by road, provided that their stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina does not last longer than 12 hours,
- crews of freight trains and ships in international traffic,
- diplomatic and consular staff and staff of international organizations in the performance of their official duties, who must have and present an appropriate valid passport upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- civil protection services and teams when their entry into Bosnia and Herzegovina is urgent and cannot be postponed,
- members of the military forces of the member states of the North Atlantic Treaty and other states participating in the Partnership for Peace and members of the NATO and EUFOR Headquarters in Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- heads of states and governments and members of their delegations whose arrival and departure from Bosnia and Herzegovina have been announced to Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina, through diplomatic channels or through protocols of the competent authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- foreigners transiting through the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the purpose of returning to the country of usual residence, without staying in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- a minor foreigner whose parent is a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as a foreigner who is the spouse of a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- children under the age of seven travelling with parents or guardians, if their parents or guardians possess negative PCR or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, or certificate on vaccination or certificate showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19,
- foreigners authorised to stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina temporarily or permanently, if they are returning to Bosnia and Herzegovina after exit and stay only in Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and/or the Republic of

Serbia, provided that total duration of their stay in the above countries has not been longer than 48 hours since they left the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina, which could be proved by exiting stamp, i.e. entering stamp in a travel document of the foreigner,

- foreigners – citizens of the Republic of Turkey crossing the state border of Bosnia and Herzegovina daily due to construction of the bridge Rača in the framework of realization of the Project motorway/expressway Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo. Ministry of Communication and Transport of BiH shall submit to the BiH Border Police a certified list of nationals of the Republic of Turkey Border Police hired as workers for construction of the Rača Bridge within the above mentioned Project, including their names, surnames and number of travel document they use for crossing of the BiH border; as well as certificate that the Project is implemented according to signed Agreement on Cooperation regarding realisation of the Project motorway/expressway road Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo (“Official Gazette BiH – International Agreements”, no. 13/20).

***Ukrainian citizens who left Ukraine due to the security situation***

By the Decision on prescribing additional conditions for the entry of foreigners into BiH, it is not prescribed what kind/type of PCR or antigen tests, i.e. form of tests or certificates is required to present at the border crossing points during intended entry to BiH, and it is possible to present them in printed or electronic form.

**Remarks:** Currently, when entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, no quarantine or self-isolation measures are prescribed, while upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, all persons are obliged to follow the instructions and respect all orders of the competent epidemiological and health authorities (social distance, protective masks, hand disinfection, etc.).

**Entry in Albania-** UAE Nationals do not need visa to travel to Albania. All foreigners that have a UAE residency will need to apply for an electronic visa before traveling to Albania, except holders of Golden Visa (10 year UAE residence visa). For application and required documents you have to apply via the official Albanian visa website: <https://e-visa.al/>

**Albania applies visa-free travel. Foreign citizens from Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, India, Qatar, Oman, and Thailand, can enter Albania without a visa, for a short-term stay, with a passport document, from 20 April until 31 December. Foreign citizens from Egypt and Russia can enter Albania without a visa, for a short-term stay, with a passport document, from 01 May until 30 September. Beyond those dates, they are required to obtain a visa.**

**IMPORTANT:** For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania. Albania Short-term visa's validity period can be a maximum of **90 days**.

Kindly note that the visa applications will take a minimum of 5 working days starting from the date of confirmation of the visa fee payment and can take up to 15 working days. Albania Short-term Visa fee is **35-60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for an Albania Short-term Visa in Albania visa application centers, embassies,

or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. In this case - **Embassy of Albania in Abu Dhabi (Villa No.75, Al Ma'ani Street Al Mushrif Area, P.O. Box: 62069 Abu Dhabi - United Arab Emirates).**

**General requirements:**

- **Application Form**
- **Passport**
- **Photo**
- **ID Card Copy**
- **Residence Permit/Visa Copy (if your country of residence and citizenship are different)**
- **Photocopies**
- **Travel Itinerary** (Flight reservation (return ticket), Valid (existing) hotel/accommodation booking/reservation with the full address (name, street, city, zip code, contact information, booking ref.)
- **Proof of Financial Means**
- **Travel Insurance**
- **Supporting Documents that Show Your Reason for a Trip**

**For tourism:** Confirmation of the accommodation (hotel confirmation, apartment rental contract, etc.), round-trip ticket reservation.

**For business/congress/sports travel:** Original invitation letter by the company/organization, confirmation of the accommodation (hotel confirmation, apartment rental contract, etc.), verbal note from the institution where the foreigner is employed.

**UAE Residents can enter Albania without a visa if:**

- a) Foreigners are holding a valid Schengen multi-pass visa, which has previously been used in one of the Schengen area countries, or who have a valid residence permit in one of the Schengen area countries;
- b) Foreigners holding a valid US or UK multi-pass visa, which has previously been used in one of these countries, or who have a valid residence permit in the US or the UK.

All foreigners who have a valid multi – entry Schengen visa, type “C” or “D”, or a valid residence permit in one of the Schengen member states, can enter, stay and transit Albania without visa, within the validity term of the visa or the residence permit. The same applies for all holders of Laissez-Passer issued by United Nations Organizations, and its branch, NATO, Council of Europe and European

Union, regardless of nationality. For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

Holders of a valid type “C” multiple-entry Schengen visa (which has been previously used in one of the countries in Schengen area) or a Residence Permit to the Schengen Area, also holders of a valid UK, Canada and US visa (which has been previously used for entering that country) may enter to Albania without a visa for up to 15 days.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**Entry in North Macedonia:** Entry visa for North Macedonia **NOT REQUIRED.**

**IMPORTANT:**

Nationals of EU Member States and signatories of the Schengen Agreement DO NOT need a visa to enter the Republic of North Macedonia (and are eligible to enter the Republic of North Macedonia with a valid national identity card). Third-country nationals with temporary residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long

as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period. Third-country nationals with permanent residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period. Third-country nationals with multiple-entry Schengen visa (type C) valid for at least 5 (five) days beyond the intended stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period. The Republic of North Macedonia has abolished short-term stay (Type C) visas for foreign nationals who are holders of valid passports of third countries and are simultaneously holders of valid UK, US, and Canadian visas, whereby the duration of their stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may not exceed 15 days, with the periods of validity of the valid UK, US, and Canadian visas they hold not exceeding more than 5 days from their planned stay in the Republic of North Macedonia. This decision is of a temporary character and shall be in force from 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2022.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** Visitors entering North Macedonia will no longer be required to present a vaccination certificate or a negative COVID-19 test.

**Entry in Slovenia:** ( <https://www.gov.si/en/representations/embassy-abu-dhabi/visa-information/> ) Citizens of the United Arab Emirates **do not need a short-stay visa** (C Type) for short-term visits to the Schengen Area.

The bilateral agreement between the European Union and the United Arab Emirates signed on 6 May 2015 *allows UAE citizens to stay in the Schengen Area without a visa for up to 90 days within any 180-day period.*

**Third-country nationals** - A national of a third country who wishes to enter and reside in the Republic of Slovenia for tourist, business, personal, or other purposes should obtain a visa prior to their entry into the country, unless they are citizens of countries that do not require a visa, or already hold one of the permits described below:

**Holders of a short-stay visa (C type)** issued by a Schengen country may, during the visa validity period, enter the Republic of Slovenia and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a long-stay visa (D type)** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this visa and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the long-stay visa, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the long-stay visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a residence permit** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this residence permit and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the residence permit, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the residence permit, whichever is sooner.

**Short-stay Visa (C type) application requirements:** All requested documents have to be submitted and translated into English or Slovenian.

### **General requirements**

- ***Valid passport or travel document.*** Must be valid for minimum 3 months after the journey and issued within the previous 10 years and have at least 2 blank pages. A copy of passport or travel document.
- ***Application form*** duly completed, dated and signed by the applicant.
- ***One (1) recent photograph.***
- ***Travel medical insurance*** covering the entire duration of the trip valid in the whole Schengen area. The minimum coverage of 30.000 euros, covering:

emergency medical expenses, hospital treatment, repatriation for medical reasons, or repatriation of remains. Multi-entry visa applicants must have insurance for the duration of the first trip.

- ***Copy of flight ticket or flight reservation including return flight.***
- ***Verifiable evidence of sufficient*** means of subsistence during intended stay: payslips for the last 3 months, valid international credit card accompanied by bank statements, bank account statements for the last three (3) months or a national form for proof of sponsorship and/or accommodation.
- ***Proof of accommodation:*** hotel reservation, proof of rental or ownership of real estate in the member state of destination, confirmation of private accommodation, mentioning that the host will cover the accommodation costs, confirmation of accommodation by the company inviting the applicant, mentioning that the company will cover the accommodation costs.
- ***Minors traveling without their parents/legal guardian:*** Original authorisation signed by their parents/legal guardian in front of a visa officer or duly legalised and copy of the passport(s) of parents/legal guardian.
- ***Residence permit*** valid three months beyond the intended date of departure from the territory of the Member States or, for GCC citizens, a UAE ID-card, valid for three months after the intended departure date from the territory of the Member States.
- ***Employees:*** original letter from employer stating the applicant's employment status, position, length of the contract and salary, self-employed persons: valid original trade license, documents to be submitted relating to the purpose of the journey.

**I. Business trip- Invitation from the inviting company (*Letter of Guarantee*) or an authority to attend a meeting, conference or event** (The invitation must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter of guarantee with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.) and other documents for work purpose (e.g. confirmed registration for trade fairs or congresses).

**II. Official delegation/mission-** Letter issued by the authority (-ies) concerned confirming identity of the applicant(s), purpose of the journey (meeting, consultation, negotiations or events held by intergovernmental organizations), period of intended stay and accommodation details.

**III. Tourism-** Full travel itinerary.

**IV. Private visit** - Invitation letter signed (Letter of Guarantee) by the host covering the period of the intended stay (The Invitation Letter must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.).

**V. Medical treatment** - A document issued by the medical institution in the Member State of destination confirming that the applicant will receive medical care in that institution; Pre-payment or other proof of sufficient financial means to cover the medical treatment and related expenses, such as insurance coverage.

**VI. Study or training** - A certificate of enrollment at an educational establishment for the purpose of attending vocational or theoretical courses within the framework of basic and further training.; Student cards or certificates of the courses to be attended.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**Entry in Croatia** - The citizens of United Arab Emirates don't need a visa to Croatia for Tourist purpose. **Citizen of United Arab Emirates (the):**

- Ordinary passport: No
- Diplomatic/official passport: No

**For people who have residence permission in UAE, visa requirements are in accordance with their citizenship.**

Pursuant to the Government's Decision, starting with 22 July 2014, the Republic of Croatia applies the Decision No 565/2014/EU. **All third-country nationals who are holders of valid Schengen documents, as well as national visas and residence permits of Bulgaria, Cyprus, and Romania do not require an additional (Croatian) visa for Croatia.**

Third-country nationals who are holders of:

**uniform visa (C) for two or multiple entries, valid for all Schengen Area Member States;**

**visa with limited territorial validity (LTV visa), for two or multiple entries, issued to the holder of a travel document that is not recognized by one or more, but not all of the Schengen Area Member States, and which is valid for the territory of the Member States recognizing the travel document;**

- **long-stay visa (D) for stays exceeding three months**, issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;

# FOR CITIZENS OF THE KINGDOM OF SAUDI ARABIA

Entry in Montenegro –

**Visas for citizens of Saudi Arabia will be temporarily suspended from 1. June until 30. September of this year.**

**Beyond those dates, nationals of Saudi Arabia are required to obtain a visa to enter Montenegro.** Visas may be obtained from diplomatic and consular posts of Montenegro. If you are unable to reach a diplomatic or consular post of Montenegro, you may apply for a visa at the nearest diplomatic or consular post of the Republic of Serbia. Visa requests are submitted directly in **The Embassy of Montenegro in the UAE which covers Saudi Arabia, Bahrain and Kuwait on a non-residential basis. (Villa 1, Building 69, Rabdan street 29, Al Mushrif, Abu Dhabi)** or in **Embassy of the Republic of Serbia in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (Abdulqader Al Jaza'eri Street, Building No. 26, Olaya District, Riyadh)**, from 9-14h during working days Sunday-Thursday. Please make an appointment before coming. Visa fee is **62,00 EUR or 300,00 SAR, payable in cash only.** Applications are accepted 90-30 days before the trip.

**Please note that an interview is required when receiving a visa application. From June 1 to September 30, the citizens of Saudi Arabia can stay, enter, cross the territory and stay in Montenegro for up to 30 days, with a valid travel document without a visa. Depending on other conditions defined by the Visa Regulation, residents must or may not have a visa (citizenship).** If they need it, they can apply at **The Embassy of Montenegro in the UAE which covers Saudi Arabia, Bahrain and Kuwait on a non-residential basis. (Villa 1, Building 69, Rabdan street 29, Al Mushrif, Abu Dhabi).** Also in **Embassy of the Republic of Serbia in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (Abdulqader Al Jaza'eri Street,**

**Building No. 26, Olaya District, Riyadh**), which, based on the agreement, covers Montenegro in the area of visa issuance.

You can enter Montenegro with your Schengen visa, provided the visa still has valid entries left as well as remaining days of stay.

This also applies to holders of residence permits for a Schengen country. *For a foreigner who is minor, i.e. legally incapable, visa application shall be filed by a parent or his legal representative.*

**In addition to the visa application, the foreigner shall submit:**

- valid travel document (the period of validity of the travel document should exceed that of the visas by three months);
- one color photo 35x45 mm;
- proof of the purpose of stay in Montenegro (letter of guarantee by a physical person or letter of invitation by a legal entity, state authority in Montenegro or organizer of an international conference or event);
- proof of ensured accommodation (receipt from a tourist arrangement, hotel or other type of accommodation reservation that has been paid in);
- proof of possession of means for sustenance during his stay in Montenegro, as well as for return into the country where he comes from or for travel into a third state (cash, a bank account, traveller's checks, credit cards etc.);
- proof of the means of travel and intention to return into the state where a foreigner comes from or into a third state (a return airplane or other transportation ticket, a driving license);
- proof of health insurance;
- proof that the consular fee has been charged,
- as well as other corresponding documents based on which the purpose and ensured accommodation in Montenegro can be determined.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Serbia Tourist visa is **3-10 calendar days**. It depends on your visa application country. Applications are accepted **90-30 days before the trip**. Visa requests are submitted directly in the Embassy, from 9-14h during working days Sunday-Thursday. Please make an appointment before coming. Visa fee is **62,00 EUR or 300,00 SAR, payable in cash only**. Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a Serbia Tourist visa in

Serbia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case, **Embassy of the Serbia in Saudi Arabia in Riyadh (Abdulqader Al Jaza'eri Street, Building No. 26, Olaya District, Riyadh, Saudi Arabia).**

**General visa requirements:**

- Valid passport (passport must be valid at least 90 days from issue date of visa)
- Letter of invitation:
  - for a private visit – invitation letter certified by the relevant authority of the Republic of Serbia
  - for a business visit – invitation letter by a company in Serbia;
  - for a tourist trip – a proof of payment for the trip issued by a travel agency (voucher or other type of payment receipt);
- Completed visa application form: (PDF) ;
- Photo (size 3.5x4.5cm);
- Return ticket or Itinerary (copy of Driving License and Insurance if you travel by car);
- Proof of sufficient funds for staying in Serbia;
- Health insurance
- Visa fee.

Holders of foreign passports having a valid Schengen, UK and other Member States' visa, or visa of the United States of America, and for holders of foreign passports having residence permit in the countries of the Schengen area, EU or the United States of America, may, without prior visa application, enter, transit or stay in the Republic of Serbia up to 90 days during a six-month period, but not exceeding the expiring date of the said visas or residence permits.

There is a possibility for foreign nationals to enter the Republic of Serbia with two passports e.a. expired national passport with valid visa or residence permit and valid national passport without valid visa or residence permit. Foreign nationals, holders of a residence permit in the form of a separate card (not a sticker affixed to their passport), must present their valid passport, upon entering the territory of the Republic of Serbia.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** There are no restrictions on entering the Republic of Serbia. The recommendation to wear masks indoors remains in force, while wearing masks in health facilities is mandatory.

**Entry in Bosnia and Herzegovina- Citizens of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia are required visas** when entering, exiting or travelling through Bosnia and Herzegovina.  **Holders of diplomatic and service passports of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia are exempted from the visa requirement** when entering, exiting or travelling through Bosnia and Herzegovina up to 90 days.

**IMPORTANT:** Applications should be made **at least 10-30 days before your intended departure date.** Bosnia & Herzegovina's fees cover only a part of the work necessary to process your application. Because processing fees are only for handling your application, you will not get your money back, even if your application is refused The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150,00 (ore equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) for each day of intended stay.

Bosnia and Herzegovina Short-term Visa fee is **31 EUR for single-entry and 57 EUR for a multiple-entry visa** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a Bosnia and Herzegovina Short-term visa in Bosnia and Herzegovina visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. Nationals of the following states may enter into Bosnia and Herzegovina with a passport or a valid identity card proving identity and citizenship of:

- Member State of the European Union
- State signatory to the Schengen Agreement
- Andorra, Montenegro, Liechtenstein, Monaco, San Marino, Serbia, the Holy See and Swiss Confederation.

The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150.00 (or equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) - for each day of the intended stay.

**Listed below are the documents required when applying for a visa to Bosnia and Herzegovina:**

- A valid passport of the applicant
- Application form (completed and signed)
- Copy of a valid residence visa
- Copy of a round trip ticket or itinerary
- One passport size picture
- Travel insurance
- No objection letter from your company or your sponsor

**In addition to the above, the following items must be presented:**

**If I travel as a tourist** : Voucher of the travel agency stating that the trip has been paid in full

Copy of your bank statement for the last 3 months

**If visiting friends and/or relatives:** Letter of invitation from the person(s) the applicant intends to visit, certified by the Ministry of Security of Bosnia and Herzegovina – Department for Foreign Citizens.

**If traveling on business:** Letter from the employer stating the purpose of the trip to Bosnia and Herzegovina

Letter of invitation from a company in Bosnia and Herzegovina, certified by the Ministry of Security of Bosnia and Herzegovina – Department for Foreign Citizens.

**Children under the age of 18:** For children under the age of 18 a birth certificate is required.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** The Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina has adopted a Decision on declaring a natural or other disaster on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina ('Official Gazette of BiH', 18/20), due to the danger of an epidemic of infectious disease caused by new coronavirus (COVID-19), in order to reduce the risk of accelerated spread of infection in Bosnia and Herzegovina and enable the engagement of additional resources to respond to this public health threat.

In order to prevent and suppress the spread of the SARS-COV-2 virus, the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina also adopted a **DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA**, as well as **DECISION ON AMENDMENT OF THE DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA** ('Official Gazette of BiH', 36/21').

**(Article 2) A foreigner who meets conditions for entry to BiH prescribed by Law on Aliens, may enter BiH if he/she at the BiH Border Crossing Points presents any of the following:**

- negative PCR test or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, not older than 48 hours if he/she comes from a European country, and if he/she comes from another country, not older than 72 hours until arrival at the border crossing point of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- certificate that a person has received the second dose of vaccine for COVID-19 before more than 14 days before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of

BiH or has received one dose before 14 days and more before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH, if it is a single dose vaccine,

- certificate issued by doctor showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19 in the previous period from 14 to 180 days until the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH.

**(Article 3) Exemptions from Article 2 of the Decision, foreigners who may enter Bosnia and Herzegovina without presenting a negative test result or certificates are:**

- citizens of Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and the Republic of Serbia, when they enter Bosnia and Herzegovina directly from the country of which they are citizens, as well as their minor children and spouses who are citizens of other countries,
- the crew and cabin crew of the aircraft whose final destination is Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- drivers and co-drivers of freight vehicles when performing international transport of goods by road, provided that their stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina does not last longer than 12 hours,
- crews of freight trains and ships in international traffic,
- diplomatic and consular staff and staff of international organizations in the performance of their official duties, who must have and present an appropriate valid passport upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- civil protection services and teams when their entry into Bosnia and Herzegovina is urgent and cannot be postponed,
- members of the military forces of the member states of the North Atlantic Treaty and other states participating in the Partnership for Peace and members of the NATO and EUFOR Headquarters in Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- heads of states and governments and members of their delegations whose arrival and departure from Bosnia and Herzegovina have been announced to Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina, through diplomatic channels or through protocols of the competent authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- foreigners transiting through the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the purpose of returning to the country of usual residence, without staying in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- a minor foreigner whose parent is a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as a foreigner who is the spouse of a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- children under the age of seven travelling with parents or guardians, if their parents or guardians possess negative PCR or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, or certificate on vaccination or certificate showing that he/she has

recovered from COVID-19,

- foreigners authorised to stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina temporarily or permanently, if they are returning to Bosnia and Herzegovina after exit and stay only in Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and/or the Republic of Serbia, provided that total duration of their stay in the above countries has not been longer than 48 hours since they left the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina, which could be proved by exiting stamp, i.e. entering stamp in a travel document of the foreigner,
- foreigners – citizens of the Republic of Turkey crossing the state border of Bosnia and Herzegovina daily due to construction of the bridge Rača in the framework of realization of the Project motorway/expressway Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo. Ministry of Communication and Transport of BiH shall submit to the BiH Border Police a certified list of nationals of the Republic of Turkey Border Police hired as workers for construction of the Rača Bridge within the above mentioned Project, including their names, surnames and number of travel document they use for crossing of the BiH border; as well as certificate that the Project is implemented according to signed Agreement on Cooperation regarding realisation of the Project motorway/expressway road Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo (“Official Gazette BiH – International Agreements”, no. 13/20).

***Ukrainian citizens who left Ukraine due to the security situation***

By the Decision on prescribing additional conditions for the entry of foreigners into BiH, it is not prescribed what kind/type of PCR or antigen tests, i.e. form of tests or certificates is required to present at the border crossing points during intended entry to BiH, and it is possible to present them in printed or electronic form.

**Remarks:** Currently, when entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, no quarantine or self-isolation measures are prescribed, while upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, all persons are obliged to follow the instructions and respect all orders of the competent epidemiological and health authorities (social distance, protective masks, hand disinfection, etc.).

**Entry in Albania-** Albania applies visa-free travel. Foreign citizens from Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, India, Qatar, Oman, and Thailand, can enter Albania without a visa, for a short-term stay, with a passport document, from 20 April until 31 December.

Foreign citizens from Egypt and Russia can enter Albania without a visa, for a short-term stay, with a passport document, from 01 May until 30 September.

**IMPORTANT:** Beyond those dates, nationals of Saudi Arabia are required to **obtain a visa**. For application and required documents you have to apply via the official Albanian visa website: <https://e-visa.al/>  
Albania Short-term visa's validity period can be a maximum of **90 days**.

Kindly note that the visa applications will take a minimum of 5 working days starting from the date of confirmation of the visa fee payment and can take up to 15 working days. Albania Short-term Visa fee is **35-60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for an Albania Short-term Visa in Albania visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. In this case - **Embassy of the Albania in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia in Riyadh (Diplomatic Quarter, Al Fazari Plaza, Unit No. G16 P.O. Box 94 004, Riyadh 11693)**

All foreigners who have a valid multi – entry Schengen visa, type “C” or “D”, or a valid residence permit in one of the Schengen member states, can enter, stay and transit Albania without visa, within the validity term of the visa or the residence permit. The same applies for all holders of Laissez-Passer issued by United Nations Organizations, and its branch, NATO, Council of Europe and European Union, regardless of nationality. For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

Holders of a valid type “C” multiple-entry Schengen visa (which has been previously used in one of the countries in Schengen area) or a Residence Permit to the Schengen Area, also holders of a valid UK, Canada and US visa (which has been previously used for entering that country) may enter to Albania without a visa for up to 15 days.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**Entry in Macedonia**- Entry visa for North Macedonia **REQUIRED**.

**IMPORTANT:** North Macedonia Short-term Visa fee is **60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a North Macedonia Short-term Visa in North Macedonia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. In this case - **The Embassy of North Macedonia in Doha, Qatar (Al Eithart Street 941, Area 63, Al Dafna, West Bay, Doha, Qatar)**.

The foreigner submits a visa application to the competent (resident or non-resident) diplomatic-consular representation of the Republic of North Macedonia no longer than six months and at least 15 days before the start of the intended trip. The visa application is submitted in person. Upon exception, the visa application may be submitted by another natural or legal person authorized to act as the proxy of the applicant when the foreigner is a disabled person or when the foreigner is a well-

known person and there is no doubt about his/her bona fide intentions. The application for a minor is submitted in person by a parent or a guardian.

**The applicant encloses the following documentation with the visa application:**

- Valid travel document (the validity period of the travel document should exceed that of the visa by at least three months), the travel document must have been issued within the last 10 years and it must include at least two empty pages for visa purposes and one photograph size 35x45 mm
- Proof of valid travel medical insurance
- Proof of fees paid
- Documents that prove: the purpose of the visit to RNM, secured accommodation, means of subsistence to cover the stay in RNM and the repatriation or the travel to a third country, means of transport and the intention to return to the country of origin or the intention to travel to a third country.

Nationals of EU Member States and signatories of the Schengen Agreement DO NOT need a visa to enter the Republic of North Macedonia (and are eligible to enter the Republic of North Macedonia with a valid national identity card). Third-country nationals with temporary residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period. Third-country nationals with permanent residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.

Third-country nationals with multiple-entry Schengen visa (type C) valid for at least 5 (five) days beyond the intended stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period. The Republic of North Macedonia has abolished short-term stay (Type C) visas for foreign nationals who are holders of valid passports of third countries and are simultaneously holders of valid UK, US, and Canadian visas, whereby the duration of their stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may not exceed 15 days, with the periods of validity of the valid UK, US, and Canadian visas they hold not exceeding more than 5 days from their planned stay in the Republic of

North Macedonia. This decision is of a temporary character and shall be in force from 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2022.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** Visitors entering North Macedonia will no longer be required to present a vaccination certificate or a negative COVID-19 test.

A short-stay visa (C type) is an authorization issued to a third-country national for entry and temporary stay (up to 90 days). An application for a C type visa should be submitted with the Schengen country that is the main destination. On behalf of Slovenia, this type of visa can also be issued by another Schengen country if the two countries have concluded a representation agreement. A C type visa may be extended in exceptional cases where the circumstances prevent the visa holder from returning to the country of origin.

**IMPORTANT:** When applying for a Schengen visa, each person must pay a visa fee. This fee is non-refundable regardless of the visa result. The Schengen visa fee for citizens of Azerbaijan, Russia, and Armenia is currently **35 EUR**. These three countries benefit from reduced visa costs under an agreement with the Schengen countries. In other countries, this amount is **80 EUR** for people over 12 years old, **40 EUR** for children 6-12 years old, and free for children under six years old. A visa application must be submitted **at least 15 calendar days** and no more than six months before the intended visit. A visa application submitted **less than 15 calendar days** before may be accepted but the processing may take up to 15 calendar days.

Short-stay Visa (C type) application requirements. **All requested documents have to be submitted and translated into English or Slovenian.**

**Third-country nationals** - A national of a third country who wishes to enter and reside in the Republic of Slovenia for tourist, business, personal, or other purposes should obtain a visa prior to their entry into the country, unless they are citizens of countries that do not require a visa, or already hold one of the permits described below:

**Holders of a short-stay visa (C type)** issued by a Schengen country may, during the visa validity period, enter the Republic of Slovenia and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a long-stay visa (D type)** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this visa and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the long-stay visa, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the long-stay visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a residence permit**  issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this residence permit and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the residence permit, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the residence permit, whichever is sooner.

### **Short-stay Visa (C type) application requirements**

All requested documents have to be submitted and translated into English or Slovenian.

#### **General requirements**

- ***Valid passport or travel document.*** Must be valid for minimum 3 months after the journey and issued within the previous 10 years and have at least 2 blank pages. A copy of passport or travel document.
- ***Application form*** duly completed, dated and signed by the applicant.
- ***One (1) recent photograph.***
- ***Travel medical insurance*** covering the entire duration of the trip valid in the whole Schengen area. The minimum coverage of 30.000 euros, covering: emergency medical expenses, hospital treatment, repatriation for medical reasons, or repatriation of remains. Multi-entry visa applicants must have insurance for the duration of the first trip.
- ***Copy of flight ticket or flight reservation including return flight.***
- ***Verifiable evidence of sufficient*** means of subsistence during intended stay: payslips for the last 3 months, valid international credit card accompanied by bank statements, bank account statements for the last three (3) months or a national form for proof of sponsorship and/or accommodation.
- ***Proof of accommodation:*** hotel reservation, proof of rental or ownership of real estate in the member state of destination, confirmation of private accommodation, mentioning that the host will cover the accommodation costs, confirmation of accommodation by the company inviting the applicant, mentioning that the company will cover the accommodation costs.
- ***Minors traveling without their parents/legal guardian:*** Original authorisation signed by their parents/legal guardian in front of a visa officer or duly legalised and copy of the passport(s) of parents/legal guardian.
- ***Residence permit*** valid three months beyond the intended date of departure from the territory of the Member States or, for GCC citizens, a UAE ID-card, valid for three months after the intended departure date from the territory of the Member States.

- **Employees:** original letter from employer stating the applicant's employment status, position, length of the contract and salary, self-employed persons: valid original trade license, documents to be submitted relating to the purpose of the journey

**I. Business trip- Invitation from the inviting company (Letter of Guarantee) or an authority to attend a meeting, conference or event** (The invitation must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter of guarantee with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.) and other documents for work purpose (e.g. confirmed registration for trade fairs or congresses).

**II. Official delegation/mission-** Letter issued by the authority (-ies) concerned confirming identity of the applicant(s), purpose of the journey (meeting, consultation, negotiations or events held by intergovernmental organizations), period of intended stay and accommodation details.

**III. Tourism-** Full travel itinerary.

**IV. Private visit** - Invitation letter signed (Letter of Guarantee) by the host covering the period of the intended stay (The Invitation Letter must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.).

**V. Medical treatment** - A document issued by the medical institution in the Member State of destination confirming that the applicant will receive medical care in that institution; Pre-payment or other proof of sufficient financial means to cover the medical treatment and related expenses, such as insurance coverage.

**VI. Study or training** - A certificate of enrollment at an educational establishment for the purpose of attending vocational or theoretical courses within the framework of basic and further training.; Student cards or certificates of the courses to be attended.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

Pursuant to the Government's Decision, starting with 22 July 2014, the Republic of Croatia applies the Decision No 565/2014/EU. **All third-country nationals who are holders of valid Schengen documents, as well as national visas and residence permits of Bulgaria, Cyprus, and Romania do not require an additional (Croatian) visa for Croatia.**

Third-country nationals who are holders of:

**uniform visa (C) for two or multiple entries, valid for all Schengen Area Member States;**

**visa with limited territorial validity (LTV visa), for two or multiple entries, issued to the holder of a travel document that is not recognized by one or more, but not all of the Schengen Area Member States, and which is valid for the territory of the Member States recognizing the travel document;**

**long-stay visa (D) for stays exceeding three months, issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;**

**residence permit issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;**

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Bulgaria,** listed in Annex I of the **Decision No 565/2014/EU**;

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Cyprus,** listed in Annex III of the **Decision No 565/2014/EU**;

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Romania,** listed in Annex IV of the **Decision No 565/2014/EU**;

# FOR CITIZENS OF THE EGYPT

## Entry in Montenegro-

**Visas for citizens of Egypt will be temporarily suspended from 19. July until 20. September of this year.**

Nationals of Egypt are required to obtain a visa to enter Montenegro. Visas may be obtained from diplomatic and consular posts of Montenegro. If you are unable to reach a diplomatic or consular post of Montenegro, you may apply for a visa at the nearest diplomatic or consular post of the Republic of Serbia - **Embassy of the Republic of Serbia in Cairo, the Arab Republic of Egypt (33, Al Mansour Mohamed St. Zamalek, Cairo, Egypt).**

You can enter Montenegro with your Schengen visa, provided the visa still has valid entries left as well as remaining days of stay. This also applies to holders of residence permits for a Schengen country.

**IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Montenegro Short-stay visa is 3-10 working days. Montenegro Short-stay visa is 35 EUR. The fee may vary depending on your nationality or your country of submission. You will apply for a Montenegro Short-stay visa in Montenegro visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **The Embassy of the Republic of Serbia in Cairo, the Arab Republic of Egypt.**

Montenegro Short-stay visa (C) may be issued for one, two, or multiple entries into Montenegro for tourist, business, personal or other purposes. Continuous stay or the total duration of consecutive visits may not exceed 90 days in a period of 6 months,

counting from the date of first entry. The validity period of Visa C for multiple entries is up to one year. Exceptionally this type of visa may be issued for a more extended period of validity, but no longer than five years. A short-stay visa may be given to a group of foreigners (collective visa). The validity period of a collective visa cannot exceed 30 days, and it may be affixed to a group passport. **Montenegro is not included in the Schengen Agreement.** Therefore, Montenegro visas are valid only for its territory. You can't travel to Schengen countries with a Montenegro visa. For a foreigner who is minor, i.e. legally incapable, visa application shall be filed by a parent or his legal representative.

**In addition to the visa application, the foreigner shall submit:**

- valid travel document (the period of validity of the travel document should exceed that of the visas by three months);
- one color photo 35x45 mm;
- proof of the purpose of stay in Montenegro (letter of guarantee by a physical person or letter of invitation by a legal entity, state authority in Montenegro or organizer of an international conference or event);
- proof of ensured accommodation (receipt from a tourist arrangement, hotel or other type of accommodation reservation that has been paid in);
- proof of possession of means for sustenance during his stay in Montenegro, as well as for return into the country where he comes from or for travel into a third state (cash, a bank account, traveller's checks, credit cards etc.);
- proof of the means of travel and intention to return into the state where a foreigner comes from or into a third state (a return airplane or other transportation ticket, a driving license);
- proof of health insurance;
- proof that the consular fee has been charged,
- as well as other corresponding documents based on which the purpose and ensured accommodation in Montenegro can be determined.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

On October 30, 2014, the Government of the Republic of Serbia adopted the Decision on visa free entry to the Republic of Serbia for holders of foreign national passports having a valid Schengen, UK and other Member States' visa, or visa of the United States of America, and for holders of foreign national passports having residence permit in the countries of the Schengen area, EU or the United States of America.

On basis of this decision, the above-mentioned categories of foreign nationals may, without prior visa application, enter, transit and stay in the Republic of Serbia up to 90 days during a six-month period, and within validity of said visas or residence permits. There is a possibility for foreign nationals to enter the Republic of Serbia with two passports e.g. expired national passport with valid visa or residence permit

and valid national passport without valid visa or residence permit. Foreign nationals, holders of a residence permit in the form of a separate card (not a sticker affixed to their passport), must present their valid passport upon entering the territory of the Republic of Serbia.

**IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Serbia Tourist visa is **3-10 calendar days**. It depends on your visa application country. Serbia Tourist visa fee is **80 EUR**. Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a Serbia Tourist visa in Serbia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **The Embassy of the Republic of Serbia in Cairo, the Arab Republic of Egypt (33, Al Mansour Mohamed St. Zamalek).**

#### **General visa requirements:**

- Valid passport (passport must be valid at least 90 days from issue date of visa)
- Letter of invitation:
  - for a private visit – invitation letter certified by the relevant authority of the Republic of Serbia
  - for a business visit – invitation letter by a company in Serbia;
  - for a tourist trip – a proof of payment for the trip issued by a travel agency (voucher or other type of payment receipt);
- Completed visa application form: (PDF) ;
- Photo (size 3.5x4.5cm);
- Return ticket or Itinerary (copy of Driving License and Insurance if you travel by car);
- Proof of sufficient funds for staying in Serbia;
- Health insurance
- Visa fee.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** There are no restrictions on entering the Republic of Serbia. The recommendation to wear masks indoors remains in force, while wearing masks in health facilities is mandatory.

**Entry in Bosnia and Herzegovina- Citizens of the Arab Republic of Egypt are required visas** when entering, exiting or travelling through Bosnia and Herzegovina. **Citizens of the Arab Republic Egypt, holders of diplomatic, official and special passports** are exempt from the obligation to obtain a visa to enter, exit, transit and stay on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina up to 90 days.

**IMPORTANT:** Applications should be made **at least 10-30 days before your intended departure date.** Bosnia & Herzegovina's fees cover only a part of the work necessary to process your application. Because processing fees are only for handling your application, you will not get your money back, even if your application is refused. The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150,00 (ore equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) for each day of intended stay.

Bosnia and Herzegovina Short-term Visa fee is **31 EUR for single-entry and 57 EUR for a multiple-entry visa** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a Bosnia and Herzegovina Short-term visa in Bosnia and Herzegovina visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of BiH in Arab Republic of EGYPT (El Thawra, St. El Dokki, Cairo, Egypt).**

Nationals of the following states may enter into Bosnia and Herzegovina with a passport or a valid identity card proving identity and citizenship of:

- Member State of the European Union
- State signatory to the Schengen Agreement
- Andorra, Montenegro, Liechtenstein, Monaco, San Marino, Serbia, the Holy See and Swiss Confederation.

The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150.00 (or equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) - for each day of the intended stay.

**Listed below are the documents required when applying for a visa to Bosnia and Herzegovina:**

- A valid passport of the applicant
- Application form (completed and signed)
- Copy of a valid residence visa
- Copy of a round trip ticket or itinerary
- One passport size picture
- Travel insurance
- No objection letter from your company or your sponsor

**In addition to the above, the following items must be presented:**

**If I travel as a tourist** : Voucher of the travel agency stating that the trip has been paid in full, copy of your bank statement for the last 3 months.

**If visiting friends and/or relatives**: Letter of invitation from the person(s) the applicant intends to visit, certified by the Ministry of Security of Bosnia and Herzegovina – Department for Foreign Citizens.

**If traveling on business**: Letter from the employer stating the purpose of the trip to Bosnia and Herzegovina

Letter of invitation from a company in Bosnia and Herzegovina, certified by the Ministry of Security of Bosnia and Herzegovina – Department for Foreign Citizens.

**Children under the age of 18**: For children under the age of 18 a birth certificate is required.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** The Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina has adopted a Decision on declaring a natural or other disaster on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina ('Official Gazette of BiH', 18/20), due to the danger of an epidemic of infectious disease caused by new coronavirus (COVID-19), in order to reduce the risk of accelerated spread of infection in Bosnia and Herzegovina and enable the engagement of additional resources to respond to this public health threat.

In order to prevent and suppress the spread of the SARS-COV-2 virus, the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina also adopted a **DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA**, as well as **DECISION ON AMENDMENT OF THE DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA** ('Official Gazette of BiH', 36/21').

**(Article 2) A foreigner who meets conditions for entry to BiH prescribed by Law on Aliens, may enter BiH if he/she at the BiH Border Crossing Points presents any of the following:**

- negative PCR test or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, not older than 48 hours if he/she comes from a European country, and if he/she comes from another country, not older than 72 hours until arrival at the border crossing point of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- certificate that a person has received the second dose of vaccine for COVID-19 before more than 14 days before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH or has received one dose before 14 days and more before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH, if it is a single dose vaccine,
- certificate issued by doctor showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19 in the previous period from 14 to 180 days until the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH.

**(Article 3) Exemptions from Article 2 of the Decision, foreigners who may enter Bosnia and Herzegovina without presenting a negative test result or certificates are:**

- citizens of Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and the Republic of Serbia, when they enter Bosnia and Herzegovina directly from the country of which they are citizens, as well as their minor children and spouses who are citizens of other countries,
- the crew and cabin crew of the aircraft whose final destination is Bosnia and

Herzegovina,

- drivers and co-drivers of freight vehicles when performing international transport of goods by road, provided that their stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina does not last longer than 12 hours,
- crews of freight trains and ships in international traffic,
- diplomatic and consular staff and staff of international organizations in the performance of their official duties, who must have and present an appropriate valid passport upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- civil protection services and teams when their entry into Bosnia and Herzegovina is urgent and cannot be postponed,
- members of the military forces of the member states of the North Atlantic Treaty and other states participating in the Partnership for Peace and members of the NATO and EUFOR Headquarters in Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- heads of states and governments and members of their delegations whose arrival and departure from Bosnia and Herzegovina have been announced to Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina, through diplomatic channels or through protocols of the competent authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- foreigners transiting through the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the purpose of returning to the country of usual residence, without staying in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- a minor foreigner whose parent is a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as a foreigner who is the spouse of a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- children under the age of seven travelling with parents or guardians, if their parents or guardians possess negative PCR or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, or certificate on vaccination or certificate showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19,
- foreigners authorised to stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina temporarily or permanently, if they are returning to Bosnia and Herzegovina after exit and stay only in Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and/or the Republic of Serbia, provided that total duration of their stay in the above countries has not been longer than 48 hours since they left the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina, which could be proved by exiting stamp, i.e. entering stamp in a travel document of the foreigner,
- foreigners – citizens of the Republic of Turkey crossing the state border of Bosnia and Herzegovina daily due to construction of the bridge Rača in the framework of realization of the Project motorway/expressway Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo. Ministry of Communication and Transport of BiH shall submit to the BiH Border Police a certified list of nationals of the Republic of Turkey Border Police hired as workers for construction of the Rača Bridge within the above mentioned Project, including their names, surnames and

number of travel document they use for crossing of the BiH border; as well as certificate that the Project is implemented according to signed Agreement on Cooperation regarding realisation of the Project motorway/expressway road Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo (“Official Gazette BiH – International Agreements”, no. 13/20).

### **Ukrainian citizens who left Ukraine due to the security situation**

By the Decision on prescribing additional conditions for the entry of foreigners into BiH, it is not prescribed what kind/type of PCR or antigen tests, i.e. form of tests or certificates is required to present at the border crossing points during intended entry to BiH, and it is possible to present them in printed or electronic form.

**Remarks:** Currently, when entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, no quarantine or self-isolation measures are prescribed, while upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, all persons are obliged to follow the instructions and respect all orders of the competent epidemiological and health authorities (social distance, protective masks, hand disinfection, etc.).

**Entry in Albania-** Albania applies visa-free travel, during the tourist period, from **01 May 2022 to 30 September 2022**, citizens of the Arab Republic of Egypt, travel without a visa to Albania, without having to obtain a visa at the Albanian Embassy.

**The Albanian government has decided to abolish the visa regime for Egyptian citizens wishing to visit Albania from May 1 to September 30, 2022, and all Egyptian citizen wishing to enter the territory of the Republic of Albania:**

- will not pay any fees and
- has the right to stay in Albania for up to 90 (ninety) days.

In addition, to enter the territory of the Republic of Albania, Egyptian citizens must meet the following conditions / obligations:

- Valid travel document; passport
- Invitation of the guarantor / inviter in Albania (The invitation must concern: Name and Address and contact number in Albania);
- Round trip ticket; (From Cairo / the origin country to Albanian and back from Albania to Cairo or origin county)
- Evidence of evidence-based accommodation; Hotel Booking PAID
- Financial means, Albanian or foreign currency, that can be exchanged in an exchange agency in the Republic of Albania, in the amount of 5000 ALL - (50 \$) per day of stay for adults and 2500 ALL (25 \$) for minors;

Can enter Albania without visa (up to 90 days, for purpose equivalent to those of the Type C visa, provided in Law no 103/2013 “On aliens” amended):

**a)** Foreigners holding a valid Schengen multi-pass visa, which has previously been used in one of the Schengen area countries, or who have a valid residence permit in one of the Schengen area countries;

b) Foreigners holding a valid US or UK multi-pass visa, which has previously been used in one of these countries, or who have a valid residence permit in the US or the UK.

c) Foreign citizens from Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, India, Qatar, Oman, and Thailand, can enter Albania without a visa, for a short-term stay, with a passport document, from 20 April until 31 December.

d) "Foreign members of the family of EU citizens", when traveling with an EU citizen spouse, as well as in addition to a valid passport, have a document (residence permit) which cites their status as a family member"

e) Foreign citizens who have a valid permit of stay, issued by the competent authority of the United Arab Emirates;

**For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.**

All foreigners who have a valid multi – entry Schengen visa, type “C” or “D”, or a valid residence permit in one of the Schengen member states, can enter, stay and transit Albania without visa, within the validity term of the visa or the residence permit. The same applies for all holders of Laissez-Passer issued by United Nations Organizations, and its branch, NATO, Council of Europe and European Union, regardless of nationality. For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

Holders of a valid type “C” multiple-entry Schengen visa (which has been previously used in one of the countries in Schengen area) or a Residence Permit to the Schengen Area, also holders of a valid UK, Canada and US visa (which has been previously used for entering that country) may enter to Albania without a visa for up to 15 days.

**IMPORTANT:** A visa is issued up to 15 days from the acceptance of the application and in exceptional cases may take up to 30 days. Albania Short-term Visa fee is **35-60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center

fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for an Albania Short-term Visa in Albania visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of Albania in Arab Republic of EGYPT (27, El-Gezera Al-Wossta, Gound Floor nr. 4 Zamalek, Cairo-Egypt)**

**In accordance with the legislation on foreigners (law nr. 108/2013 “On aliens” amended), the alien intending to enter into, stay and transit through and exit from the Republic of Albania, must appear in person at the border crossing point following the fulfilment of the conditions:**

- Valid travel document;
- Invitation of the guarantor / inviter in Albania (or a contact number in Albania);
- Round trip ticket;
- Evidence of accommodation;
- Financial means, Albanian or foreign currency, that can be exchanged in an exchange agency in the Republic of Albania, in the amount of 50 euros per day of stay for adults and 25 euros for minors;

## **Entry in North Macedonia** - Entry visa for North Macedonia **REQUIRED.**

**Visa Application Procedure :** <https://mfa.gov.mk/en/page/434/visa-application-procedure>

**IMPORTANT:** The foreigner submits a visa application to the competent (resident or non-resident) diplomatic-consular representation of the Republic of North Macedonia **no longer than six months and at least 15 days before the start of the intended trip.** The visa application is submitted in person. Upon exception, the visa application may be submitted by another natural or legal person authorized to act as the proxy of the applicant when the foreigner is a disabled person or when the foreigner is a well-known person and there is no doubt about his/her bona fide intentions. The application for a minor is submitted in person by a parent or a guardian. **It takes 3 to 10 working days for a North Macedonia visa to be issued.** In extreme cases, the application process can take up to a month. North Macedonia Short-term Visa fee is **60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a North Macedonia Short-term Visa in North Macedonia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case, **The Embassy of North Macedonia in Cairo, Egypt (Road Al Nahda 41, 3/402, Maadi Cairo).**

**The applicant encloses the following documentation with the visa application:**

- Valid travel document (the validity period of the travel document should exceed that of the visa by at least three months), the travel document must have been issued within the last 10 years and it must include at least two empty

pages for visa purposes and one photograph size 35x45 mm

- Proof of valid travel medical insurance
- Proof of fees paid
- Documents that prove: the purpose of the visit to RNM, secured accommodation, means of subsistence to cover the stay in RNM and the repatriation or the travel to a third country, means of transport and the intention to return to the country of origin or the intention to travel to a third country.
- Nationals of EU Member States and signatories of the Schengen Agreement DO NOT need a visa to enter the Republic of North Macedonia (and are eligible to enter the Republic of North Macedonia with a valid national identity card).
- Third-country nationals with temporary residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with permanent residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with multiple-entry Schengen visa (type C) valid for at least 5 (five) days beyond the intended stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- The Republic of North Macedonia has abolished short-term stay (Type C) visas for foreign nationals who are holders of valid passports of third countries and are simultaneously holders of valid UK, US, and Canadian visas, whereby the duration of their stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may not exceed 15 days, with the periods of validity of the valid UK, US, and Canadian visas they hold not exceeding more than 5 days from their planned stay in the Republic of North Macedonia. This decision is of a temporary character and shall be in force from 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2022.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** Visitors entering North Macedonia will no longer be required to present a vaccination certificate or a

negative COVID-19 test.

**Entry in Slovenia- Visa is required.** Visa is not required for holders of diplomatic and service passports up to 90 days (Official Gazette RS No.60/95). You can find additional information on the <https://www.gov.si/en/representations/embassy-cairo/visa-information-of-the-embassy-cairo/>.

A short-stay visa (C type) is an authorization issued to a third-country national for entry and temporary stay (up to 90 days). An application for a C type visa should be submitted with the Schengen country that is the main destination. On behalf of Slovenia, this type of visa can also be issued by another Schengen country if the two countries have concluded a representation agreement. A C type visa may be extended in exceptional cases where the circumstances prevent the visa holder from returning to the country of origin.

**IMPORTANT:** A visa application must be submitted **at least 15 calendar days and no more than six months before the intended visit**. A visa application submitted **less than 15 calendar days** before may be accepted but the processing may take up to 15 calendar days. When applying for a Schengen visa, each person must pay a visa fee. This fee is non-refundable regardless of the visa result. The Schengen visa fee for citizens of Azerbaijan, Russia, and Armenia is currently **35 EUR**. These three countries benefit from reduced visa costs under an agreement with the Schengen countries. In other countries, this amount is **80 EUR** for people over 12 years old, **40 EUR** for children 6-12 years old, and free for children under six years old.

You will apply for Slovenia Tourism/Private Visit Visa in Slovenia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of the Republic of Slovenia in Cairo (21 Soliman Abaza Street, 12311 Mohandessin, Cairo, Egypt)**.

## **Short-stay Visa (C type) application requirements**

**Third-country nationals** - A national of a third country who wishes to enter and reside in the Republic of Slovenia for tourist, business, personal, or other purposes should obtain a visa prior to their entry into the country, unless they are citizens of countries that do not require a visa, or already hold one of the permits described below:

**Holders of a short-stay visa (C type)** issued by a Schengen country may, during the visa validity period, enter the Republic of Slovenia and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a long-stay visa (D type)** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this visa and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the long-stay visa, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the long-stay visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a residence permit** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this residence permit and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the residence permit, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the residence permit, whichever is sooner.

## **Short-stay Visa (C type) application requirements**

**All requested documents have to be submitted and translated into English or Slovenian.**

### **General requirements**

- **Valid passport or travel document.** Must be valid for minimum 3 months after the journey and issued within the previous 10 years and have at least 2 blank pages. A copy of passport or travel document.
- **Application form** duly completed, dated and signed by the applicant.
- **One (1) recent photograph.**
- **Travel medical insurance** covering the entire duration of the trip valid in the whole Schengen area. The minimum coverage of 30.000 euros, covering: emergency medical expenses, hospital treatment, repatriation for medical

reasons, or repatriation of remains. Multi-entry visa applicants must have insurance for the duration of the first trip.

- **Copy of flight ticket or flight reservation including return flight.**
- **Verifiable evidence of sufficient** means of subsistence during intended stay: payslips for the last 3 months, valid international credit card accompanied by bank statements, bank account statements for the last three (3) months or a national form for proof of sponsorship and/or accommodation.
- **Proof of accommodation:** hotel reservation, proof of rental or ownership of real estate in the member state of destination, confirmation of private accommodation, mentioning that the host will cover the accommodation costs, confirmation of accommodation by the company inviting the applicant, mentioning that the company will cover the accommodation costs.
- **Minors traveling without their parents/legal guardian:** Original authorisation signed by their parents/legal guardian in front of a visa officer or duly legalised and copy of the passport(s) of parents/legal guardian.
- **Residence permit** valid three months beyond the intended date of departure from the territory of the Member States or, for GCC citizens, a UAE ID-card, valid for three months after the intended departure date from the territory of the Member States.
- **Employees:** original letter from employer stating the applicant's employment status, position, length of the contract and salary, self-employed persons: valid original trade license, documents to be submitted relating to the purpose of the journey.

**I. Business trip- Invitation from the inviting company (Letter of Guarantee) or an authority to attend a meeting, conference or event** (The invitation must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter of guarantee with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.) and other documents for work purpose (e.g. confirmed registration for trade fairs or congresses).

**II. Official delegation/mission-** Letter issued by the authority (-ies) concerned confirming identity of the applicant(s), purpose of the journey (meeting, consultation, negotiations or events held by intergovernmental organizations), period of intended stay and accommodation details.

**III. Tourism-** Full travel itinerary.

**IV. Private visit** - Invitation letter signed (Letter of Guarantee) by the host covering the period of the intended stay (The Invitation Letter must be certified by a Slovenian

administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.).

**V. Medical treatment** - A document issued by the medical institution in the Member State of destination confirming that the applicant will receive medical care in that institution; Pre-payment or other proof of sufficient financial means to cover the medical treatment and related expenses, such as insurance coverage.

**VI. Study or training** - A certificate of enrollment at an educational establishment for the purpose of attending vocational or theoretical courses within the framework of basic and further training.; Student cards or certificates of the courses to be attended.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

- **national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Cyprus, listed in Annex III of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**
- **national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Romania, listed in Annex IV of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

**do not require a visa for transit or intended stays in the territory of Croatia not exceeding 90 days in any 180-day period.**

**Entry in Bosnia and Herzegovina** - Citizens of the State of Qatar are exempted from visa requirement for entry, exit, transit and stay on the territory of

Bosnia and Herzegovina up to 90 days per period of six months, starting from the day of entry.

Nationals of the following states may enter into Bosnia and Herzegovina with a passport or a valid identity card proving identity and citizenship of:

- Member State of the European Union
- State signatory to the Schengen Agreement
- Andorra, Montenegro, Liechtenstein, Monaco, San Marino, Serbia, the Holy See and Swiss Confederation.

The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150.00 (or equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) - for each day of the intended stay.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** The Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina has adopted a Decision on declaring a natural or other disaster on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina ('Official Gazette of BiH', 18/20), due to the danger of an epidemic of infectious disease caused by new coronavirus (COVID-19), in order to reduce the risk of accelerated spread of infection in Bosnia and Herzegovina and enable the engagement of additional resources to respond to this public health threat.

In order to prevent and suppress the spread of the SARS-COV-2 virus, the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina also adopted a **DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA**, as well as **DECISION ON AMENDMENT OF THE DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA** ('Official Gazette of BiH', 36/21').

**(Article 2) A foreigner who meets conditions for entry to BiH prescribed by Law on Aliens, may enter BiH if he/she at the BiH Border Crossing Points presents any of the following:**

- negative PCR test or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, not older than 48 hours if he/she comes from a European country, and if he/she comes from another country, not older than 72 hours until arrival at the border crossing

- point of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- certificate that a person has received the second dose of vaccine for COVID-19 before more than 14 days before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH or has received one dose before 14 days and more before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH, if it is a single dose vaccine,
  - certificate issued by doctor showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19 in the previous period from 14 to 180 days until the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH.

**(Article 3) Exemptions from Article 2 of the Decision, foreigners who may enter Bosnia and Herzegovina without presenting a negative test result or certificates are:**

- citizens of Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and the Republic of Serbia, when they enter Bosnia and Herzegovina directly from the country of which they are citizens, as well as their minor children and spouses who are citizens of other countries,
- the crew and cabin crew of the aircraft whose final destination is Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- drivers and co-drivers of freight vehicles when performing international transport of goods by road, provided that their stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina does not last longer than 12 hours,
- crews of freight trains and ships in international traffic,
- diplomatic and consular staff and staff of international organizations in the performance of their official duties, who must have and present an appropriate valid passport upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- civil protection services and teams when their entry into Bosnia and Herzegovina is urgent and cannot be postponed,
- members of the military forces of the member states of the North Atlantic Treaty and other states participating in the Partnership for Peace and members of the NATO and EUFOR Headquarters in Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- heads of states and governments and members of their delegations whose arrival and departure from Bosnia and Herzegovina have been announced to Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina, through diplomatic channels or through protocols of the competent authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- foreigners transiting through the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the purpose of returning to the country of usual residence, without staying in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- a minor foreigner whose parent is a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as a foreigner who is the spouse of a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina,

- children under the age of seven travelling with parents or guardians, if their parents or guardians possess negative PCR or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, or certificate on vaccination or certificate showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19,
- foreigners authorised to stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina temporarily or permanently, if they are returning to Bosnia and Herzegovina after exit and stay only in Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and/or the Republic of Serbia, provided that total duration of their stay in the above countries has not been longer than 48 hours since they left the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina, which could be proved by exiting stamp, i.e. entering stamp in a travel document of the foreigner,
- foreigners – citizens of the Republic of Turkey crossing the state border of Bosnia and Herzegovina daily due to construction of the bridge Rača in the framework of realization of the Project motorway/expressway Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo. Ministry of Communication and Transport of BiH shall submit to the BiH Border Police a certified list of nationals of the Republic of Turkey Border Police hired as workers for construction of the Rača Bridge within the above mentioned Project, including their names, surnames and number of travel document they use for crossing of the BiH border; as well as certificate that the Project is implemented according to signed Agreement on Cooperation regarding realisation of the Project motorway/expressway road Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo (“Official Gazette BiH – International Agreements”, no. 13/20).

### **Ukrainian citizens who left Ukraine due to the security situation**

By the Decision on prescribing additional conditions for the entry of foreigners into BiH, it is not prescribed what kind/type of PCR or antigen tests, i.e. form of tests or certificates is required to present at the border crossing points during intended entry to BiH, and it is possible to present them in printed or electronic form.

**Remarks:** Currently, when entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, no quarantine or self-isolation measures are prescribed, while upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, all persons are obliged to follow the instructions and respect all orders of the competent epidemiological and health authorities (social distance, protective masks, hand disinfection, etc.).

**Entry in Albania – Albania applies visa-free travel. Foreign citizens from Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, India, Qatar, Oman, and Thailand, can enter Albania without a visa, for a short-term stay, with a passport document, from 20 April until 31 December.**

**Foreign citizens from Egypt and Russia can enter Albania without a visa, for a short-term stay, with a passport document, from 01 May until 30 September.**

**Beyond those dates, they are required to obtain a visa to enter Montenegro.**

**IMPORTANT: For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.**

Albania Short-term visa's validity period can be a maximum of **90 days**. Kindly note that the visa applications will take a minimum of 5 working days starting from the date of confirmation of the visa fee payment and can take up to 15 working days. Albania Short-term Visa fee is **35-60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other

Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for an Albania Short-term Visa in Albania visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. All foreigners who have a valid multi – entry Schengen visa, type “C” or “D”, or a valid residence permit in one of the Schengen member states, can enter, stay and transit Albania without visa, within the validity term of the visa or the residence permit. The same applies for all holders of Laissez-Passer issued by United Nations Organizations, and its branch, NATO, Council of Europe and European Union, regardless of nationality. For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

Holders of a valid type “C” multiple-entry Schengen visa (which has been previously used in one of the countries in Schengen area) or a Residence Permit to the Schengen Area, also holders of a valid UK, Canada and US visa (which has been previously used for entering that country) may enter to Albania without a visa for up to 15 days.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**Entry in Macedonia-** Entry visa for North Macedonia **REQUIRED**. Visa Application Procedure :<https://mfa.gov.mk/en/page/434/visa-application-procedure>

**IMPORTANT:** The foreigner submits a visa application to the competent (resident or non-resident) diplomatic-consular representation of the Republic of North Macedonia **no longer than six months and at least 15 days before the start of the intended trip**. The visa application is submitted in person. Upon exception, the visa application may be submitted by another natural or legal person authorized to act as the proxy of the applicant when the foreigner is a disabled person or when the foreigner is a well-known person and there is no doubt about his/her bona fide intentions. The application for a minor is submitted in person by a parent or a guardian. **It takes 3 to 10 working days for a North Macedonia visa to be issued**. In extreme cases, the application process can take up to a month. North Macedonia Short-term Visa fee is **60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such

as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a North Macedonia Short-term Visa in North Macedonia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case, **The Embassy of North Macedonia in Qatar (Al Eithart Street 941, Area 63, Al Dafna, West Bay, Doha).**

**The applicant encloses the following documentation with the visa application:**

- Valid travel document (the validity period of the travel document should exceed that of the visa by at least three months), the travel document must have been issued within the last 10 years and it must include at least two empty pages for visa purposes and one photograph size 35x45 mm
- Proof of valid travel medical insurance
- Proof of fees paid
- Documents that prove: the purpose of the visit to RNM, secured accommodation, means of subsistence to cover the stay in RNM and the repatriation or the travel to a third country, means of transport and the intention to return to the country of origin or the intention to travel to a third country.
  - Nationals of EU Member States and signatories of the Schengen Agreement DO NOT need a visa to enter the Republic of North Macedonia (and are eligible to enter the Republic of North Macedonia with a valid national identity card).
  - Third-country nationals with temporary residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
  - Third-country nationals with permanent residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
  - Third-country nationals with multiple-entry Schengen visa (type C) valid for at least 5 (five) days beyond the intended stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.

- The Republic of North Macedonia has abolished short-term stay (Type C) visas for foreign nationals who are holders of valid passports of third countries and are simultaneously holders of valid UK, US, and Canadian visas, whereby the duration of their stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may not exceed 15 days, with the periods of validity of the valid UK, US, and Canadian visas they hold not exceeding more than 5 days from their planned stay in the Republic of North Macedonia. This decision is of a temporary character and shall be in force from 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2022.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** Visitors entering North Macedonia will no longer be required to present a vaccination certificate or a negative COVID-19 test.

The fee may vary depending on your nationality or your country of submission. You will apply for a Croatia Tourist visa in Croatia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location.

- If the Applicant is a Minor/Under Age 18 and Traveling Alone or with One Parent or Legal Guardian Only
- For Children Under Age 18 Years of Age and Persons Deprived of Legal Capacity

Pursuant to the Government's Decision, starting with 22 July 2014, the Republic of Croatia applies the Decision No 565/2014/EU. **All third-country nationals who are holders of valid Schengen documents, as well as national visas and residence permits of Bulgaria, Cyprus, and Romania do not require an additional (Croatian) visa for Croatia.**

- Third-country nationals who are holders of:
- **uniform visa (C) for two or multiple entries, valid for all Schengen Area Member States;**
- **visa with limited territorial validity (LTV visa), for two or multiple entries, issued to the holder of a travel document that is not recognised by**

one or more, but not all of the Schengen Area Member States, and which is valid for the territory of the Member States recognising the travel document;

- **long-stay visa (D) for stays exceeding three months**, issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;
- **residence permit** issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;
- **national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Bulgaria**, listed in Annex I of the **Decision No 565/2014/EU**;
- **national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Cyprus**, listed in Annex III of the **Decision No 565/2014/EU**;
- **national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Romania**, listed in Annex IV of the **Decision No 565/2014/EU**;
- **do not require a visa for transit or intended stays in the territory of Croatia not exceeding 90 days in any 180-day period.**

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**Entry in Slovenia - Visa is required.** Qatari citizens need a visa to enter Slovenia.

A short-stay visa (C type) is an authorization issued to a third-country national for entry and temporary stay (up to 90 days). An application for a C type visa should be

submitted with the Schengen country that is the main destination. On behalf of Slovenia, this type of visa can also be issued by another Schengen country if the two countries have concluded a representation agreement. A C type visa may be extended in exceptional cases where the circumstances prevent the visa holder from returning to the country of origin.

**IMPORTANT:** A visa application must be submitted **at least 15 calendar days and no more than six months before the intended visit.** A visa application submitted **less than 15 calendar days** before may be accepted but the processing may take up to 15 calendar days. When applying for a Schengen visa, each person must pay a visa fee. This fee is non-refundable regardless of the visa result. The Schengen visa fee for citizens of Azerbaijan, Russia, and Armenia is currently **35 EUR**. These three countries benefit from reduced visa costs under an agreement with the Schengen countries. In other countries, this amount is **80 EUR** for people over 12 years old, **40 EUR** for children 6-12 years old, and free for children under six years old.

You will apply for Slovenia Tourism/Private Visit Visa in Slovenia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of the Republic of Slovenia in Cairo (21 Soliman Abaza Street, 12311 Mohandessin, Cairo).**

**Third-country nationals-** A national of a third country who wishes to enter and reside in the Republic of Slovenia for tourist, business, personal, or other purposes should obtain a visa prior to their entry into the country, unless they are citizens of countries that do not require a visa, or already hold one of the permits described below:

**Holders of a short-stay visa (C type)** issued by a Schengen country may, during the visa validity period, enter the Republic of Slovenia and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a long-stay visa (D type)** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this visa and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the long-stay visa, does not exceed

90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the long-stay visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a residence permit** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this residence permit and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the residence permit, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the residence permit, whichever is sooner.

### **Short-stay Visa (C type) application requirements**

**All requested documents have to be submitted and translated into English or Slovenian.**

#### **General requirements**

- **Valid passport or travel document.** Must be valid for minimum 3 months after the journey and issued within the previous 10 years and have at least 2 blank pages. A copy of passport or travel document.
- **Application form** duly completed, dated and signed by the applicant.
- **One (1) recent photograph.**
- **Travel medical insurance** covering the entire duration of the trip valid in the whole Schengen area. The minimum coverage of 30.000 euros, covering: emergency medical expenses, hospital treatment, repatriation for medical reasons, or repatriation of remains. Multi-entry visa applicants must have insurance for the duration of the first trip.
- **Copy of flight ticket or flight reservation including return flight.**
- **Verifiable evidence of sufficient** means of subsistence during intended stay: payslips for the last 3 months, valid international credit card accompanied by bank statements, bank account statements for the last three (3) months or a national form for proof of sponsorship and/or accommodation.
- **Proof of accommodation:** hotel reservation, proof of rental or ownership of real estate in the member state of destination, confirmation of private accommodation, mentioning that the host will cover the accommodation costs, confirmation of accommodation by the company inviting the applicant, mentioning that the company will cover the accommodation costs.
- **Minors traveling without their parents/legal guardian:** Original authorisation signed by their parents/legal guardian in front of a visa officer or duly legalised and copy of the passport(s) of parents/legal guardian.
- **Residence permit** valid three months beyond the intended date of departure

from the territory of the Member States or, for GCC citizens, a UAE ID-card, valid for three months after the intended departure date from the territory of the Member States.

- **Employees:** original letter from employer stating the applicant's employment status, position, length of the contract and salary, self-employed persons: valid original trade license, documents to be submitted relating to the purpose of the journey

**I. Business trip- Invitation from the inviting company (Letter of Guarantee) or an authority to attend a meeting, conference or event** (The invitation must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter of guarantee with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.) and other documents for work purpose (e.g. confirmed registration for trade fairs or congresses).

**II. Official delegation/mission-** Letter issued by the authority (-ies) concerned confirming identity of the applicant(s), purpose of the journey (meeting, consultation, negotiations or events held by intergovernmental organizations), period of intended stay and accommodation details.

**III. Tourism-** Full travel itinerary.

**IV. Private visit** - Invitation letter signed (Letter of Guarantee) by the host covering the period of the intended stay (The Invitation Letter must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.).

**V. Medical treatment** - A document issued by the medical institution in the Member State of destination confirming that the applicant will receive medical care in that institution; Pre-payment or other proof of sufficient financial means to cover the medical treatment and related expenses, such as insurance coverage.

**VI. Study or training** - A certificate of enrollment at an educational establishment for the purpose of attending vocational or theoretical courses within the framework of basic and further training.; Student cards or certificates of the courses to be attended.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**Entry in Montenegro** - Nationals of Kuwait may enter, pass through the territory of and stay in Montenegro up to 90 days, with a valid travel document, without a visa.

You can enter Montenegro with your Schengen visa, provided the visa still has valid entries left as well as remaining days of stay. This also applies to holders of residence permits for a Schengen country.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**For holders of diplomatic

**For holders of ordinary passports and other travel documents:** No visas required for visits of up to 90 days in a 6 months period starting from the date of the first entry

On October 30, 2014, the Government of the Republic of Serbia adopted the Decision on visa free entry to the Republic of Serbia for holders of foreign national passports having a valid Schengen, UK and other Member States' visa, or visa of the United States of America, and for holders of foreign national passports having residence permit in the countries of the Schengen area, EU or the United States of America.

On basis of this decision, the above-mentioned categories of foreign nationals may, without prior visa application, enter, transit and stay in the Republic of Serbia up to 90 days during a six-month period, and within validity of said visas or residence permits. There is a possibility for foreign nationals to enter the Republic of Serbia with two passports e.g. expired national passport with valid visa or residence permit and valid national passport without valid visa or residence permit. Foreign nationals, holders of a residence permit in the form of a separate card (not a sticker affixed to their passport), must present their valid passport upon entering the territory of the Republic of Serbia.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** There are no restrictions on entering the Republic of Serbia. The recommendation to wear masks indoors remains in force, while wearing masks in health facilities is mandatory.

**Entry in Bosnia and Herzegovina** - Citizens of the State of Kuwait are exempted from the visa requirement when entering, exiting or travelling through Bosnia and Herzegovina **up to 90 days, for a period of six months, starting from the day of entry.**

Nationals of the following states may enter into Bosnia and Herzegovina with a passport or a valid identity card proving identity and citizenship of:

- Member State of the European Union
- State signatory to the Schengen Agreement
- Andorra, Montenegro, Liechtenstein, Monaco, San Marino, Serbia, the Holy See and Swiss Confederation.

The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150.00 (or equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) - for each day of the intended stay.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** The Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina has adopted a Decision on declaring a natural or other disaster on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina ('Official Gazette of BiH', 18/20), due to the danger of an epidemic of infectious disease caused by new coronavirus (COVID-19), in order to reduce the risk of accelerated spread of infection in Bosnia and Herzegovina and enable the engagement of additional resources to respond to this public health threat.

In order to prevent and suppress the spread of the SARS-COV-2 virus, the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina also adopted a **DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA**, as well as **DECISION ON AMENDMENT OF THE DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL**

**CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA** ('Official Gazette of BiH', 36/21').

**(Article 2) A foreigner who meets conditions for entry to BiH prescribed by Law on Aliens, may enter BiH if he/she at the BiH Border Crossing Points presents any of the following:**

- negative PCR test or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, not older than 48 hours if he/she comes from a European country, and if he/she comes from another country, not older than 72 hours until arrival at the border crossing point of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- certificate that a person has received the second dose of vaccine for COVID-19 before more than 14 days before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH or has received one dose before 14 days and more before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH, if it is a single dose vaccine,
- certificate issued by doctor showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19 in the previous period from 14 to 180 days until the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH.

**(Article 3) Exemptions from Article 2 of the Decision, foreigners who may enter Bosnia and Herzegovina without presenting a negative test result or certificates are:**

- citizens of Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and the Republic of Serbia, when they enter Bosnia and Herzegovina directly from the country of which they are citizens, as well as their minor children and spouses who are citizens of other countries,
- the crew and cabin crew of the aircraft whose final destination is Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- drivers and co-drivers of freight vehicles when performing international transport of goods by road, provided that their stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina does not last longer than 12 hours,
- crews of freight trains and ships in international traffic,

- diplomatic and consular staff and staff of international organizations in the performance of their official duties, who must have and present an appropriate valid passport upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- civil protection services and teams when their entry into Bosnia and Herzegovina is urgent and cannot be postponed,
- members of the military forces of the member states of the North Atlantic Treaty and other states participating in the Partnership for Peace and members of the NATO and EUFOR Headquarters in Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- heads of states and governments and members of their delegations whose arrival and departure from Bosnia and Herzegovina have been announced to Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina, through diplomatic channels or through protocols of the competent authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- foreigners transiting through the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the purpose of returning to the country of usual residence, without staying in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- a minor foreigner whose parent is a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as a foreigner who is the spouse of a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- children under the age of seven travelling with parents or guardians, if their parents or guardians possess negative PCR or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, or certificate on vaccination or certificate showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19,
- foreigners authorized to stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina temporarily or permanently, if they are returning to Bosnia and Herzegovina after exit and stay only in Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and/or the Republic of Serbia, provided that total duration of their stay in the above countries has not been longer than 48 hours since they left the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina, which could be proved by exiting stamp, i.e. entering stamp in a travel document of the foreigner,

- foreigners – citizens of the Republic of Turkey crossing the state border of Bosnia and Herzegovina daily due to construction of the bridge Rača in the framework of realization of the Project motorway/expressway Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo. Ministry of Communication and Transport of BiH shall submit to the BiH Border Police a certified list of nationals of the Republic of Turkey Border Police hired as workers for construction of the Rača Bridge within the above mentioned Project, including their names, surnames and number of travel document they use for crossing of the BiH border; as well as certificate that the Project is implemented according to signed Agreement on Cooperation regarding realization of the Project motorway/expressway road Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo (“Official Gazette BiH – International Agreements”, no. 13/20).

***Ukrainian citizens who left Ukraine due to the security situation***

By the Decision on prescribing additional conditions for the entry of foreigners into BiH, it is not prescribed what kind/type of PCR or antigen tests, i.e. form of tests or certificates is required to present at the border crossing points during intended entry to BiH, and it is possible to present them in printed or electronic form.

**Remarks:** Currently, when entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, no quarantine or self-isolation measures are prescribed, while upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, all persons are obliged to follow the instructions and respect all orders of the competent epidemiological and health authorities (social distance, protective masks, hand disinfection, etc.).

## **Entry in Albania** – No visas required.

For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is **90 days within a period of 180 days** and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

All foreigners who have a valid multi – entry Schengen visa, type “C” or “D”, or a valid residence permit in one of the Schengen member states, can enter, stay and transit Albania without visa, within the validity term of the visa or the residence permit. The same applies for all holders of Laissez-Passer issued by United Nations Organizations, and its branch, NATO, Council of Europe and European Union, regardless of nationality. For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

Holders of a valid type “C” multiple-entry Schengen visa (which has been previously used in one of the countries in Schengen area) or a Residence Permit to the Schengen Area, also holders of a valid UK, Canada and US visa (which has been previously used for entering that country) may enter to Albania without a visa for up to 15 days.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

## **Entry in Macedonia-** Entry visa for North Macedonia **REQUIRED.**

Visa Application Procedure : <https://mfa.gov.mk/en/page/434/visa-application-procedure>

**IMPORTANT:** The foreigner submits a visa application to the competent (resident or non-resident) diplomatic-consular representation of the Republic of North Macedonia **no longer than six months and at least 15 days before the start of the intended trip.** The visa application is submitted in person. Upon exception, the visa application may be submitted by another natural or legal person authorized to act as the proxy of the applicant when the foreigner is a disabled person or when the foreigner is a well-known person and there is no doubt about his/her bona fide intentions. The application for a minor is submitted in person by a parent or a guardian. **It takes 3 to 10 working days for a North Macedonia visa to be issued.** In extreme cases, the application process can take up to a month. North Macedonia Short-term Visa fee is **60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a North Macedonia Short-term Visa in North Macedonia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case, **The Embassy of the North Macedonia in Qatar ( Al Eithart Street 941, Area 63, Al Dafna, West Bay, Doha ).**

**The applicant encloses the following documentation with the visa application:**

- Valid travel document (the validity period of the travel document should exceed that of the visa by at least three months), the travel document must have been issued within the last 10 years and it must include at least two empty pages for visa purposes and one photograph size 35x45 mm
- Proof of valid travel medical insurance
- Proof of fees paid
- Documents that prove: the purpose of the visit to RNM, secured accommodation, means of subsistence to cover the stay in RNM and the repatriation or the travel to a third country, means of transport and the intention to return to the country of origin or the intention to travel to a third country.

Nationals of EU Member States and signatories of the Schengen Agreement DO NOT need a visa to enter the Republic of North Macedonia (and are eligible to enter the Republic of North Macedonia with a valid national identity card).

- Third-country nationals with temporary residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with permanent residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with multiple-entry Schengen visa (type C) valid for at least 5 (five) days beyond the intended stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- The Republic of North Macedonia has abolished short-term stay (Type C) visas for foreign nationals who are holders of valid passports of third countries and are simultaneously holders of valid UK, US, and Canadian visas, whereby the duration of their stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may not exceed 15 days, with the periods of validity of the valid UK, US, and Canadian visas they hold not exceeding more than 5 days from their planned stay in the Republic of North Macedonia. This decision is of a temporary character and shall be in force from 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2022.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** Visitors entering North Macedonia will no longer be required to present a vaccination certificate or a negative COVID-19 test.

\* As of 3 October 2018, nationals of Kuwait holding diplomatic and special passports do not require a visa for Croatia. Passport has to be valid for at least another 3 months after the planned departure from Croatia.

**IMPORTANT:** A visa application must be submitted **at least 15 calendar days** and no more than six months before the intended visit. Croatia Tourist visa fee is **60 EUR**, to be paid upon submission of the application. You will apply for a Croatia Tourist visa in Croatia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. Pursuant to the Government's Decision, starting with 22 July 2014, the Republic of Croatia applies the Decision No 565/2014/EU. **All third-country nationals who are holders of valid Schengen documents, as well as national visas and residence permits of Bulgaria, Cyprus, and Romania do not require an additional (Croatian) visa for Croatia.**

Third-country nationals who are holders of:

- **uniform visa (C) for two or multiple entries, valid for all Schengen Area Member States;**
- **visa with limited territorial validity (LTV visa), for two or multiple entries, issued to the holder of a travel document that is not recognised by one or more, but not all of the Schengen Area Member States, and which is valid for the territory of the Member States recognising the travel document;**
- **long-stay visa (D) for stays exceeding three months, issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;**
- **residence permit issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;**
- **national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Bulgaria, listed in Annex I of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**
- **national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Cyprus, listed in Annex III of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**
- **national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Romania, listed in Annex IV of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

**do not require a visa for transit or intended stays in the territory of Croatia not exceeding 90 days in any 180-day period.**

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**Entry in Slovenia** - Visa is required. You can find additional information on the <https://www.gov.si/en/topics/entry-and-residence/>

A short-stay visa (C type) is an authorization issued to a third-country national for entry and temporary stay (up to 90 days). An application for a C type visa should be submitted with the Schengen country that is the main destination. On behalf of Slovenia, this type of visa can also be issued by another Schengen country if the two countries have concluded a representation agreement. A C type visa may be extended in exceptional cases where the circumstances prevent the visa holder from returning to the country of origin.

**IMPORTANT:** A visa application must be submitted **at least 15 calendar days and no more than six months before the intended visit**. A visa application submitted **less than 15 calendar days** before may be accepted but the processing may take up to 15 calendar days. When applying for a Schengen visa, each person must pay a visa fee. This fee is non-refundable regardless of the visa result. The Schengen visa fee for citizens of Azerbaijan, Russia, and Armenia is currently **35 EUR**. These three countries benefit from reduced visa costs under an agreement with the Schengen countries. In other countries, this amount is **80 EUR** for people over 12 years old, **40 EUR** for children 6-12 years old, and free for children under six years old.

You will apply for Slovenia Tourism/Private Visit Visa in Slovenia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of the Republic of Slovenia in Abu Dhabi (12-01 Office Tower, Capital Plaza, Khalifa Street Corniche, Abu Dhabi)**.

**Third-country nationals** - A national of a third country who wishes to enter and reside in the Republic of Slovenia for tourist, business, personal, or other purposes should obtain a visa prior to their entry into the country, unless they are citizens of countries that do not require a visa, or already hold one of the permits described below:

**Holders of a short-stay visa (C type)** issued by a Schengen country may, during the visa validity period, enter the Republic of Slovenia and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a long-stay visa (D type)** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this visa and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the long-stay visa, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the long-stay visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a residence permit** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this residence permit and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the residence permit, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the residence permit, whichever is sooner.

### **Short-stay Visa (C type) application requirements:**

All requested documents have to be submitted and translated into English or Slovenian.

### **General requirements**

- ***Valid passport or travel document.*** Must be valid for minimum 3 months after the journey and issued within the previous 10 years and have at least 2 blank

pages. A copy of passport or travel document.

- **Application form** duly completed, dated and signed by the applicant.
- **One (1) recent photograph.**
- **Travel medical insurance** covering the entire duration of the trip valid in the whole Schengen area. The minimum coverage of 30.000 euros, covering: emergency medical expenses, hospital treatment, repatriation for medical reasons, or repatriation of remains. Multi-entry visa applicants must have insurance for the duration of the first trip.
- **Copy of flight ticket or flight reservation including return flight.**
- **Verifiable evidence of sufficient** means of subsistence during intended stay: payslips for the last 3 months, valid international credit card accompanied by bank statements, bank account statements for the last three (3) months or a national form for proof of sponsorship and/or accommodation.
- **Proof of accommodation:** hotel reservation, proof of rental or ownership of real estate in the member state of destination, confirmation of private accommodation, mentioning that the host will cover the accommodation costs, confirmation of accommodation by the company inviting the applicant, mentioning that the company will cover the accommodation costs.
- **Minors traveling without their parents/legal guardian:** Original authorisation signed by their parents/legal guardian in front of a visa officer or dully legalised and copy of the passport(s) of parents/legal guardian.
- **Residence permit** valid three months beyond the intended date of departure from the territory of the Member States or, for GCC citizens, a UAE ID-card, valid for three months after the intended departure date from the territory of the Member States.
- **Employees:** original letter from employer stating the applicant's employment status, position, length of the contract and salary, self-employed persons: valid original trade license, documents to be submitted relating to the purpose of the journey.

**I. Business trip- Invitation from the inviting company (Letter of Guarantee) or an authority to attend a meeting, conference or event** (The invitation must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter of guarantee with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.) and other documents for work purpose (e.g. confirmed registration for trade fairs or congresses).

**II. Official delegation/mission-** Letter issued by the authority (-ies) concerned confirming identity of the applicant(s), purpose of the journey (meeting,

consultation, negotiations or events held by intergovernmental organizations), period of intended stay and accommodation details.

**III. Tourism-** Full travel itinerary.

**IV. Private visit** - Invitation letter signed (Letter of Guarantee) by the host covering the period of the intended stay (The Invitation Letter must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.).

**V. Medical treatment** - A document issued by the medical institution in the Member State of destination confirming that the applicant will receive medical care in that institution; Pre-payment or other proof of sufficient financial means to cover the medical treatment and related expenses, such as insurance coverage.

**VI. Study or training** - A certificate of enrollment at an educational establishment for the purpose of attending vocational or theoretical courses within the framework of basic and further training.; Student cards or certificates of the courses to be attended.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

# FOR CITIZENS OF THE OMAN

**Entry in Montenegro - Visa is required.** For a foreigner who is minor, i.e. legally incapable, visa application shall be filed by a parent or his legal representative.

**IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Montenegro Short-stay visa is **3-10 working days**. Montenegro Short-stay visa is 35 EUR. The fee may vary depending on your nationality or your country of submission. You will apply for a Montenegro Short-stay visa in Montenegro visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of the Montenegro in Beirut (Zouk Mosbeh, Adonis, Kebbe building, second floor, P.O. Box: 170 Zouk Mikael)**.

Montenegro Short-stay visa (C) may be issued for one, two, or multiple entries into Montenegro for tourist, business, personal or other purposes. Continuous stay or the total duration of consecutive visits may not exceed 90 days in a period of 6 months, counting from the date of first entry. The validity period of Visa C for multiple entries is up to one year. Exceptionally this type of visa may be issued for a more extended period of validity, but no longer than five years. A short-stay visa may be given to a group of foreigners (collective visa). The validity period of a collective visa cannot exceed 30 days, and it may be affixed to a group passport. Montenegro is not included in the Schengen Agreement. Therefore, Montenegro visas are valid only for its territory. You can't travel to Schengen countries with a Montenegro visa.

**In addition to the visa application, the foreigner shall submit:**

- valid travel document (the period of validity of the travel document should exceed that of the visas by three months);

- one color photo 35x45 mm;
- proof of the purpose of stay in Montenegro (letter of guarantee by a physical person or letter of invitation by a legal entity, state authority in Montenegro or organizer of an international conference or event);
- proof of ensured accommodation (receipt from a tourist arrangement, hotel or other type of accommodation reservation that has been paid in);
- proof of possession of means for sustenance during his stay in Montenegro, as well as for return into the country where he comes from or for travel into a third state (cash, a bank account, traveler’s checks, credit cards etc.);
- proof of the means of travel and intention to return into the state where a foreigner comes from or into a third state (a return airplane or other transportation ticket, a driving license);
- proof of health insurance;
- proof that the consular fee has been charged,
- as well as other corresponding documents based on which the purpose and ensured accommodation in Montenegro can be determined

You can enter Montenegro with your Schengen visa, provided the visa still has valid entries left as well as remaining days of stay. This also applies to holders of residence permits for a Schengen country.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**For holders of diplomatic and official passports:** No visas required for visits of up to 90 days

**For holders of ordinary passports and other travel documents:** No visas required for visits of up to 90 days in a 6 months period starting from the date of the first entry

On October 30, 2014, the Government of the Republic of Serbia adopted the Decision on visa free entry to the Republic of Serbia for holders of foreign national passports having a valid Schengen, UK and other Member States' visa, or visa of the United States of America, and for holders of foreign national passports having residence permit in the countries of the Schengen area, EU or the United States of America.

On basis of this decision, the above-mentioned categories of foreign nationals may, without prior visa application, enter, transit and stay in the Republic of Serbia up to 90 days during a six-month period, and within validity of said visas or residence permits. There is a possibility for foreign nationals to enter the Republic of Serbia with two passports e.g. expired national passport with valid visa or residence permit and valid national passport without valid visa or residence permit. Foreign nationals, holders of a residence permit in the form of a separate card (not a sticker affixed to their passport), must present their valid passport upon entering the territory of the Republic of Serbia.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** There are no restrictions on entering the Republic of Serbia. The recommendation to wear masks indoors remains in force, while wearing masks in health facilities is mandatory.

**Entry in Bosnia and Herzegovina - Citizens of the Sultanate of Oman** are exempted from visa requirement for entry, exit, transit and stay on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina **up to 90 days, for a period of six months**, starting from the day of entry.

Nationals of the following states may enter into Bosnia and Herzegovina with a passport or a valid identity card proving identity and citizenship of:

- Member State of the European Union
- State signatory to the Schengen Agreement
- Andorra, Montenegro, Liechtenstein, Monaco, San Marino, Serbia, the Holy See and Swiss Confederation.

The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150.00 (or equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) - for each day of the intended stay.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** The Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina has adopted a Decision on declaring a natural or other disaster on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina ('Official Gazette of BiH',

18/20), due to the danger of an epidemic of infectious disease caused by new coronavirus (COVID-19), in order to reduce the risk of accelerated spread of infection in Bosnia and Herzegovina and enable the engagement of additional resources to respond to this public health threat.

In order to prevent and suppress the spread of the SARS-COV-2 virus, the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina also adopted a **DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA**, as well as **DECISION ON AMENDMENT OF THE DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA** ('Official Gazette of BiH', 36/21').

**(Article 2) A foreigner who meets conditions for entry to BiH prescribed by Law on Aliens, may enter BiH if he/she at the BiH Border Crossing Points presents any of the following:**

- negative PCR test or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, not older than 48 hours if he/she comes from a European country, and if he/she comes from another country, not older than 72 hours until arrival at the border crossing point of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- certificate that a person has received the second dose of vaccine for COVID-19 before more than 14 days before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH or has received one dose before 14 days and more before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH, if it is a single dose vaccine,
- certificate issued by doctor showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19 in the previous period from 14 to 180 days until the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH.

**(Article 3) Exemptions from Article 2 of the Decision, foreigners who may enter Bosnia and Herzegovina without presenting a negative test result or certificates are:**

- citizens of Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and the Republic of Serbia, when they enter Bosnia and Herzegovina directly from the

country of which they are citizens, as well as their minor children and spouses who are citizens of other countries,

- the crew and cabin crew of the aircraft whose final destination is Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- drivers and co-drivers of freight vehicles when performing international transport of goods by road, provided that their stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina does not last longer than 12 hours,
- crews of freight trains and ships in international traffic,
- diplomatic and consular staff and staff of international organizations in the performance of their official duties, who must have and present an appropriate valid passport upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- civil protection services and teams when their entry into Bosnia and Herzegovina is urgent and cannot be postponed,
- members of the military forces of the member states of the North Atlantic Treaty and other states participating in the Partnership for Peace and members of the NATO and EUFOR Headquarters in Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- heads of states and governments and members of their delegations whose arrival and departure from Bosnia and Herzegovina have been announced to Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina, through diplomatic channels or through protocols of the competent authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- foreigners transiting through the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the purpose of returning to the country of usual residence, without staying in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- a minor foreigner whose parent is a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as a foreigner who is the spouse of a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina,

- children under the age of seven travelling with parents or guardians, if their parents or guardians possess negative PCR or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, or certificate on vaccination or certificate showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19,
- foreigners authorized to stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina temporarily or permanently, if they are returning to Bosnia and Herzegovina after exit and stay only in Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and/or the Republic of Serbia, provided that total duration of their stay in the above countries has not been longer than 48 hours since they left the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina, which could be proved by exiting stamp, i.e. entering stamp in a travel document of the foreigner,
- foreigners – citizens of the Republic of Turkey crossing the state border of Bosnia and Herzegovina daily due to construction of the bridge Rača in the framework of realization of the Project motorway/expressway Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo. Ministry of Communication and Transport of BiH shall submit to the BiH Border Police a certified list of nationals of the Republic of Turkey Border Police hired as workers for construction of the Rača Bridge within the above mentioned Project, including their names, surnames and number of travel document they use for crossing of the BiH border; as well as certificate that the Project is implemented according to signed Agreement on Cooperation regarding realization of the Project motorway/expressway road Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo (“Official Gazette BiH – International Agreements”, no. 13/20).

***Ukrainian citizens who left Ukraine due to the security situation***

By the Decision on prescribing additional conditions for the entry of foreigners into BiH, it is not prescribed what kind/type of PCR or antigen tests, i.e. form of tests or certificates is required to present at the border crossing points during intended entry to BiH, and it is possible to present them in printed or electronic form.

**Remarks:** Currently, when entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, no quarantine or self-isolation measures are prescribed, while upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, all persons are obliged to follow the instructions and respect all orders of the competent

epidemiological and health authorities (social distance, protective masks, hand disinfection, etc.).

**Entry in Albania-** Albania applies visa-free travel. Foreign citizens from Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, India, Qatar, Oman, and Thailand, can enter Albania without a visa, for a short-term stay, with a passport document, from 20 April until 31 December.

Foreign citizens from Egypt and Russia can enter Albania without a visa, for a short-term stay, with a passport document, from 01 May until 30 September.

Beyond those dates, they are required to obtain a visa.

**IMPORTANT:** For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, **the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days** and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

Albania Short-term visa's validity period can be a maximum of **90 days**.

Kindly note that the visa applications will take a **minimum of 5 working days** starting from the date of confirmation of the visa fee payment and can take up to 15 working days. Albania Short-term Visa fee is **35-60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for an Albania Short-term Visa in Albania visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Albanian Honorary Consulate in Muscat (Mina Al-Fahal P.O. Box 678 Muscat, P.C 116)**.

For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

Holders of a valid type “C” multiple-entry Schengen visa (which has been previously used in one of the countries in Schengen area) or a Residence Permit to the Schengen Area, also holders of a valid UK, Canada and US visa (which has been previously used for entering that country) may enter to Albania without a visa for up to 15 days.

## **Entry in Macedonia-** Entry visa for North Macedonia **REQUIRED.**

**IMPORTANT:** The foreigner submits a visa application to the competent (resident or non-resident) diplomatic-consular representation of the Republic of North Macedonia **no longer than six months and at least 15 days before the start of the intended trip.** The visa application is submitted in person. Upon exception, the visa application may be submitted by another natural or legal person authorized to act as the proxy of the applicant when the foreigner is a disabled person or when the foreigner is a well-known person and there is no doubt about his/her bona fide intentions. The application for a minor is submitted in person by a parent or a guardian. **It takes 3 to 10 working days for a North Macedonia visa to be issued.** In extreme cases, the application process can take up to a month. North Macedonia Short-term Visa fee is **60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a North Macedonia Short-term Visa in North Macedonia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case, **The Embassy of North Macedonia in Doha (Al Eithart Street 941, Area 63, Al Dafna, West Bay)** or **The Embassy of North Macedonia in Abu Dhabi (Abu Dhabi Island, W9, C61, Mezanine M02, Po Box 108225).**

### **The applicant encloses the following documentation with the visa application:**

- Valid travel document (the validity period of the travel document should exceed that of the visa by at least three months), the travel document must have been issued within the last 10 years and it must include at least two empty pages for visa purposes and one photograph size 35x45 mm
- Proof of valid travel medical insurance
- Proof of fees paid
- Documents that prove: the purpose of the visit to RNM, secured accommodation, means of subsistence to cover the stay in RNM and the repatriation or the travel to a third country, means of transport and the

intention to return to the country of origin or the intention to travel to a third country.

- Nationals of EU Member States and signatories of the Schengen Agreement DO NOT need a visa to enter the Republic of North Macedonia (and are eligible to enter the Republic of North Macedonia with a valid national identity card).
- Third-country nationals with temporary residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with permanent residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with multiple-entry Schengen visa (type C) valid for at least 5 (five) days beyond the intended stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- The Republic of North Macedonia has abolished short-term stay (Type C) visas for foreign nationals who are holders of valid passports of third countries and are simultaneously holders of valid UK, US, and Canadian visas, whereby the duration of their stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may not exceed 15 days, with the periods of validity of the valid UK, US, and Canadian visas they hold not exceeding more than 5 days from their planned stay in the Republic of North Macedonia. This decision is of a temporary character and shall be in force from 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2022.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** Visitors entering North Macedonia will no longer be required to present a vaccination certificate or a negative COVID-19 test.

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Bulgaria, listed in Annex I of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Cyprus, listed in Annex III of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Romania, listed in Annex IV of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

do not require a visa for transit or intended stays in the territory of Croatia not exceeding 90 days in any 180-day period.

A short-stay visa (C type) is an authorization issued to a third-country national for entry and temporary stay (up to 90 days). An application for a C type visa should be submitted with the Schengen country that is the main destination. On behalf of Slovenia, this type of visa can also be issued by another Schengen country if the two countries have concluded a representation agreement. A C type visa may be extended in exceptional cases where the circumstances prevent the visa holder from returning to the country of origin.

**IMPORTANT:** A visa application must be submitted **at least 15 calendar days and no more than six months before the intended visit.** A visa application submitted **less than 15 calendar days** before may be accepted but the processing may take up to 15 calendar days. When applying for a Schengen visa, each person must pay a visa fee. This fee is non-refundable regardless of the visa result. The Schengen visa fee for citizens of Azerbaijan, Russia, and Armenia is currently **35 EUR**. These three countries benefit from reduced visa costs under an agreement with the Schengen countries. In other countries, this amount is **80 EUR** for people over

12 years old, **40 EUR** for children 6-12 years old, and free for children under six years old.

You will apply for Slovenia Tourism/Private Visit Visa in Slovenia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of the Republic of Slovenia in Cairo (21 Soliman Abaza Street, 12311 Mohandessin)**.

**Third-country nationals** - A national of a third country who wishes to enter and reside in the Republic of Slovenia for tourist, business, personal, or other purposes should obtain a visa prior to their entry into the country, unless they are citizens of countries that do not require a visa, or already hold one of the permits described below:

**Holders of a short-stay visa (C type)** issued by a Schengen country may, during the visa validity period, enter the Republic of Slovenia and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a long-stay visa (D type)** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this visa and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the long-stay visa, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the long-stay visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a residence permit** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this residence permit and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the residence permit, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the residence permit, whichever is sooner.

### **Short-stay Visa (C type) application requirements:**

All requested documents have to be submitted and translated into English or Slovenian.

### **General requirements**

- ***Valid passport or travel document.*** Must be valid for minimum 3 months after

the journey and issued within the previous 10 years and have at least 2 blank pages. A copy of passport or travel document.

- ***Application form*** duly completed, dated and signed by the applicant.
- ***One (1) recent photograph.***
- ***Travel medical insurance*** covering the entire duration of the trip valid in the whole Schengen area. The minimum coverage of 30.000 euros, covering: emergency medical expenses, hospital treatment, repatriation for medical reasons, or repatriation of remains. Multi-entry visa applicants must have insurance for the duration of the first trip.
- ***Copy of flight ticket or flight reservation including return flight.***
- ***Verifiable evidence of sufficient*** means of subsistence during intended stay: payslips for the last 3 months, valid international credit card accompanied by bank statements, bank account statements for the last three (3) months or a national form for proof of sponsorship and/or accommodation.
- ***Proof of accommodation:*** hotel reservation, proof of rental or ownership of real estate in the member state of destination, confirmation of private accommodation, mentioning that the host will cover the accommodation costs, confirmation of accommodation by the company inviting the applicant, mentioning that the company will cover the accommodation costs.
- ***Minors traveling without their parents/legal guardian:*** Original authorisation signed by their parents/legal guardian in front of a visa officer or duly legalised and copy of the passport(s) of parents/legal guardian.
- ***Residence permit*** valid three months beyond the intended date of departure from the territory of the Member States or, for GCC citizens, a UAE ID-card, valid for three months after the intended departure date from the territory of the Member States.
- ***Employees:*** original letter from employer stating the applicant's employment status, position, length of the contract and salary, self-employed persons: valid original trade license, documents to be submitted relating to the purpose of the journey.

**I. Business trip- Invitation from the inviting company (*Letter of Guarantee*) or an authority to attend a meeting, conference or event** (The invitation must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter of guarantee with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.) and other documents for work purpose (e.g. confirmed registration for trade fairs or congresses).

**II. Official delegation/mission-** Letter issued by the authority (-ies) concerned confirming identity of the applicant(s), purpose of the journey (meeting,

consultation, negotiations or events held by intergovernmental organizations), period of intended stay and accommodation details.

**III. Tourism-** Full travel itinerary.

**IV. Private visit** - Invitation letter signed (Letter of Guarantee) by the host covering the period of the intended stay (The Invitation Letter must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.).

**V. Medical treatment** - A document issued by the medical institution in the Member State of destination confirming that the applicant will receive medical care in that institution; Pre-payment or other proof of sufficient financial means to cover the medical treatment and related expenses, such as insurance coverage.

**VI. Study or training** - A certificate of enrollment at an educational establishment for the purpose of attending vocational or theoretical courses within the framework of basic and further training.; Student cards or certificates of the courses to be attended.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

# FOR CITIZENS OF THE BAHRAIN

**Entry in Montenegro** - Nationals of Bahrain are required to obtain a visa to enter Montenegro.

Visas may be obtained from diplomatic and consular posts of Montenegro. If you are unable to reach a diplomatic or consular post of Montenegro, you may apply for a visa at the nearest diplomatic or consular post of the Republic of Serbia. For a foreigner who is minor, i.e. legally incapable, visa application shall be filed by a parent or his legal representative.

**IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Montenegro Short-stay visa is **3-10 working days**. Montenegro Short-stay visa is 35 EUR. The fee may vary depending on your nationality or your country of submission. You will apply for a Montenegro Short-stay visa in Montenegro visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of the Republic of Serbia in Kuwait (Bayan, Block No. 13, Street No. 1, Villa No.18, Safat 13066)** or **Embassy of Montenegro in United Arab Emirates (Villa 1, Building 69, Rabdan street 29, Al Mushrif, Abu Dhabi)**.

You can enter Montenegro with your Schengen visa, provided the visa still has valid entries left as well as remaining days of stay. This also applies to holders of residence permits for a Schengen country.

Montenegro Short-stay visa (C) may be issued for one, two, or multiple entries into Montenegro for tourist, business, personal or other purposes. Continuous stay or the total duration of consecutive visits may not exceed 90 days in a period of 6 months, counting from the date of first entry. The validity period of Visa C for multiple entries is up to one year. Exceptionally this type of visa may be issued for a more extended period of validity, but no longer than five years. A short-stay visa may be

given to a group of foreigners (collective visa). The validity period of a collective visa cannot exceed 30 days, and it may be affixed to a group passport.

Montenegro is not included in the Schengen Agreement. Therefore, Montenegro visas are valid only for its territory. You can't travel to Schengen countries with a Montenegro visa.

**In addition to the visa application, the foreigner shall submit:**

- valid travel document (the period of validity of the travel document should exceed that of the visas by three months);
- one color photo 35x45 mm;
- proof of the purpose of stay in Montenegro (letter of guarantee by a physical person or letter of invitation by a legal entity, state authority in Montenegro or organizer of an international conference or event);
- proof of ensured accommodation (receipt from a tourist arrangement, hotel or other type of accommodation reservation that has been paid in);
- proof of possession of means for sustenance during his stay in Montenegro, as well as for return into the country where he comes from or for travel into a third state (cash, a bank account, traveler's checks, credit cards etc.);
- proof of the means of travel and intention to return into the state where a foreigner comes from or into a third state (a return airplane or other transportation ticket, a driving license);
- proof of health insurance;
- proof that the consular fee has been charged,
- as well as other corresponding documents based on which the purpose and ensured accommodation in Montenegro can be determined

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

No visas required for visits of up to 90 days

**For holders of ordinary passports and other travel documents:** No visas required for visits of up to 90 days in a 6 months period starting from the date of the first entry

On October 30, 2014, the Government of the Republic of Serbia adopted the Decision on visa free entry to the Republic of Serbia for holders of foreign national passports having a valid Schengen, UK and other Member States' visa, or visa of the United States of America, and for holders of foreign national passports having residence permit in the countries of the Schengen area, EU or the United States of America.

On basis of this decision, the above-mentioned categories of foreign nationals may, without prior visa application, enter, transit and stay in the Republic of Serbia up to 90 days during a six-month period, and within validity of said visas or residence permits. There is a possibility for foreign nationals to enter the Republic of Serbia with two passports e.g. expired national passport with valid visa or residence permit and valid national passport without valid visa or residence permit. Foreign nationals, holders of a residence permit in the form of a separate card (not a sticker affixed to their passport), must present their valid passport upon entering the territory of the Republic of Serbia.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** There are no restrictions on entering the Republic of Serbia. The recommendation to wear masks indoors remains in force, while wearing masks in health facilities is mandatory.

**Entry in Bosnia and Herzegovina - Citizens of the Bahrain** are exempted from visa requirement for entry, exit , transit and stay on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina **up to 90 days per period of six months** , starting from the day of entry.

**Holders of diplomatic and service passports of the Kingdom of Bahrain are exempted from the visa requirement** when entering, exiting or travelling through Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Nationals of the following states may enter into Bosnia and Herzegovina with a passport or a valid identity card proving identity and citizenship of:

- Member State of the European Union
- State signatory to the Schengen Agreement
- Andorra, Montenegro, Liechtenstein, Monaco, San Marino, Serbia, the Holy See and Swiss Confederation.

The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150.00 (or equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) - for each day of the intended stay.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** The Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina has adopted a Decision on declaring a natural or other disaster on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina ('Official Gazette of BiH', 18/20), due to the danger of an epidemic of infectious disease caused by new coronavirus (COVID-19), in order to reduce the risk of accelerated spread of infection in Bosnia and Herzegovina and enable the engagement of additional resources to respond to this public health threat.

In order to prevent and suppress the spread of the SARS-COV-2 virus, the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina also adopted a **DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA**, as well as **DECISION ON AMENDMENT OF THE DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA** ('Official Gazette of BiH', 36/21').

**(Article 2) A foreigner who meets conditions for entry to BiH prescribed by Law on Aliens, may enter BiH if he/she at the BiH Border Crossing Points presents any of the following:**

- negative PCR test or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, not older than 48 hours if he/she comes from a European country, and if he/she comes from another country, not older than 72 hours until arrival at the border crossing point of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- certificate that a person has received the second dose of vaccine for COVID-19 before more than 14 days before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH or has received one dose before 14 days and more before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH, if it is a single dose vaccine,
- certificate issued by doctor showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19 in the previous period from 14 to 180 days until the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH.

**(Article 3) Exemptions from Article 2 of the Decision, foreigners who may enter Bosnia and Herzegovina without presenting a negative test result or certificates are:**

- citizens of Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and the Republic of Serbia, when they enter Bosnia and Herzegovina directly from the country of which they are citizens, as well as their minor children and spouses who are citizens of other countries,
- the crew and cabin crew of the aircraft whose final destination is Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- drivers and co-drivers of freight vehicles when performing international transport of goods by road, provided that their stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina does not last longer than 12 hours,
- crews of freight trains and ships in international traffic,
- diplomatic and consular staff and staff of international organizations in the performance of their official duties, who must have and present an appropriate valid passport upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- civil protection services and teams when their entry into Bosnia and Herzegovina is urgent and cannot be postponed,
- members of the military forces of the member states of the North Atlantic Treaty and other states participating in the Partnership for Peace and members of the NATO and EUFOR Headquarters in Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- heads of states and governments and members of their delegations whose arrival and departure from Bosnia and Herzegovina have been announced to Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina, through diplomatic channels or through protocols of the competent authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- foreigners transiting through the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the purpose of returning to the country of usual residence, without staying in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- a minor foreigner whose parent is a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as a foreigner who is the spouse of a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina,

- children under the age of seven travelling with parents or guardians, if their parents or guardians possess negative PCR or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, or certificate on vaccination or certificate showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19,
- foreigners authorized to stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina temporarily or permanently, if they are returning to Bosnia and Herzegovina after exit and stay only in Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and/or the Republic of Serbia, provided that total duration of their stay in the above countries has not been longer than 48 hours since they left the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina, which could be proved by exiting stamp, i.e. entering stamp in a travel document of the foreigner,
- foreigners – citizens of the Republic of Turkey crossing the state border of Bosnia and Herzegovina daily due to construction of the bridge Rača in the framework of realization of the Project motorway/expressway Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo. Ministry of Communication and Transport of BiH shall submit to the BiH Border Police a certified list of nationals of the Republic of Turkey Border Police hired as workers for construction of the Rača Bridge within the above mentioned Project, including their names, surnames and number of travel document they use for crossing of the BiH border; as well as certificate that the Project is implemented according to signed Agreement on Cooperation regarding realization of the Project motorway/expressway road Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo (“Official Gazette BiH – International Agreements”, no. 13/20).

***Ukrainian citizens who left Ukraine due to the security situation***

By the Decision on prescribing additional conditions for the entry of foreigners into BiH, it is not prescribed what kind/type of PCR or antigen tests, i.e. form of tests or certificates is required to present at the border crossing points during intended entry to BiH, and it is possible to present them in printed or electronic form.

**Remarks:** Currently, when entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, no quarantine or self-isolation measures are prescribed, while upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, all persons are obliged to follow the instructions and respect all orders of the competent

epidemiological and health authorities (social distance, protective masks, hand disinfection, etc.).

**Entry in Albania - Albania applies visa-free travel. Foreign citizens from Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, India, Qatar, Oman, and Thailand, can enter Albania without a visa, for a short-term stay, with a passport document, from 20 April until 31 December.**

**Foreign citizens from Egypt and Russia can enter Albania without a visa, for a short-term stay, with a passport document, from 01 May until 30 September.**

**Beyond those dates, they are required to obtain a visa.**

**IMPORTANT:** For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, **the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days** and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

Albania Short-term visa's validity period can be a maximum of **90 days**.

Kindly note that the visa applications will take a minimum of 5 working days starting from the date of confirmation of the visa fee payment and can take up to 15 working days. Albania Short-term Visa fee is **35-60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for an Albania Short-term Visa in Albania visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Albanian Honorary Consulate in Manama, Bahrain (Al Zayani, 8th Floor Building 419, Road 1705, Block 317 P.O. Box 5553)**.

For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

Holders of a valid type “C” multiple-entry Schengen visa (which has been previously used in one of the countries in Schengen area) or a Residence Permit to the Schengen Area, also holders of a valid UK, Canada and US visa (which has been previously used for entering that country) may enter to Albania without a visa for up to 15 days.

**Entry in Macedonia-** Entry visa for North Macedonia **REQUIRED.**

**Visa Application Procedure :** <https://mfa.gov.mk/en/page/434/visa-application-procedure>

**IMPORTANT:** The foreigner submits a visa application to the competent (resident or non-resident) diplomatic-consular representation of the Republic of North Macedonia **no longer than six months and at least 15 days before the start of the intended trip.** The visa application is submitted in person. Upon exception, the visa application may be submitted by another natural or legal person authorized to act as the proxy of the applicant when the foreigner is a disabled person or when the foreigner is a well-known person and there is no doubt about his/her bona fide intentions. The application for a minor is submitted in person by a parent or a guardian. **It takes 3 to 10 working days for a North Macedonia visa to be issued.** In extreme cases, the application process can take up to a month. North Macedonia Short-term Visa fee is **60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a North Macedonia Short-term Visa in North Macedonia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case, **The Embassy of North Macedonia in Doha, Qatar (Al Eithart Street 941, Area 63, Al Dafna, West Bay) or Embassy of North in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates (Abu Dhabi Island, W9, C61, Mezanine M02, Po Box 108225).**

**The applicant encloses the following documentation with the visa application:**

- Valid travel document (the validity period of the travel document should exceed that of the visa by at least three months), the travel document must have been issued within the last 10 years and it must include at least two empty pages for visa purposes and one photograph size 35x45 mm
- Proof of valid travel medical insurance
- Proof of fees paid
- Documents that prove: the purpose of the visit to RNM, secured accommodation, means of subsistence to cover the stay in RNM and the repatriation or the travel to a third country, means of transport and the intention to return to the country of origin or the intention to travel to a third country.
- Nationals of EU Member States and signatories of the Schengen Agreement DO NOT need a visa to enter the Republic of North Macedonia (and are eligible to enter the Republic of North Macedonia with a valid national identity card).

- Third-country nationals with temporary residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with permanent residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with multiple-entry Schengen visa (type C) valid for at least 5 (five) days beyond the intended stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.

The Republic of North Macedonia has abolished short-term stay (Type C) visas for foreign nationals who are holders of valid passports of third countries and are simultaneously holders of valid UK, US, and Canadian visas, whereby the duration of their stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may not exceed 15 days, with the periods of validity of the valid UK, US, and Canadian visas they hold not exceeding more than 5 days from their planned stay in the Republic of North Macedonia. This decision is of a temporary character and shall be in force from 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2022.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** Visitors entering North Macedonia will no longer be required to present a vaccination certificate or a negative COVID-19 test.

Nationals of Israel may enter, pass through the territory of and stay in Montenegro up to 90 days, with a valid travel document, without a visa.

You can enter Montenegro with your Schengen visa, provided the visa still has valid entries left as well as remaining days of stay. This also applies to holders of residence permits for a Schengen country.

Montenegro Short-stay visa (C) may be issued for one, two, or multiple entries into Montenegro for tourist, business, personal or other purposes. Continuous stay or the total duration of consecutive visits may not exceed 90 days in a period of 6 months, counting from the date of first entry. The validity period of Visa C for multiple entries is up to one year. Exceptionally this type of visa may be issued for a more extended period of validity, but no longer than five years. A short-stay visa may be given to a group of foreigners (collective visa). The validity period of a collective visa cannot exceed 30 days, and it may be affixed to a group passport. You will apply for a Montenegro Short-stay visa in Montenegro visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location.

Montenegro is not included in the Schengen Agreement. Therefore, Montenegro visas are valid only for its territory. You can't travel to Schengen countries with a Montenegro visa.

On basis of this decision, the above-mentioned categories of foreign nationals may, without prior visa application, enter, transit and stay in the Republic of Serbia up to

90 days during a six-month period, and within validity of said visas or residence permits. There is a possibility for foreign nationals to enter the Republic of Serbia with two passports e.g. expired national passport with valid visa or residence permit and valid national passport without valid visa or residence permit. Foreign nationals, holders of a residence permit in the form of a separate card (not a sticker affixed to their passport), must present their valid passport upon entering the territory of the Republic of Serbia.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** There are no restrictions on entering the Republic of Serbia. The recommendation to wear masks indoors remains in force, while wearing masks in health facilities is mandatory.

**Citizens of Israel, holders of valid ordinary passports,** are exempted from the obligation to obtain a visa for entry, exit, transit and stay on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina **up to 90 days within a period of six months** starting from the date of first entry.

**Citizens of Israel, holders of diplomatic and official passports,** shall be exempt from the obligation to obtain a visa for entry, exit, transit and stay on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina up to 90 days.

Nationals of the following states may enter into Bosnia and Herzegovina with a passport or a valid identity card proving identity and citizenship of:

- Member State of the European Union
- State signatory to the Schengen Agreement
- Andorra, Montenegro, Liechtenstein, Monaco, San Marino, Serbia, the Holy See and Swiss Confederation.

The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150.00 (or equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) - for each day of the intended stay.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** The Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina has adopted a Decision on declaring a natural or other disaster on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina ('Official Gazette of BiH', 18/20), due to the danger of an epidemic of infectious disease caused by new coronavirus (COVID-19), in order to reduce the risk of accelerated spread of infection in Bosnia and Herzegovina and enable the engagement of additional resources to respond to this public health threat.

In order to prevent and suppress the spread of the SARS-COV-2 virus, the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina also adopted a **DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA**, as well as **DECISION ON AMENDMENT OF THE DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA** ('Official Gazette of BiH', 36/21').

**(Article 2) A foreigner who meets conditions for entry to BiH prescribed by Law on Aliens, may enter BiH if he/she at the BiH Border Crossing Points presents any of the following:**

- negative PCR test or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, not older than 48 hours if he/she comes from a European country, and if he/she comes from another country, not older than 72 hours until arrival at the border crossing point of Bosnia and Herzegovina,

- certificate that a person has received the second dose of vaccine for COVID-19 before more than 14 days before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH or has received one dose before 14 days and more before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH, if it is a single dose vaccine,
- certificate issued by doctor showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19 in the previous period from 14 to 180 days until the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH.

**(Article 3) Exemptions from Article 2 of the Decision, foreigners who may enter Bosnia and Herzegovina without presenting a negative test result or certificates are:**

- citizens of Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and the Republic of Serbia, when they enter Bosnia and Herzegovina directly from the country of which they are citizens, as well as their minor children and spouses who are citizens of other countries,
- the crew and cabin crew of the aircraft whose final destination is Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- drivers and co-drivers of freight vehicles when performing international transport of goods by road, provided that their stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina does not last longer than 12 hours,
- crews of freight trains and ships in international traffic,
- diplomatic and consular staff and staff of international organizations in the performance of their official duties, who must have and present an appropriate valid passport upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- civil protection services and teams when their entry into Bosnia and Herzegovina is urgent and cannot be postponed,
- members of the military forces of the member states of the North Atlantic Treaty and other states participating in the Partnership for Peace and members of the NATO and EUFOR Headquarters in Bosnia and Herzegovina,

- heads of states and governments and members of their delegations whose arrival and departure from Bosnia and Herzegovina have been announced to Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina, through diplomatic channels or through protocols of the competent authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- foreigners transiting through the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the purpose of returning to the country of usual residence, without staying in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- a minor foreigner whose parent is a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as a foreigner who is the spouse of a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- children under the age of seven travelling with parents or guardians, if their parents or guardians possess negative PCR or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, or certificate on vaccination or certificate showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19,
- foreigners authorized to stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina temporarily or permanently, if they are returning to Bosnia and Herzegovina after exit and stay only in Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and/or the Republic of Serbia, provided that total duration of their stay in the above countries has not been longer than 48 hours since they left the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina, which could be proved by exiting stamp, i.e. entering stamp in a travel document of the foreigner,
- foreigners – citizens of the Republic of Turkey crossing the state border of Bosnia and Herzegovina daily due to construction of the bridge Rača in the framework of realization of the Project motorway/expressway Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo. Ministry of Communication and Transport of BiH shall submit to the BiH Border Police a certified list of nationals of the Republic of Turkey Border Police hired as workers for construction of the Rača Bridge within the above mentioned Project, including their names, surnames and number of travel document they use for crossing of the BiH border; as well as

certificate that the Project is implemented according to signed Agreement on Cooperation regarding realization of the Project motorway/expressway road Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo (“Official Gazette BiH – International Agreements”, no. 13/20).

***Ukrainian citizens who left Ukraine due to the security situation***

By the Decision on prescribing additional conditions for the entry of foreigners into BiH, it is not prescribed what kind/type of PCR or antigen tests, i.e. form of tests or certificates is required to present at the border crossing points during intended entry to BiH, and it is possible to present them in printed or electronic form.

**Remarks:** Currently, when entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, no quarantine or self-isolation measures are prescribed, while upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, all persons are obliged to follow the instructions and respect all orders of the competent epidemiological and health authorities (social distance, protective masks, hand disinfection, etc.).

All foreigners who have a valid multi – entry Schengen visa, type “C” or “D”, or a valid residence permit in one of the Schengen member states, can enter, stay and transit Albania without visa, within the validity term of the visa or the residence permit. The same applies for all holders of Laissez-Passer issued by United Nations Organizations, and its branch, NATO, Council of Europe and European Union, regardless of nationality. For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

Holders of a valid type “C” multiple-entry Schengen visa (which has been previously used in one of the countries in Schengen area) or a Residence Permit to the Schengen Area, also holders of a valid UK, Canada and US visa (which has been previously used for entering that country) may enter to Albania without a visa for up to 15 days.

# FOR CITIZENS OF THE JORDAN

## Entry in Montenegro -

Nationals of Jordan are required to obtain a visa to enter Montenegro.

Visas may be obtained from diplomatic and consular posts of Montenegro. If you are unable to reach a diplomatic or consular post of Montenegro, you may apply for a visa at the Embassy of the Republic of Bosnia and Hercegovina in Amman. For a foreigner who is minor, i.e. legally incapable, visa application shall be filed by a parent or his legal representative.

**IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Montenegro Short-stay visa is **3-10 working days**. Montenegro Short-stay visa is 35 EUR. The fee may vary depending on your nationality or your country of submission. You will apply for a Montenegro Short-stay visa in Montenegro visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case- **Embassy of Bosnia and Hercegovina in Amman, the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan (Sweifieh, Said al-Mufti Street No. 67, P.O. Box 850836).**

**In addition to the visa application, the foreigner shall submit:**

- valid travel document (the period of validity of the travel document should exceed that of the visas by three months);
- one color photo 35x45 mm;

- proof of the purpose of stay in Montenegro (letter of guarantee by a physical person or letter of invitation by a legal entity, state authority in Montenegro or organizer of an international conference or event);
- proof of ensured accommodation (receipt from a tourist arrangement, hotel or other type of accommodation reservation that has been paid in);
- proof of possession of means for sustenance during his stay in Montenegro, as well as for return into the country where he comes from or for travel into a third state (cash, a bank account, traveler's checks, credit cards etc.);
- proof of the means of travel and intention to return into the state where a foreigner comes from or into a third state (a return airplane or other transportation ticket, a driving license);
- proof of health insurance;
- proof that the consular fee has been charged,
- as well as other corresponding documents based on which the purpose and ensured accommodation in Montenegro can be determined

You can enter Montenegro with your Schengen visa, provided the visa still has valid entries left as well as remaining days of stay. This also applies to holders of residence permits for a Schengen country.

Montenegro Short-stay visa (C) may be issued for one, two, or multiple entries into Montenegro for tourist, business, personal or other purposes. Continuous stay or the total duration of consecutive visits may not exceed 90 days in a period of 6 months, counting from the date of first entry. The validity period of Visa C for multiple entries is up to one year. Exceptionally this type of visa may be issued for a more extended period of validity, but no longer than five years. A short-stay visa may be given to a group of foreigners (collective visa). The validity period of a collective visa cannot exceed 30 days, and it may be affixed to a group passport.

Montenegro is not included in the Schengen Agreement. Therefore, Montenegro visas are valid only for its territory. You can't travel to Schengen countries with a Montenegro visa.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**For holders of diplomatic and official passports:** Visas required

**For holders of ordinary passports and other travel documents:** Visas required

The Serbia Tourist visa permits you to stay in Serbia and realize your tourist activities for **a maximum period of 90 days at most per 180 days**.

**IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Serbia Tourist visa is **3-10 calendar days**. It depends on your visa application country. Serbia Tourist visa fee is **80 EUR**. Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission.

You will apply for a Serbia Tourist visa in Serbia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case- **Embassy of the Republic of Serbia in Beirut, which covers the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan on a non-residential basis.**

### **General visa requirements:**

- Valid passport (passport must be valid at least 90 days from issue date of visa)
- Letter of invitation:
  - for a private visit – invitation letter certified by the relevant authority of the Republic of Serbia
  - for a business visit – invitation letter by a company in Serbia;
  - for a tourist trip – a proof of payment for the trip issued by a travel agency (voucher or other type of payment receipt);
- Completed visa application form: (PDF) ;
- Photo (size 3.5x4.5cm);
- Return ticket or Itinerary (copy of Driving License and Insurance if you travel by car);
- Proof of sufficient funds for staying in Serbia;
- Health insurance
- Visa fee.

On October 30, 2014, the Government of the Republic of Serbia adopted the Decision on visa free entry to the Republic of Serbia for holders of foreign national passports having a valid Schengen, UK and other Member States' visa, or visa of the United States of America, and for holders of foreign national passports having residence permit in the countries of the Schengen area, EU or the United States of America.

On basis of this decision, the above-mentioned categories of foreign nationals may, without prior visa application, enter, transit and stay in the Republic of Serbia up to 90 days during a six-month period, and within validity of said visas or residence permits. There is a possibility for foreign nationals to enter the Republic of Serbia with two passports e.g. expired national passport with valid visa or residence permit and valid national passport without valid visa or residence permit. Foreign nationals, holders of a residence permit in the form of

a separate card (not a sticker affixed to their passport), must present their valid passport upon entering the territory of the Republic of Serbia.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** There are no restrictions on entering the Republic of Serbia. The recommendation to wear masks indoors remains in force, while wearing masks in health facilities is mandatory.

**Citizens of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan are required visas** when entering, exiting or travelling through Bosnia and Herzegovina.

**Holders of diplomatic and official passports of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan**, shall be exempt from the obligation to obtain a visa for entry, exit, transit and stay on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina up to 90 days.

All visa applications must be submitted in person. The Embassy do not accept applications sent through email.

**IMPORTANT:** Applications should be made **at least 10-30 days before your intended departure date**. Bosnia & Herzegovina's fees cover only a part of the work necessary to process your application. Because processing fees are only for handling your application, you will not get your money back, even if your application is refused. The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150,00 (ore equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) for each day of intended stay.

Bosnia and Herzegovina Short-term Visa fee is **31 EUR for single-entry and 57 EUR for a multiple-entry visa** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a Bosnia and Herzegovina Short-term visa in Bosnia and Herzegovina visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of the BiH in the Hashemite Kingdom of JORDAN (SWEIFIEH, Said al-Mufti street No.67, P.O. Box 850836 Amman 11185).**

**Listed below are the documents required when applying for a visa to Bosnia and Herzegovina:**

1. A valid passport of the applicant
2. Application form (completed and signed)
3. Copy of a valid residence visa
4. Copy of a round trip ticket or itinerary
5. One passport size picture
6. Travel insurance
7. No objection letter from your company or your sponsor

**In addition to the above, the following items must be presented:**

**If I travel as a tourist** : Voucher of the travel agency stating that the trip has been paid in full

Copy of your bank statement for the last 3 months

**If visiting friends and/or relatives:** Letter of invitation from the person(s) the applicant intends to visit, certified by the Ministry of Security of Bosnia and Herzegovina – Department for Foreign Citizens.

**If traveling on business:** Letter from the employer stating the purpose of the trip to Bosnia and Herzegovina

Letter of invitation from a company in Bosnia and Herzegovina, certified by the Ministry of Security of Bosnia and Herzegovina – Department for Foreign Citizens.

**Children under the age of 18:** For children under the age of 18 a birth certificate is required.

Nationals of the following states may enter into Bosnia and Herzegovina with a passport or a valid identity card proving identity and citizenship of:

- Member State of the European Union
- State signatory to the Schengen Agreement
- Andorra, Montenegro, Liechtenstein, Monaco, San Marino, Serbia, the Holy See and Swiss Confederation.

The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150.00 (or equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) - for each day of the intended stay.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** The Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina has adopted a Decision on declaring a natural or other disaster on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina ('Official Gazette of BiH', 18/20), due to the danger of an epidemic of infectious disease caused by new coronavirus (COVID-19), in order to reduce the risk of accelerated spread of infection in Bosnia and Herzegovina and enable the engagement of additional resources to respond to this public health threat.

In order to prevent and suppress the spread of the SARS-COV-2 virus, the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina also adopted a **DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA**, as well as **DECISION ON AMENDMENT OF THE DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA** ('Official Gazette of BiH', 36/21').

**(Article 2) A foreigner who meets conditions for entry to BiH prescribed by Law on Aliens, may enter BiH if he/she at the BiH Border Crossing Points presents any of the following:**

- negative PCR test or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, not older than 48 hours if he/she comes from a European country, and if he/she comes from

another country, not older than 72 hours until arrival at the border crossing point of Bosnia and Herzegovina,

- certificate that a person has received the second dose of vaccine for COVID-19 before more than 14 days before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH or has received one dose before 14 days and more before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH, if it is a single dose vaccine,
- certificate issued by doctor showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19 in the previous period from 14 to 180 days until the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH.

**(Article 3) Exemptions from Article 2 of the Decision, foreigners who may enter Bosnia and Herzegovina without presenting a negative test result or certificates are:**

- citizens of Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and the Republic of Serbia, when they enter Bosnia and Herzegovina directly from the country of which they are citizens, as well as their minor children and spouses who are citizens of other countries,
- the crew and cabin crew of the aircraft whose final destination is Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- drivers and co-drivers of freight vehicles when performing international transport of goods by road, provided that their stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina does not last longer than 12 hours,
- crews of freight trains and ships in international traffic,
- diplomatic and consular staff and staff of international organizations in the performance of their official duties, who must have and present an appropriate valid passport upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- civil protection services and teams when their entry into Bosnia and Herzegovina is urgent and cannot be postponed,
- members of the military forces of the member states of the North Atlantic Treaty and other states participating in the Partnership for

Peace and members of the NATO and EUFOR Headquarters in Bosnia and Herzegovina,

- heads of states and governments and members of their delegations whose arrival and departure from Bosnia and Herzegovina have been announced to Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina, through diplomatic channels or through protocols of the competent authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- foreigners transiting through the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the purpose of returning to the country of usual residence, without staying in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- a minor foreigner whose parent is a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as a foreigner who is the spouse of a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- children under the age of seven travelling with parents or guardians, if their parents or guardians possess negative PCR or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, or certificate on vaccination or certificate showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19,
- foreigners authorized to stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina temporarily or permanently, if they are returning to Bosnia and Herzegovina after exit and stay only in Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and/or the Republic of Serbia, provided that total duration of their stay in the above countries has not been longer than 48 hours since they left the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina, which could be proved by exiting stamp, i.e. entering stamp in a travel document of the foreigner,
- foreigners – citizens of the Republic of Turkey crossing the state border of Bosnia and Herzegovina daily due to construction of the bridge Rača in the framework of realization of the Project motorway/expressway Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo. Ministry of Communication and Transport of BiH shall submit to the BiH Border Police a certified list of nationals of the Republic of Turkey Border Police hired as workers for construction of the Rača Bridge within the

above mentioned Project, including their names, surnames and number of travel document they use for crossing of the BiH border; as well as certificate that the Project is implemented according to signed Agreement on Cooperation regarding realization of the Project motorway/expressway road Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo (“Official Gazette BiH – International Agreements”, no. 13/20).

***Ukrainian citizens who left Ukraine due to the security situation***

By the Decision on prescribing additional conditions for the entry of foreigners into BiH, it is not prescribed what kind/type of PCR or antigen tests, i.e. form of tests or certificates is required to present at the border crossing points during intended entry to BiH, and it is possible to present them in printed or electronic form.

**Remarks:** Currently, when entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, no quarantine or self-isolation measures are prescribed, while upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, all persons are obliged to follow the instructions and respect all orders of the competent epidemiological and health authorities (social distance, protective masks, hand disinfection, etc.).

**IMPORTANT:** Albania Short-term Visa fee is **35-60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for an Albania Short-term Visa in Albania visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. A visa is issued up to 15 days from the acceptance of the application and in exceptional cases may take up to 30 days. In this case - **Albanian Honorary Consulate in Amman, Jordan (Shmesani, Queen Noor Street, Building 53 P.O. Box 940258 Amman, 11194).**

**For tourism:** Confirmation of the accommodation (hotel confirmation, apartment rental contract, etc.), Round-trip ticket reservation

Albania applies visa-free travel, during the tourist period, from **01 May 2022 to 30 September 2022**, citizens of Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, Oman, Qatar, the Arab Republic of Egypt, India, Russia and Thailand, travel without a visa to Albania, without having to obtain a visa at the Albanian Embassy.

For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is **90 days within a period of 180 days** and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

All foreigners who have a valid multi – entry Schengen visa, type “C” or “D”, or a valid residence permit in one of the Schengen member states, can enter, stay and transit Albania without visa, within the validity term of the visa or the residence permit. The same applies for all holders of Laissez-Passer issued by United Nations Organizations, and its branch, NATO, Council of Europe and European Union, regardless of nationality. For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

Holders of a valid type “C” multiple-entry Schengen visa (which has been previously used in one of the countries in Schengen area) or a Residence Permit to the Schengen Area, also holders of a valid UK, Canada and US visa (which has been previously used for entering that country) may enter to Albania without a visa for up to 15 days.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

North Macedonia Short-term visa's validity period can be a maximum of 90 days.

**IMPORTANT:** The foreigner submits a visa application to the competent (resident or non-resident) diplomatic-consular representation of the Republic of North Macedonia **no longer than six months and at least 15 days before the start of the intended trip.** The visa application is submitted in person. Upon exception, the visa application may be submitted by another natural or legal person authorized to act as the proxy of the applicant when the foreigner is a disabled person or when the foreigner is a well-known person and there is no doubt about his/her bona fide intentions. The application for a minor is submitted in person by a parent or a guardian. **It takes 3 to 10 working days for a North Macedonia visa to be issued.** In extreme cases, the application process can take up to a month. North Macedonia Short-term Visa fee is **60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a North Macedonia Short-term Visa in North Macedonia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or

consulate to your location. In this case, **Macedonian Honorary Consulate in Amman, Jordan (Shmaisani - Khair Al- Din Al-Tunisi Street - Building no.3)**

**The applicant encloses the following documentation with the visa application:**

- Valid travel document (the validity period of the travel document should exceed that of the visa by at least three months), the travel document must have been issued within the last 10 years and it must include at least two empty pages for visa purposes and one photograph size 35x45 mm
- Proof of valid travel medical insurance
- Proof of fees paid
- Documents that prove: the purpose of the visit to RNM, secured accommodation, means of subsistence to cover the stay in RNM and the repatriation or the travel to a third country, means of transport and the intention to return to the country of origin or the intention to travel to a third country.

Nationals of EU Member States and signatories of the Schengen Agreement DO NOT need a visa to enter the Republic of North Macedonia (and are eligible to enter the Republic of North Macedonia with a valid national identity card).

- Third-country nationals with temporary residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with permanent residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with multiple-entry Schengen visa (type C) valid for at least 5 (five) days beyond the intended stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.

The Republic of North Macedonia has abolished short-term stay (Type C) visas for foreign nationals who are holders of valid passports of third countries and are simultaneously holders of valid UK, US, and Canadian visas, whereby the duration of their stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may not exceed 15 days, with the

periods of validity of the valid UK, US, and Canadian visas they hold not exceeding more than 5 days from their planned stay in the Republic of North Macedonia. This decision is of a temporary character and shall be in force from 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2022.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** Visitors entering North Macedonia will no longer be required to present a vaccination certificate or a negative COVID-19 test.

\* Jordanian citizens' holders of the diplomatic passport do not require a visa for entering the Republic of Croatia.

**Short-term visa (visa C)** - approval for transit through or intended stay in the territory of Croatia for a duration of no more than 90 days in any 180-day period;

**IMPORTANT:** A visa application must be submitted **at least 15 calendar days and no more than six months** before the intended visit. Croatia Tourist visa fee is **60 EUR**, to be paid upon submission of the application. Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. The fee may vary depending on your nationality or your country of

submission. You will apply for a Croatia Tourist visa in Croatia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **DM/CO Republic of Croatia in Amman (Al - Yanabee St. 26 Branch from Al-Wekalat St. Sweifieh Habaybeh Center, First floor P.O. Box 17213) or DM/CO Republic of Croatia in Cairo (3, Abou El Feda St. Zamalek).**

**Each visa applicant shall enclose following documents with the application:**

- valid travel document - the validity period of the travel document should exceed that of the visa by three months, travel document must be issued in the previous 10 years, travel document must contain at least two empty pages for the visa
- a 35x45 mm colour photo
- evidence of travel health insurance
- evidence of paid visa fee
- documents that prove:
  - the purpose of the stay in Croatia
  - ensured accommodation
  - means of subsistence to cover the stay in Croatia and the return to the country of origin or to a third country
  - means of transport and the intention to return to the applicant's country of origin or to a third country.

Pursuant to the Government's Decision, starting with 22 July 2014, the Republic of Croatia applies the Decision No 565/2014/EU. **All third-country nationals who are holders of valid Schengen documents, as well as national visas and residence permits of Bulgaria, Cyprus, and Romania do not require an additional (Croatian) visa for Croatia.**

Third-country nationals who are holders of:

**uniform visa (C) for two or multiple entries, valid for all Schengen Area Member States;**

**visa with limited territorial validity (LTV visa), for two or multiple entries, issued to the holder of a travel document that is not recognized by one or more, but not all of the Schengen Area Member States, and which is valid for the territory of the Member States recognizing the travel document;**

**long-stay visa (D) for stays exceeding three months**, issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;

**residence permit** issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Bulgaria**, listed in Annex I of the **Decision No 565/2014/EU**;

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Cyprus**, listed in Annex III of the **Decision No 565/2014/EU**;

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Romania**, listed in Annex IV of the **Decision No 565/2014/EU**;

**do not require a visa for transit or intended stays in the territory of Croatia not exceeding 90 days in any 180-day period.**

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

Jordanian citizens need a visa to enter Slovenia. For all details of the visa procedure, contact the embassy or consulate of the EU Member State representing Slovenia in Jordan.

You can find additional information on the website of the Embassy of Slovenia in Cairo.

A short-stay visa (C type) is an authorization issued to a third-country national for entry and temporary stay (up to 90 days). An application for a C type visa should be submitted with the Schengen country that is the main destination. On behalf of Slovenia, this type of visa can also be issued by another Schengen country if the two countries have concluded a representation agreement. A C type visa may be extended in exceptional cases where the circumstances prevent the visa holder from returning to the country of origin.

**IMPORTANT:** A visa application must be submitted **at least 15 calendar days** and no more than six months before the intended visit. A visa application submitted **less than 15 calendar days** before may be accepted but the processing may take up to 15 calendar days. When applying for a Schengen visa, each person must pay a visa fee. This fee is non-refundable regardless of the visa result. The Schengen visa fee for citizens of Azerbaijan, Russia, and Armenia is currently **35 EUR**. These three countries benefit from reduced visa costs under an agreement with the Schengen countries. In other countries, this amount is **80 EUR** for people over 12 years old, **40 EUR** for children 6-12 years old, and free for children under six years old.

You will apply for Slovenia Tourism/Private Visit Visa in Slovenia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Consulate of Slovenia in Amman, Jordan**.

### **Short-stay Visa (C type) application requirements:**

**All requested documents have to be submitted and translated into English or Slovenian.**

#### **General requirements**

- ***Valid passport or travel document.*** Must be valid for minimum 3 months after

the journey and issued within the previous 10 years and have at least 2 blank pages. A copy of passport or travel document.

- **Application form** duly completed, dated and signed by the applicant.
- **One (1) recent photograph.**
- **Travel medical insurance** covering the entire duration of the trip valid in the whole Schengen area. The minimum coverage of 30.000 euros, covering: emergency medical expenses, hospital treatment, repatriation for medical reasons, or repatriation of remains. Multi-entry visa applicants must have insurance for the duration of the first trip.
- **Copy of flight ticket or flight reservation including return flight.**
- **Verifiable evidence of sufficient** means of subsistence during intended stay: payslips for the last 3 months, valid international credit card accompanied by bank statements, bank account statements for the last three (3) months or a national form for proof of sponsorship and/or accommodation.
- **Proof of accommodation:** hotel reservation, proof of rental or ownership of real estate in the member state of destination, confirmation of private accommodation, mentioning that the host will cover the accommodation costs, confirmation of accommodation by the company inviting the applicant, mentioning that the company will cover the accommodation costs.
- **Minors traveling without their parents/legal guardian:** Original authorisation signed by their parents/legal guardian in front of a visa officer or dully legalised and copy of the passport(s) of parents/legal guardian.
- **Residence permit** valid three months beyond the intended date of departure from the territory of the Member States or, for GCC citizens, a UAE ID-card, valid for three months after the intended departure date from the territory of the Member States.
- **Employees:** original letter from employer stating the applicant's employment status, position, length of the contract and salary, self-employed persons: valid original trade license, documents to be submitted relating to the purpose of the journey.

**I. Business trip- Invitation from the inviting company (Letter of Guarantee) or an authority to attend a meeting, conference or event** (The invitation must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter of guarantee with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.) and other documents for work purpose (e.g. confirmed registration for trade fairs or congresses).

**II. Official delegation/mission-** Letter issued by the authority (-ies) concerned confirming identity of the applicant(s), purpose of the journey (meeting,

consultation, negotiations or events held by intergovernmental organizations), period of intended stay and accommodation details.

**III. Tourism-** Full travel itinerary.

**IV. Private visit** - Invitation letter signed (Letter of Guarantee) by the host covering the period of the intended stay (The Invitation Letter must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.).

**V. Medical treatment** - A document issued by the medical institution in the Member State of destination confirming that the applicant will receive medical care in that institution; Pre-payment or other proof of sufficient financial means to cover the medical treatment and related expenses, such as insurance coverage.

**VI. Study or training** - A certificate of enrollment at an educational establishment for the purpose of attending vocational or theoretical courses within the framework of basic and further training.; Student cards or certificates of the courses to be attended.

**Third-country nationals** - A national of a third country who wishes to enter and reside in the Republic of Slovenia for tourist, business, personal, or other purposes should obtain a visa prior to their entry into the country, unless they are citizens of countries that do not require a visa, or already hold one of the permits described below:

**Holders of a short-stay visa (C type)** issued by a Schengen country may, during the visa validity period, enter the Republic of Slovenia and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a long-stay visa (D type)** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this visa and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the long-stay visa, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the long-stay visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a residence permit** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this residence permit and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries,

except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the residence permit, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the residence permit, whichever is sooner.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

# FOR CITIZENS OF THE LEBANON

## Entry in Montenegro –

Nationals of Lebanon are required to obtain a visa to enter Montenegro. Visas may be obtained from diplomatic and consular posts of Montenegro. If you are unable to reach a diplomatic or consular post of Montenegro, you may apply for a visa at the nearest diplomatic or consular post of the Republic of Serbia. In this case- **Honorary Consulate of Montenegro in Beirut, the Lebanese Republic (Zouk Mosbeh, Adonis, Kebbe Building, Second Floor, P.O. Box: 170 Zouk Mikael, Beirut).**

**IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Montenegro Short-stay visa is 3-10 working days. Montenegro Short-stay visa is 35 EUR. The fee may vary depending on your nationality or your country of submission.

You can enter Montenegro with your Schengen visa, provided the visa still has valid entries left as well as remaining days of stay. This also applies to holders of residence permits for a Schengen country.

Montenegro Short-stay visa (C) may be issued for one, two, or multiple entries into Montenegro for tourist, business, personal or other purposes. Continuous stay or the total duration of consecutive visits may not exceed 90 days in a period of 6 months, counting from the date of first entry. The validity period of Visa C for multiple entries is up to one year. Exceptionally this type of visa may be issued for a more extended period of validity, but no longer than five years. A short-stay visa may be given to a group of foreigners (collective visa). The validity period of a collective visa cannot exceed 30 days, and it may be affixed to a group passport.

Montenegro is not included in the Schengen Agreement. Therefore, Montenegro visas are valid only for its territory. You can't travel to Schengen countries with a Montenegro visa.

For a foreigner who is minor, i.e. legally incapable, visa application shall be filed by a parent or his legal representative.

**In addition to the visa application, the foreigner shall submit:**

- valid travel document (the period of validity of the travel document should exceed that of the visas by three months);
- one color photo 35x45 mm;
- proof of the purpose of stay in Montenegro (letter of guarantee by a physical person or letter of invitation by a legal entity, state authority in Montenegro or organizer of an international conference or event);
- proof of ensured accommodation (receipt from a tourist arrangement, hotel or other type of accommodation reservation that has been paid in);
- proof of possession of means for sustenance during his stay in Montenegro, as well as for return into the country where he comes from or for travel into a third state (cash, a bank account, traveler's checks, credit cards etc.);
- proof of the means of travel and intention to return into the state where a foreigner comes from or into a third state (a return airplane or other transportation ticket, a driving license);
- proof of health insurance;
- proof that the consular fee has been charged,
- as well as other corresponding documents based on which the purpose and ensured accommodation in Montenegro can be determined.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**For holders of diplomatic, special and official passports**

No visas required for visits of up to 90 days

**For holders of ordinary passports and other travel documents:**

Visas required

The Serbia Tourist visa permits you to stay in Serbia and realize your tourist activities for a maximum period of 90 days at most per 180 days.

**IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Serbia Tourist visa is **3-10 calendar days**. It depends on your visa application country. Serbia Tourist visa fee is **80 EUR**. Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission.

You will apply for a Serbia Tourist visa in Serbia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of the Serbia in Lebanon (Jounieh-Kaslik Roundabout, Etoile Center (Zara Building), 2nd floor).**

On October 30, 2014, the Government of the Republic of Serbia adopted the Decision on visa free entry to the Republic of Serbia for holders of foreign national passports having a valid Schengen, UK and other Member States' visa, or visa of the United States of America, and for holders of foreign national passports having residence permit in the countries of the Schengen area, EU or the United States of America.

On basis of this decision, the above-mentioned categories of foreign nationals may, without prior visa application, enter, transit and stay in the Republic of Serbia up to 90 days during a six-month period, and within validity of said visas or residence permits. There is a possibility for foreign nationals to enter the Republic of Serbia with two passports e.g. expired national passport with valid visa or residence permit and valid national passport without valid visa or residence permit. Foreign nationals, holders of a residence permit in the form of a separate card (not a sticker affixed to their passport), must present their valid passport upon entering the territory of the Republic of Serbia.

#### **General visa requirements:**

- Valid passport (passport must be valid at least 90 days from issue date of visa)
- Letter of invitation:
  - for a private visit – invitation letter certified by the relevant authority of the Republic of Serbia
  - for a business visit – invitation letter by a company in Serbia;
  - for a tourist trip – a proof of payment for the trip issued by a travel agency (voucher or other type of payment receipt);
- Completed visa application form: (PDF) ;
- Photo (size 3.5x4.5cm);

- Return ticket or Itinerary (copy of Driving License and Insurance if you travel by car);
- Proof of sufficient funds for staying in Serbia;
- Health insurance
- Visa fee.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** There are no restrictions on entering the Republic of Serbia. The recommendation to wear masks indoors remains in force, while wearing masks in health facilities is mandatory.

**Entry in Bosnia and Herzegovina** - Citizens of the Republic of Lebanon are required visas when entering, exiting or travelling through Bosnia and Herzegovina. Visa shall be issued in Amman, Jordan. (**Embassy of the BiH in the Hashemite Kingdom of JORDAN (SWEIFIEH, Said al-Mufti Street No.67, PO Box 850836. Amman 11185).**

All visa applications must be submitted in person. The Embassy do not accept applications sent through email.

**IMPORTANT:** Applications should be made **at least 10-30 days before your intended departure date.** Bosnia & Herzegovina's fees cover only a part of the work necessary to process your application. Because processing fees are only for

handling your application, you will not get your money back, even if your application is refused. The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150,00 (ore equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) for each day of intended stay.

Bosnia and Herzegovina Short-term Visa fee is **31 EUR for single-entry and 57 EUR for a multiple-entry visa** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a Bosnia and Herzegovina Short-term visa in Bosnia and Herzegovina visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of the BiH in the Hashemite Kingdom of JORDAN (SWEIFIEH, Said al-Mufti str. No.67, P.O. Box 850836. Amman 11185).**

Short-term visa's validity period can be a maximum of **90 days**.

**Listed below are the documents required when applying for a visa to Bosnia and Herzegovina:**

1. A valid passport of the applicant
2. Application form (completed and signed)
3. Copy of a valid residence visa
4. Copy of a round trip ticket or itinerary
5. One passport size picture
6. Travel insurance
7. No objection letter from your company or your sponsor

**In addition to the above, the following items must be presented:**

**If I travel as a tourist** : Voucher of the travel agency stating that the trip has been paid in full

Copy of your bank statement for the last 3 months

**If visiting friends and/or relatives**: Letter of invitation from the person(s) the applicant intends to visit, certified by the Ministry of Security of Bosnia and Herzegovina – Department for Foreign Citizens.

**If traveling on business:** Letter from the employer stating the purpose of the trip to Bosnia and Herzegovina

Letter of invitation from a company in Bosnia and Herzegovina, certified by the Ministry of Security of Bosnia and Herzegovina – Department for Foreign Citizens.

**Children under the age of 18:** For children under the age of 18 a birth certificate is required.

Nationals of the following states may enter into Bosnia and Herzegovina with a passport or a valid identity card proving identity and citizenship of:

- Member State of the European Union
- State signatory to the Schengen Agreement
- Andorra, Montenegro, Liechtenstein, Monaco, San Marino, Serbia, the Holy See and Swiss Confederation.

The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150.00 (or equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) - for each day of the intended stay.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** The Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina has adopted a Decision on declaring a natural or other disaster on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina ('Official Gazette of BiH', 18/20), due to the danger of an epidemic of infectious disease caused by new coronavirus (COVID-19), in order to reduce the risk of accelerated spread of infection in Bosnia and Herzegovina and enable the engagement of additional resources to respond to this public health threat.

In order to prevent and suppress the spread of the SARS-COV-2 virus, the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina also adopted a **DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA**, as well as **DECISION ON AMENDMENT OF THE DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA** ('Official Gazette of BiH', 36/21').

**(Article 2) A foreigner who meets conditions for entry to BiH prescribed by Law on Aliens, may enter BiH if he/she at the BiH Border Crossing Points presents any of the following:**

- negative PCR test or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, not older than 48 hours if he/she comes from a European country, and if he/she comes from another country, not older than 72 hours until arrival at the border crossing point of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- certificate that a person has received the second dose of vaccine for COVID-19 before more than 14 days before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH or has received one dose before 14 days and more before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH, if it is a single dose vaccine,
- certificate issued by doctor showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19 in the previous period from 14 to 180 days until the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH.

▪ **(Article 3) Exemptions from Article 2 of the Decision, foreigners who may enter Bosnia and Herzegovina without presenting a negative test result or certificates are:**

- citizens of Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and the Republic of Serbia, when they enter Bosnia and Herzegovina directly from the country of which they are citizens, as well as their minor children and spouses who are citizens of other countries,
- the crew and cabin crew of the aircraft whose final destination is Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- drivers and co-drivers of freight vehicles when performing international transport of goods by road, provided that their stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina does not last longer than 12 hours,
- crews of freight trains and ships in international traffic,
- diplomatic and consular staff and staff of international organizations in the performance of their official duties, who must have and present an appropriate valid passport upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina,

- civil protection services and teams when their entry into Bosnia and Herzegovina is urgent and cannot be postponed,
- members of the military forces of the member states of the North Atlantic Treaty and other states participating in the Partnership for Peace and members of the NATO and EUFOR Headquarters in Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- heads of states and governments and members of their delegations whose arrival and departure from Bosnia and Herzegovina have been announced to Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina, through diplomatic channels or through protocols of the competent authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- foreigners transiting through the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the purpose of returning to the country of usual residence, without staying in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- a minor foreigner whose parent is a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as a foreigner who is the spouse of a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- children under the age of seven travelling with parents or guardians, if their parents or guardians possess negative PCR or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, or certificate on vaccination or certificate showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19,
- foreigners authorized to stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina temporarily or permanently, if they are returning to Bosnia and Herzegovina after exit and stay only in Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and/or the Republic of Serbia, provided that total duration of their stay in the above countries has not been longer than 48 hours since they left the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina, which could be proved by exiting stamp, i.e. entering stamp in a travel document of the foreigner,
- foreigners – citizens of the Republic of Turkey crossing the state border of Bosnia and Herzegovina daily due to construction of the bridge Rača in the framework of realization of the Project

motorway/expressway Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo. Ministry of Communication and Transport of BiH shall submit to the BiH Border Police a certified list of nationals of the Republic of Turkey Border Police hired as workers for construction of the Rača Bridge within the above mentioned Project, including their names, surnames and number of travel document they use for crossing of the BiH border; as well as certificate that the Project is implemented according to signed Agreement on Cooperation regarding realization of the Project motorway/expressway road Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo (“Official Gazette BiH – International Agreements”, no. 13/20).

***Ukrainian citizens who left Ukraine due to the security situation***

By the Decision on prescribing additional conditions for the entry of foreigners into BiH, it is not prescribed what kind/type of PCR or antigen tests, i.e. form of tests or certificates is required to present at the border crossing points during intended entry to BiH, and it is possible to present them in printed or electronic form.

**Remarks:** Currently, when entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, no quarantine or self-isolation measures are prescribed, while upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, all persons are obliged to follow the instructions and respect all orders of the competent epidemiological and health authorities (social distance, protective masks, hand disinfection, etc.).

North Macedonia **no longer than six months and at least 15 days before the start of the intended trip.** The visa application is submitted in person. Upon exception, the visa application may be submitted by another natural or legal person authorized to act as the proxy of the applicant when the foreigner is a disabled person or when the foreigner is a well-known person and there is no doubt about his/her bona fide intentions. The application for a minor is submitted in person by a parent or a guardian. **It takes 3 to 10 working days for a North Macedonia visa to be issued.** In extreme cases, the application process can take up to a month. North Macedonia Short-term Visa fee is **60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a North Macedonia Short-term Visa in North Macedonia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case, **The Embassy of North Macedonia in Cairo, Egypt.**

**The applicant encloses the following documentation with the visa application:**

- Valid travel document (the validity period of the travel document should exceed that of the visa by at least three months), the travel document must have been issued within the last 10 years and it must include at least two empty pages for visa purposes and one photograph size 35x45 mm
- Proof of valid travel medical insurance
- Proof of fees paid
- Documents that prove: the purpose of the visit to RNM, secured accommodation, means of subsistence to cover the stay in RNM and the repatriation or the travel to a third country, means of transport and the intention to return to the country of origin or the intention to travel to a third country.
  
- Nationals of EU Member States and signatories of the Schengen Agreement DO NOT need a visa to enter the Republic of North Macedonia (and are eligible to enter the Republic of North Macedonia with a valid national identity card).
- Third-country nationals with temporary residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North

- Third-country nationals with permanent residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with multiple-entry Schengen visa (type C) valid for at least 5 (five) days beyond the intended stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.

The Republic of North Macedonia has abolished short-term stay (Type C) visas for foreign nationals who are holders of valid passports of third countries and are simultaneously holders of valid UK, US, and Canadian visas, whereby the duration of their stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may not exceed 15 days, with the periods of validity of the valid UK, US, and Canadian visas they hold not exceeding more than 5 days from their planned stay in the Republic of North Macedonia. This decision is of a temporary character and shall be in force from 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2022.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** Visitors entering North Macedonia will no longer be required to present a vaccination certificate or a negative COVID-19 test.

A short-stay visa (C type) is an authorization issued to a third-country national for entry and temporary stay (up to 90 days). An application for a C type visa should be

submitted with the Schengen country that is the main destination. On behalf of Slovenia, this type of visa can also be issued by another Schengen country if the two countries have concluded a representation agreement. A C type visa may be extended in exceptional cases where the circumstances prevent the visa holder from returning to the country of origin.

**IMPORTANT:** A visa application must be submitted **at least 15 calendar days and no more than six months** before the intended visit. A visa application submitted **less than 15 calendar days** before may be accepted but the processing may take up to 15 calendar days. When applying for a Schengen visa, each person must pay a visa fee. This fee is non-refundable regardless of the visa result. The Schengen visa fee for citizens of Azerbaijan, Russia, and Armenia is currently **35 EUR**. These three countries benefit from reduced visa costs under an agreement with the Schengen countries. In other countries, this amount is **80 EUR** for people over 12 years old, **40 EUR** for children 6-12 years old, and free for children under six years old.

You will apply for Slovenia Tourism/Private Visit Visa in Slovenia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Hungarian Embassy in Lebanon (Beirut, Sanayeh, Justinien street, BAC center, 9th floor, Lebanon P.O. Box 90618)**.

**Third-country nationals** - A national of a third country who wishes to enter and reside in the Republic of Slovenia for tourist, business, personal, or other purposes should obtain a visa prior to their entry into the country, unless they are citizens of countries that do not require a visa, or already hold one of the permits described below:

**Holders of a short-stay visa (C type)** issued by a Schengen country may, during the visa validity period, enter the Republic of Slovenia and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a long-stay visa (D type)** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this visa and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the long-stay visa, does not exceed

90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the long-stay visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a residence permit** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this residence permit and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the residence permit, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the residence permit, whichever is sooner.

### **Short-stay Visa (C type) application requirements:**

**All requested documents have to be submitted and translated into English or Slovenian.**

#### **General requirements**

- ***Valid passport or travel document.*** Must be valid for minimum 3 months after the journey and issued within the previous 10 years and have at least 2 blank pages. A copy of passport or travel document.
- ***Application form*** duly completed, dated and signed by the applicant.
- ***One (1) recent photograph.***
- ***Travel medical insurance*** covering the entire duration of the trip valid in the whole Schengen area. The minimum coverage of 30.000 euros, covering: emergency medical expenses, hospital treatment, repatriation for medical reasons, or repatriation of remains. Multi-entry visa applicants must have insurance for the duration of the first trip.
- ***Copy of flight ticket or flight reservation including return flight.***
- ***Verifiable evidence of sufficient*** means of subsistence during intended stay: payslips for the last 3 months, valid international credit card accompanied by bank statements, bank account statements for the last three (3) months or a national form for proof of sponsorship and/or accommodation.
- ***Proof of accommodation:*** hotel reservation, proof of rental or ownership of real estate in the member state of destination, confirmation of private accommodation, mentioning that the host will cover the accommodation costs, confirmation of accommodation by the company inviting the applicant, mentioning that the company will cover the accommodation costs.
- ***Minors traveling without their parents/legal guardian:*** Original authorisation signed by their parents/legal guardian in front of a visa officer or duly legalised and copy of the passport(s) of parents/legal guardian.
- ***Residence permit*** valid three months beyond the intended date of departure

from the territory of the Member States or, for GCC citizens, a UAE ID-card, valid for three months after the intended departure date from the territory of the Member States.

- **Employees:** original letter from employer stating the applicant's employment status, position, length of the contract and salary, self-employed persons: valid original trade license, documents to be submitted relating to the purpose of the journey

**I. Business trip- Invitation from the inviting company (Letter of Guarantee) or an authority to attend a meeting, conference or event** (The invitation must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter of guarantee with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.) and other documents for work purpose (e.g. confirmed registration for trade fairs or congresses).

**II. Official delegation/mission-** Letter issued by the authority (-ies) concerned confirming identity of the applicant(s), purpose of the journey (meeting, consultation, negotiations or events held by intergovernmental organizations), period of intended stay and accommodation details.

**III. Tourism-** Full travel itinerary.

**IV. Private visit** - Invitation letter signed (Letter of Guarantee) by the host covering the period of the intended stay (The Invitation Letter must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.).

**V. Medical treatment** - A document issued by the medical institution in the Member State of destination confirming that the applicant will receive medical care in that institution; Pre-payment or other proof of sufficient financial means to cover the medical treatment and related expenses, such as insurance coverage.

**VI. Study or training** - A certificate of enrollment at an educational establishment for the purpose of attending vocational or theoretical courses within the framework of basic and further training.; Student cards or certificates of the courses to be attended.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**long-stay visa (D) for stays exceeding three months, issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;**

**residence permit issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;**

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Bulgaria, listed in Annex I of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Cyprus, listed in Annex III of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Romania, listed in Annex IV of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

**do not require a visa for transit or intended stays in the territory of Croatia not exceeding 90 days in any 180-day period.**

**Short-term visa (visa C)** - approval for transit through or intended stay in the territory of Croatia for a duration of no more than 90 days in any 180-day period;

Montenegro has not the embassy of India, so the nearest embassy where the citizens of India can apply for visa is in Serbia. **IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Montenegro Short-stay visa is **3-10 working days**. Montenegro Short-stay visa is 35 EUR. The fee may vary depending on your nationality or your country of submission. You will apply for a Montenegro Short-stay visa in Montenegro visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case- **Embassy of New Delhi, the Republic of India (3/50 G. Niti Marg Chanakyapuri, 110021 New Delhi)**

### **In addition to the visa application, the foreigner shall submit:**

- valid travel document (the period of validity of the travel document should exceed that of the visas by three months);
- one color photo 35x45 mm;
- proof of the purpose of stay in Montenegro (letter of guarantee by a physical person or letter of invitation by a legal entity, state authority in Montenegro or organizer of an international conference or event);

- proof of ensured accommodation (receipt from a tourist arrangement, hotel or other type of accommodation reservation that has been paid in);
- proof of possession of means for sustenance during his stay in Montenegro, as well as for return into the country where he comes from or for travel into a third state (cash, a bank account, traveler's checks, credit cards etc.);
- proof of the means of travel and intention to return into the state where a foreigner comes from or into a third state (a return airplane or other transportation ticket, a driving license);
- proof of health insurance;
- proof that the consular fee has been charged,

as well as other corresponding documents based on which the purpose and ensured accommodation in Montenegro can be determined

You can enter Montenegro with your Schengen visa, provided the visa still has valid entries left as well as remaining days of stay. This also applies to holders of residence permits for a Schengen country.

Montenegro Short-stay visa (C) may be issued for one, two, or multiple entries into Montenegro for tourist, business, personal or other purposes. Continuous stay or the total duration of consecutive visits may not exceed 90 days in a period of 6 months, counting from the date of first entry. The validity period of Visa C for multiple entries is up to one year. Exceptionally this type of visa may be issued for a more extended period of validity, but no longer than five years. A short-stay visa may be given to a group of foreigners (collective visa). The validity period of a collective visa cannot exceed 30 days, and it may be affixed to a group passport.

Montenegro is not included in the Schengen Agreement. Therefore, Montenegro visas are valid only for its territory. You can't travel to Schengen countries with a Montenegro visa.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

According to the Decision (2017), citizens of the Republic of India may enter and reside in the Republic of Serbia, or transit, within a period of up to 30 days from the date of entry, within one year, if there are no obstacles defined in Article 11 of the Law on Aliens. ( **For holders of ordinary passports and other travel documents**). **For holders of diplomatic and official passports:** No visas required for visits of up to 90 days.

On October 30, 2014, the Government of the Republic of Serbia adopted the Decision on visa free entry to the Republic of Serbia for holders of foreign national passports having a valid Schengen, UK and other Member States' visa, or visa of the United States of America, and for holders of foreign national passports having

residence permit in the countries of the Schengen area, EU or the United States of America.

On basis of this decision, the above-mentioned categories of foreign nationals may, without prior visa application, enter, transit and stay in the Republic of Serbia up to 90 days during a six-month period, and within validity of said visas or residence permits. There is a possibility for foreign nationals to enter the Republic of Serbia with two passports e.g. expired national passport with valid visa or residence permit and valid national passport without valid visa or residence permit. Foreign nationals, holders of a residence permit in the form of a separate card (not a sticker affixed to their passport), must present their valid passport upon entering the territory of the Republic of Serbia.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** There are no restrictions on entering the Republic of Serbia. The recommendation to wear masks indoors remains in force, while wearing masks in health facilities is mandatory.

**Children under the age of 18**: For children under the age of 18 a birth certificate is required.

Nationals of the following states may enter into Bosnia and Herzegovina with a passport or a valid identity card proving identity and citizenship of:

- Member State of the European Union
- State signatory to the Schengen Agreement
- Andorra, Montenegro, Liechtenstein, Monaco, San Marino, Serbia, the Holy See and Swiss Confederation.

The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150.00 (or equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) - for each day of the intended stay.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions**: The Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina has adopted a Decision on declaring a natural or other disaster on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina ('Official Gazette of BiH', 18/20), due to the danger of an epidemic of infectious disease caused by new coronavirus (COVID-19), in order to reduce the risk of accelerated spread of infection in Bosnia and Herzegovina and enable the engagement of additional resources to respond to this public health threat.

In order to prevent and suppress the spread of the SARS-COV-2 virus, the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina also adopted a **DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA**, as well as **DECISION ON AMENDMENT OF THE DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA** ('Official Gazette of BiH', 36/21').

**(Article 2) A foreigner who meets conditions for entry to BiH prescribed by Law on Aliens, may enter BiH if he/she at the BiH Border Crossing Points presents any of the following:**

- negative PCR test or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, not older than 48 hours if he/she comes from a European country, and if he/she comes from another country, not older than 72 hours until arrival at the border crossing point of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- certificate that a person has received the second dose of vaccine for COVID-19 before more than 14 days before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH or has received one dose before 14 days and more before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH, if it is a single dose vaccine,
- certificate issued by doctor showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19 in the previous period from 14 to 180 days until the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH.

**(Article 3) Exemptions from Article 2 of the Decision, foreigners who may enter Bosnia and Herzegovina without presenting a negative test result or certificates are:**

- citizens of Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and the Republic of Serbia, when they enter Bosnia and Herzegovina directly from the country of which they are citizens, as well as their minor children and spouses who are citizens of other countries,
- the crew and cabin crew of the aircraft whose final destination is Bosnia and Herzegovina,

- drivers and co-drivers of freight vehicles when performing international transport of goods by road, provided that their stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina does not last longer than 12 hours,
- crews of freight trains and ships in international traffic,
- diplomatic and consular staff and staff of international organizations in the performance of their official duties, who must have and present an appropriate valid passport upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- civil protection services and teams when their entry into Bosnia and Herzegovina is urgent and cannot be postponed,
- members of the military forces of the member states of the North Atlantic Treaty and other states participating in the Partnership for Peace and members of the NATO and EUFOR Headquarters in Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- heads of states and governments and members of their delegations whose arrival and departure from Bosnia and Herzegovina have been announced to Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina, through diplomatic channels or through protocols of the competent authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- foreigners transiting through the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the purpose of returning to the country of usual residence, without staying in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- a minor foreigner whose parent is a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as a foreigner who is the spouse of a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- children under the age of seven travelling with parents or guardians, if their parents or guardians possess negative PCR or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, or certificate on vaccination or certificate showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19,
- foreigners authorized to stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina temporarily or permanently, if they are returning to Bosnia and Herzegovina after exit

and stay only in Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and/or the Republic of Serbia, provided that total duration of their stay in the above countries has not been longer than 48 hours since they left the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina, which could be proved by exiting stamp, i.e. entering stamp in a travel document of the foreigner,

- foreigners – citizens of the Republic of Turkey crossing the state border of Bosnia and Herzegovina daily due to construction of the bridge Rača in the framework of realization of the Project motorway/expressway Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo. Ministry of Communication and Transport of BiH shall submit to the BiH Border Police a certified list of nationals of the Republic of Turkey Border Police hired as workers for construction of the Rača Bridge within the above mentioned Project, including their names, surnames and number of travel document they use for crossing of the BiH border; as well as certificate that the Project is implemented according to signed Agreement on Cooperation regarding realization of the Project motorway/expressway road Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo (“Official Gazette BiH – International Agreements”, no. 13/20).

### ***Ukrainian citizens who left Ukraine due to the security situation***

By the Decision on prescribing additional conditions for the entry of foreigners into BiH, it is not prescribed what kind/type of PCR or antigen tests, i.e. form of tests or certificates is required to present at the border crossing points during intended entry to BiH, and it is possible to present them in printed or electronic form.

**Remarks:** Currently, when entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, no quarantine or self-isolation measures are prescribed, while upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, all persons are obliged to follow the instructions and respect all orders of the competent epidemiological and health authorities (social distance, protective masks, hand disinfection, etc.).

## **Entry in Albania-**

**Albania applies visa-free travel. Foreign citizens from Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, India, Qatar, Oman, and Thailand, can enter Albania without a visa, for a short-term stay, with a passport document, from 20 April until 31 December.**

**Foreign citizens from Egypt and Russia can enter Albania without a visa, for a short-term stay, with a passport document, from 01 May until 30 September.**

**Beyond those dates, they are required to obtain a visa. They can apply for visa in Honorary Consulate of Albania in New Delhi, India (*S-99 Panchsheel Park New Delhi 110016*).**

**IMPORTANT:** For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is **90 days within a period of 180 days** and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

Albania Short-term visa's validity period can be a maximum of **90 days**.

Kindly note that the visa applications will take a minimum of 5 working days starting from the date of confirmation of the visa fee payment and can take up to 15 working days. Albania Short-term Visa fee is **35-60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for an Albania Short-term Visa in Albania visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location.

**For tourism:** Confirmation of the accommodation (hotel confirmation, apartment rental contract, etc.), Round-trip ticket reservation

**For business/congress/sports travel:** Original invitation letter by the company/organization, Confirmation of the accommodation (hotel confirmation, apartment rental contract, etc.), Verbal Note from the institution where the foreigner is employed.

All foreigners who have a valid multi – entry Schengen visa, type “C” or “D”, or a valid residence permit in one of the Schengen member states, can enter, stay and transit Albania without visa, within the validity term of the visa or the residence permit. The same applies for all holders of Laissez-Passer issued by United Nations Organizations, and its branch, NATO, Council of Europe and European Union, regardless of nationality. For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

Holders of a valid type “C” multiple-entry Schengen visa (which has been previously used in one of the countries in Schengen area) or a Residence Permit to the Schengen Area, also holders of a valid UK, Canada and US visa (which has been previously used for entering that country) may enter to Albania without a visa for up to 15 days.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

Entry visa for North Macedonia **REQUIRED**.

North Macedonia Short-term visa's validity period can be a maximum of 90 days.

**IMPORTANT:** The foreigner submits a visa application to the competent (resident or non-resident) diplomatic-consular representation of the Republic of North Macedonia **no longer than six months and at least 15 days before the start of the intended trip**. The visa application is submitted in person. Upon exception, the visa application may be submitted by another natural or legal person authorized to act as the proxy of the applicant when the foreigner is a disabled person or when the foreigner is a well-known person and there is no doubt about his/her bona fide intentions. The application for a minor is submitted in person by a parent or a guardian. **It takes 3 to 10 working days for a North Macedonia visa to be issued.** In extreme cases, the application process can take up to a month. North Macedonia Short-term Visa fee is **60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a North Macedonia Short-term Visa in North Macedonia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case, **The Embassy of North Macedonia in New Delhi, India (A-15/30 Block A, Ground Floor New Delhi)**.

**The applicant encloses the following documentation with the visa application:**

- Valid travel document (the validity period of the travel document should exceed that of the visa by at least three months), the travel document must have been issued within the last 10 years and it must include at least two empty pages for visa purposes and one photograph size 35x45 mm

- Proof of valid travel medical insurance
- Proof of fees paid
- Documents that prove: the purpose of the visit to RNM, secured accommodation, means of subsistence to cover the stay in RNM and the repatriation or the travel to a third country, means of transport and the intention to return to the country of origin or the intention to travel to a third country.
- Nationals of EU Member States and signatories of the Schengen Agreement DO NOT need a visa to enter the Republic of North Macedonia (and are eligible to enter the Republic of North Macedonia with a valid national identity card).
- Third-country nationals with temporary residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with permanent residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with multiple-entry Schengen visa (type C) valid for at least 5 (five) days beyond the intended stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.

The Republic of North Macedonia has abolished short-term stay (Type C) visas for foreign nationals who are holders of valid passports of third countries and are simultaneously holders of valid UK, US, and Canadian visas, whereby the duration of their stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may not exceed 15 days, with the periods of validity of the valid UK, US, and Canadian visas they hold not exceeding more than 5 days from their planned stay in the Republic of North Macedonia. This decision is of a temporary character and shall be in force from 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2022.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** Visitors entering North Macedonia will no longer be required to present a vaccination certificate or a negative COVID-19 test.

Visa applicants can, in addition, apply for visa at the Consulate General of the Republic of Portugal in Goa. ( <https://portaldascomunidades.mne.gov.pt/pt/rede-consular/asia/india#consulado-geral-de-portugal-em-goia> )

A short-stay visa (C type) is an authorization issued to a third-country national for entry and temporary stay (up to 90 days). An application for a C type visa should be submitted with the Schengen country that is the main destination. On behalf of Slovenia, this type of visa can also be issued by another Schengen country if the two countries have concluded a representation agreement. A C type visa may be extended in exceptional cases where the circumstances prevent the visa holder from returning to the country of origin.

**IMPORTANT:** A visa application must be submitted **at least 15 calendar days and no more than six months** before the intended visit. A visa application submitted **less than 15 calendar days** before may be accepted but the processing may take up to 15 calendar days. When applying for a Schengen visa, each person must pay a visa fee. This fee is non-refundable regardless of the visa result. The Schengen visa fee for citizens of Azerbaijan, Russia, and Armenia is currently **35 EUR**. These three countries benefit from reduced visa costs under an agreement with the Schengen countries. In other countries, this amount is **80 EUR** for people over

12 years old, **40 EUR** for children 6-12 years old, and free for children under six years old.

You will apply for Slovenia Tourism/Private Visit Visa in Slovenia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of the Republic of Slovenia in Cairo.**

**Third-country nationals** - A national of a third country who wishes to enter and reside in the Republic of Slovenia for tourist, business, personal, or other purposes should obtain a visa prior to their entry into the country, unless they are citizens of countries that do not require a visa, or already hold one of the permits described below:

**Holders of a short-stay visa (C type)** issued by a Schengen country may, during the visa validity period, enter the Republic of Slovenia and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a long-stay visa (D type)** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this visa and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the long-stay visa, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the long-stay visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a residence permit** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this residence permit and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the residence permit, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the residence permit, whichever is sooner.

#### **Short-stay Visa (C type) application requirements:**

**All requested documents have to be submitted and translated into English or Slovenian.**

#### **General requirements**

- ***Valid passport or travel document.*** Must be valid for minimum 3 months after

the journey and issued within the previous 10 years and have at least 2 blank pages. A copy of passport or travel document.

- ***Application form*** duly completed, dated and signed by the applicant.
- ***One (1) recent photograph.***
- ***Travel medical insurance*** covering the entire duration of the trip valid in the whole Schengen area. The minimum coverage of 30.000 euros, covering: emergency medical expenses, hospital treatment, repatriation for medical reasons, or repatriation of remains. Multi-entry visa applicants must have insurance for the duration of the first trip.
- ***Copy of flight ticket or flight reservation including return flight.***
- ***Verifiable evidence of sufficient*** means of subsistence during intended stay: payslips for the last 3 months, valid international credit card accompanied by bank statements, bank account statements for the last three (3) months or a national form for proof of sponsorship and/or accommodation.
- ***Proof of accommodation:*** hotel reservation, proof of rental or ownership of real estate in the member state of destination, confirmation of private accommodation, mentioning that the host will cover the accommodation costs, confirmation of accommodation by the company inviting the applicant, mentioning that the company will cover the accommodation costs.
- ***Minors traveling without their parents/legal guardian:*** Original authorisation signed by their parents/legal guardian in front of a visa officer or dully legalised and copy of the passport(s) of parents/legal guardian.
- ***Residence permit*** valid three months beyond the intended date of departure from the territory of the Member States or, for GCC citizens, a UAE ID-card, valid for three months after the intended departure date from the territory of the Member States.
- ***Employees:*** original letter from employer stating the applicant's employment status, position, length of the contract and salary, self-employed persons: valid original trade license, documents to be submitted relating to the purpose of the journey.

**I. Business trip- *Invitation from the inviting company (Letter of Guarantee) or an authority to attend a meeting, conference or event*** (The invitation must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter of guarantee with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.) and other documents for work purpose (e.g. confirmed registration for trade fairs or congresses).

**II. Official delegation/mission-** Letter issued by the authority (-ies) concerned confirming identity of the applicant(s), purpose of the journey (meeting,

consultation, negotiations or events held by intergovernmental organizations), period of intended stay and accommodation details.

**III. Tourism-** Full travel itinerary.

**IV. Private visit** - Invitation letter signed (Letter of Guarantee) by the host covering the period of the intended stay (The Invitation Letter must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.).

**V. Medical treatment** - A document issued by the medical institution in the Member State of destination confirming that the applicant will receive medical care in that institution; Pre-payment or other proof of sufficient financial means to cover the medical treatment and related expenses, such as insurance coverage.

**VI. Study or training** - A certificate of enrollment at an educational establishment for the purpose of attending vocational or theoretical courses within the framework of basic and further training.; Student cards or certificates of the courses to be attended.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**Short-term visa (visa C)** - approval for transit through or intended stay in the territory of Croatia for a duration of no more than 90 days in any 180-day period;

**IMPORTANT:** A visa application must be submitted **at least 15 calendar days and no more than six months** before the intended visit. Croatia Tourist visa fee is **60 EUR**, to be paid upon submission of the application. Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. The fee may vary depending on your nationality or your country of submission. You will apply for a Croatia Tourist visa in Croatia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **DM/CO Republic of Croatia in New Delhi (A-15 West End New Delhi 110021)**.

**Each visa applicant shall enclose following documents with the application:**

- valid travel document

the validity period of the travel document should exceed that of the visa by three months

travel document must be issued in the previous 10 years

travel document must contain at least two empty pages for the visa

- a 35x45 mm colour photo
- evidence of travel health insurance
- evidence of paid visa fee
- documents that prove:
  - the purpose of the stay in Croatia
  - ensured accommodation
  - means of subsistence to cover the stay in Croatia and the return to the country of origin or to a third country
  - means of transport and the intention to return to the applicant's country of origin or to a third country.

Pursuant to the Government's Decision, starting with 22 July 2014, the Republic of Croatia applies the Decision No 565/2014/EU. **All third-country nationals who are holders of valid Schengen documents, as well as national visas and residence permits of Bulgaria, Cyprus, and Romania do not require an additional (Croatian) visa for Croatia.**

Third-country nationals who are holders of:

**uniform visa (C) for two or multiple entries, valid for all Schengen Area Member States;**

**visa with limited territorial validity (LTV visa), for two or multiple entries, issued to the holder of a travel document that is not recognized by one or more, but not all of the Schengen Area Member States, and which is valid for the territory of the Member States recognizing the travel document;**

**long-stay visa (D) for stays exceeding three months, issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;**

**residence permit issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;**

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Bulgaria, listed in Annex I of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Cyprus, listed in Annex III of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Romania, listed in Annex IV of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

**do not require a visa for transit or intended stays in the territory of Croatia not exceeding 90 days in any 180-day period.**

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

# FOR CITIZENS OF THE SYRIA

## Entry in Montenegro –

Nationals of Syria are required to obtain a visa to enter Montenegro. Visas may be obtained from diplomatic and consular posts of Montenegro. If you are unable to reach a diplomatic or consular post of Montenegro, you may apply for a visa at the nearest diplomatic or consular post of the Republic of Serbia.

**IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Montenegro Short-stay visa is **3-10 working days**. Montenegro Short-stay visa is 35 EUR. The fee may vary depending on your nationality or your country of submission. You will apply for a Montenegro Short-stay visa in Montenegro visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case- **Embassy of the Republic of Serbia in Damascus, the Syrian Arab Republic (Abou Romane 18. Al-Jalaa street).**

You can enter Montenegro with your Schengen visa, provided the visa still has valid entries left as well as remaining days of stay. This also applies to holders of residence permits for a Schengen country.

Montenegro Short-stay visa (C) may be issued for one, two, or multiple entries into Montenegro for tourist, business, personal or other purposes. Continuous stay or the total duration of consecutive visits may not exceed 90 days in a period of 6 months, counting from the date of first entry. The validity period of Visa C for multiple entries is up to one year. Exceptionally this type of visa may be issued for a more extended period of validity, but no longer than five years. A short-stay visa may be given to a group of foreigners (collective visa). The validity period of a collective visa cannot exceed 30 days, and it may be affixed to a group passport.

Montenegro is not included in the Schengen Agreement. Therefore, Montenegro visas are valid only for its territory. You can't travel to Schengen countries with a Montenegro visa.

For a foreigner who is minor, i.e. legally incapable, visa application shall be filed by a parent or his legal representative.

**In addition to the visa application, the foreigner shall submit:**

- valid travel document (the period of validity of the travel document should exceed that of the visas by three months);
- one color photo 35x45 mm;
- proof of the purpose of stay in Montenegro (letter of guarantee by a physical person or letter of invitation by a legal entity, state authority in Montenegro or organizer of an international conference or event);
- proof of ensured accommodation (receipt from a tourist arrangement, hotel or other type of accommodation reservation that has been paid in);
- proof of possession of means for sustenance during his stay in Montenegro, as well as for return into the country where he comes from or for travel into a third state (cash, a bank account, traveler's checks, credit cards etc.);
- proof of the means of travel and intention to return into the state where a foreigner comes from or into a third state (a return airplane or other transportation ticket, a driving license);
- proof of health insurance;
- proof that the consular fee has been charged,
- as well as other corresponding documents based on which the purpose and ensured accommodation in Montenegro can be determined

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**For holders of ordinary passports and other travel documents:** Visas required

The Serbia Tourist visa permits you to stay in Serbia and realize your tourist activities for a maximum period of 90 days at most per 180 days.

**IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Serbia Tourist visa is **3-10 calendar days**. It depends on your visa application country. Serbia Tourist visa fee is **80 EUR**. Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a Serbia Tourist visa in Serbia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of the Republic of Serbia in Damascus (Abou Roumaneh Al-Jalla str. 18)**.

**General visa requirements:**

- Valid passport (passport must be valid at least 90 days from issue date of visa)
- Letter of invitation:
  - for a private visit – invitation letter certified by the relevant authority of the Republic of Serbia
  - for a business visit – invitation letter by a company in Serbia;
  - for a tourist trip – a proof of payment for the trip issued by a travel agency (voucher or other type of payment receipt);
- Completed visa application form: (PDF) ;
- Photo (size 3.5x4.5cm);
- Return ticket or Itinerary (copy of Driving License and Insurance if you travel by car);
- Proof of sufficient funds for staying in Serbia;
- Health insurance
- Visa fee.

On October 30, 2014, the Government of the Republic of Serbia adopted the Decision on visa free entry to the Republic of Serbia for holders of foreign national passports having a valid Schengen, UK and other Member States' visa, or visa of the United States of America, and for holders of foreign national passports having residence permit in the countries of the Schengen area, EU or the United States of America.

On basis of this decision, the above-mentioned categories of foreign nationals may, without prior visa application, enter, transit and stay in the Republic of Serbia up to

90 days during a six-month period, and within validity of said visas or residence permits. There is a possibility for foreign nationals to enter the Republic of Serbia with two passports e.g. expired national passport with valid visa or residence permit and valid national passport without valid visa or residence permit. Foreign nationals, holders of a residence permit in the form of a separate card (not a sticker affixed to their passport), must present their valid passport upon entering the territory of the Republic of Serbia.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** There are no restrictions on entering the Republic of Serbia. The recommendation to wear masks indoors remains in force, while wearing masks in health facilities is mandatory.

**Citizens of the Syrian Arab Republic are required visas** when entering, exiting or travelling through Bosnia and Herzegovina. **Visa shall be issued** in Amman,

Jordan. All visa applications must be submitted in person. The Embassy do not accept applications sent through email.

Short-term visa's validity period can be a maximum of **90 days**.

**IMPORTANT:** Applications should be made **at least 10-30 days before your intended departure date**. Bosnia & Herzegovina's fees cover only a part of the work necessary to process your application. Because processing fees are only for handling your application, you will not get your money back, even if your application is refused. Bosnia and Herzegovina Short-term Visa fee is **31 EUR for single-entry and 57 EUR for a multiple-entry visa** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a Bosnia and Herzegovina Short-term visa in Bosnia and Herzegovina visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of the BiH in the Hashemite Kingdom of JORDAN (SWEIFIEH, Said al-Mufti Str. No.67, P.O. Box 850836, Amman 11185)**.

**Listed below are the documents required when applying for a visa to Bosnia and Herzegovina:**

1. A valid passport of the applicant
2. Application form (completed and signed)
3. Copy of a valid residence visa
4. Copy of a round trip ticket or itinerary
5. One passport size picture
6. Travel insurance
7. No objection letter from your company or your sponsor

**In addition to the above, the following items must be presented:**

**If travel as a tourist** : Voucher of the travel agency stating that the trip has been paid in full

Copy of your bank statement for the last 3 months

**If visiting friends and/or relatives:** Letter of invitation from the person(s) the applicant intends to visit, certified by the Ministry of Security of Bosnia and Herzegovina – Department for Foreign Citizens.

**If traveling on business:** Letter from the employer stating the purpose of the trip to Bosnia and Herzegovina

Letter of invitation from a company in Bosnia and Herzegovina, certified by the Ministry of Security of Bosnia and Herzegovina – Department for Foreign Citizens.

**Children under the age of 18:** For children under the age of 18 a birth certificate is required.

Nationals of the following states may enter into Bosnia and Herzegovina with a passport or a valid identity card proving identity and citizenship of:

- Member State of the European Union
- State signatory to the Schengen Agreement
- Andorra, Montenegro, Liechtenstein, Monaco, San Marino, Serbia, the Holy See and Swiss Confederation.

The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150.00 (or equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) - for each day of the intended stay.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** The Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina has adopted a Decision on declaring a natural or other disaster on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina ('Official Gazette of BiH', 18/20), due to the danger of an epidemic of infectious disease caused by new coronavirus (COVID-19), in order to reduce the risk of accelerated spread of infection in Bosnia and Herzegovina and enable the engagement of additional resources to respond to this public health threat.

In order to prevent and suppress the spread of the SARS-COV-2 virus, the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina also adopted a **DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA**, as well as **DECISION ON AMENDMENT OF THE DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL**

**CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA** ('Official Gazette of BiH', 36/21').

**(Article 2) A foreigner who meets conditions for entry to BiH prescribed by Law on Aliens, may enter BiH if he/she at the BiH Border Crossing Points presents any of the following:**

- negative PCR test or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, not older than 48 hours if he/she comes from a European country, and if he/she comes from another country, not older than 72 hours until arrival at the border crossing point of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- certificate that a person has received the second dose of vaccine for COVID-19 before more than 14 days before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH or has received one dose before 14 days and more before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH, if it is a single dose vaccine,
- certificate issued by doctor showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19 in the previous period from 14 to 180 days until the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH.

**(Article 3) Exemptions from Article 2 of the Decision, foreigners who may enter Bosnia and Herzegovina without presenting a negative test result or certificates are:**

- citizens of Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and the Republic of Serbia, when they enter Bosnia and Herzegovina directly from the country of which they are citizens, as well as their minor children and spouses who are citizens of other countries,
- the crew and cabin crew of the aircraft whose final destination is Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- drivers and co-drivers of freight vehicles when performing international transport of goods by road, provided that their stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina does not last longer than 12 hours,
- crews of freight trains and ships in international traffic,

- diplomatic and consular staff and staff of international organizations in the performance of their official duties, who must have and present an appropriate valid passport upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- civil protection services and teams when their entry into Bosnia and Herzegovina is urgent and cannot be postponed,
- members of the military forces of the member states of the North Atlantic Treaty and other states participating in the Partnership for Peace and members of the NATO and EUFOR Headquarters in Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- heads of states and governments and members of their delegations whose arrival and departure from Bosnia and Herzegovina have been announced to Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina, through diplomatic channels or through protocols of the competent authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- foreigners transiting through the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the purpose of returning to the country of usual residence, without staying in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- a minor foreigner whose parent is a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as a foreigner who is the spouse of a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- children under the age of seven travelling with parents or guardians, if their parents or guardians possess negative PCR or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, or certificate on vaccination or certificate showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19,
- foreigners authorized to stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina temporarily or permanently, if they are returning to Bosnia and Herzegovina after exit and stay only in Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and/or the Republic of Serbia, provided that total duration of their stay in the above countries has not been longer than 48 hours since they left the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina, which could be proved by exiting stamp, i.e. entering stamp in a travel document of the foreigner,

- foreigners – citizens of the Republic of Turkey crossing the state border of Bosnia and Herzegovina daily due to construction of the bridge Rača in the framework of realization of the Project motorway/expressway Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo. Ministry of Communication and Transport of BiH shall submit to the BiH Border Police a certified list of nationals of the Republic of Turkey Border Police hired as workers for construction of the Rača Bridge within the above mentioned Project, including their names, surnames and number of travel document they use for crossing of the BiH border; as well as certificate that the Project is implemented according to signed Agreement on Cooperation regarding realization of the Project motorway/expressway road Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo (“Official Gazette BiH – International Agreements”, no. 13/20).

***Ukrainian citizens who left Ukraine due to the security situation***

By the Decision on prescribing additional conditions for the entry of foreigners into BiH, it is not prescribed what kind/type of PCR or antigen tests, i.e. form of tests or certificates is required to present at the border crossing points during intended entry to BiH, and it is possible to present them in printed or electronic form.

**Remarks:** Currently, when entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, no quarantine or self-isolation measures are prescribed, while upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, all persons are obliged to follow the instructions and respect all orders of the competent epidemiological and health authorities (social distance, protective masks, hand disinfection, etc.).

Albania Short-term visa's validity period can be a maximum of **90 days**.

**IMPORTANT:** A visa is issued **up to 15 days** from the acceptance of the application and in exceptional cases may take **up to 30 days**. Albania Short-term Visa fee is **35-60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for an Albania Short-term Visa in Albania visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Albanian Honorary Consulate in Damascus, Syria** (Fardous Street Phillips Building, 4th Floor Damascus).

Albania applies visa-free travel, during the tourist period, from **01 May 2022 to 30 September 2022**, citizens of Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, Oman, Qatar, the Arab Republic of Egypt, India, Russia and Thailand, travel without a visa to Albania, without having to obtain a visa at the Albanian Embassy.

For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

All foreigners who have a valid multi – entry Schengen visa, type “C” or “D”, or a valid residence permit in one of the Schengen member states, can enter, stay and transit Albania without visa, within the validity term of the visa or the residence permit. The same applies for all holders of Laissez-Passer issued by United Nations Organizations, and its branch, NATO, Council of Europe and European Union, regardless of nationality. For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

Holders of a valid type “C” multiple-entry Schengen visa (which has been previously used in one of the countries in Schengen area) or a Residence Permit to the Schengen Area, also holders of a valid UK, Canada and US visa (which has been previously used for entering that country) may enter to Albania without a visa for up to 15 days.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

North Macedonia Short-term visa’s validity period can be a maximum of 90 days.

**IMPORTANT:** The foreigner submits a visa application to the competent (resident or non-resident) diplomatic-consular representation of the Republic of North Macedonia **no longer than six months and at least 15 days before the start of the intended trip.** The visa application is submitted in person. Upon exception, the visa application may be submitted by another natural or legal person authorized to act as the proxy of the applicant when the foreigner is a disabled person or when the foreigner is a well-known person and there is no doubt about his/her bona fide intentions. The application for a minor is submitted in person by a parent or a

guardian. **It takes 3 to 10 working days for a North Macedonia visa to be issued.** In extreme cases, the application process can take up to a month. North Macedonia Short-term Visa fee is **60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a North Macedonia Short-term Visa in North Macedonia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case, **Macedonian Honorary Consulate General in Damascus, Syria - P.O. Box 436 - Damascus – Syria.**

Nationals of EU Member States and signatories of the Schengen Agreement DO NOT need a visa to enter the Republic of North Macedonia (and are eligible to enter the Republic of North Macedonia with a valid national identity card).

- Third-country nationals with temporary residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with permanent residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with multiple-entry Schengen visa (type C) valid for at least 5 (five) days beyond the intended stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.

The Republic of North Macedonia has abolished short-term stay (Type C) visas for foreign nationals who are holders of valid passports of third countries and are simultaneously holders of valid UK, US, and Canadian visas, whereby the duration of their stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may not exceed 15 days, with the periods of validity of the valid UK, US, and Canadian visas they hold not exceeding more than 5 days from their planned stay in the Republic of North Macedonia. This decision is of a temporary character and shall be in force from 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2022.

**The applicant encloses the following documentation with the visa application:**

- Valid travel document (the validity period of the travel document should exceed that of the visa by at least three months), the travel document must have been issued within the last 10 years and it must include at least two empty pages for visa purposes and one photograph size 35x45 mm
- Proof of valid travel medical insurance
- Proof of fees paid
- Documents that prove: the purpose of the visit to RNM, secured accommodation, means of subsistence to cover the stay in RNM and the repatriation or the travel to a third country, means of transport and the intention to return to the country of origin or the intention to travel to a third country.

A short-stay visa (C type) is an authorization issued to a third-country national for entry and temporary stay (up to 90 days). An application for a C type visa should be submitted with the Schengen country that is the main destination. On behalf of Slovenia, this type of visa can also be issued by another Schengen country if the two countries have concluded a representation agreement. A C type visa may be extended in exceptional cases where the circumstances prevent the visa holder from returning to the country of origin.

**IMPORTANT:** A visa application must be submitted **at least 15 calendar days and no more than six months** before the intended visit. A visa application submitted **less than 15 calendar days** before may be accepted but the processing may take up to 15 calendar days. When applying for a Schengen visa, each person must pay a visa fee. This fee is non-refundable regardless of the visa result. The Schengen visa fee for citizens of Azerbaijan, Russia, and Armenia is currently **35 EUR**. These three countries benefit from reduced visa costs under an agreement with the Schengen countries. In other countries, this amount is **80 EUR** for people over 12 years old, **40 EUR** for children 6-12 years old, and free for children under six years old.

You will apply for Slovenia Tourism/Private Visit Visa in Slovenia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of the Republic of Austria in Damascus** (Farabi Street 1, Bld. Mohamed Naim Al-Deker Mezzeh, East Villas Damascus).

**Third-country nationals** - A national of a third country who wishes to enter and reside in the Republic of Slovenia for tourist, business, personal, or other purposes should obtain a visa prior to their entry into the country, unless they are citizens of countries that do not require a visa, or already hold one of the permits described below:

**Holders of a short-stay visa (C type)** issued by a Schengen country may, during the visa validity period, enter the Republic of Slovenia and stay in its territory,

provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a long-stay visa (D type)** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this visa and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the long-stay visa, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the long-stay visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a residence permit** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this residence permit and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the residence permit, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the residence permit, whichever is sooner.

### **Short-stay Visa (C type) application requirements:**

**All requested documents have to be submitted and translated into English or Slovenian.**

#### **General requirements**

- ***Valid passport or travel document.*** Must be valid for minimum 3 months after the journey and issued within the previous 10 years and have at least 2 blank pages. A copy of passport or travel document.
- ***Application form*** duly completed, dated and signed by the applicant.
- ***One (1) recent photograph.***
- ***Travel medical insurance*** covering the entire duration of the trip valid in the whole Schengen area. The minimum coverage of 30.000 euros, covering: emergency medical expenses, hospital treatment, repatriation for medical reasons, or repatriation of remains. Multi-entry visa applicants must have insurance for the duration of the first trip.
- ***Copy of flight ticket or flight reservation including return flight.***
- ***Verifiable evidence of sufficient*** means of subsistence during intended stay: payslips for the last 3 months, valid international credit card accompanied by bank statements, bank account statements for the last three (3) months or a national form for proof of sponsorship and/or accommodation.
- ***Proof of accommodation:*** hotel reservation, proof of rental or ownership of real estate in the member state of destination, confirmation of private

accommodation, mentioning that the host will cover the accommodation costs, confirmation of accommodation by the company inviting the applicant, mentioning that the company will cover the accommodation costs.

- ***Minors traveling without their parents/legal guardian:*** Original authorisation signed by their parents/legal guardian in front of a visa officer or dully legalised and copy of the passport(s) of parents/legal guardian.
- ***Residence permit*** valid three months beyond the intended date of departure from the territory of the Member States or, for GCC citizens, a UAE ID-card, valid for three months after the intended departure date from the territory of the Member States.
- ***Employees:*** original letter from employer stating the applicant's employment status, position, length of the contract and salary, self-employed persons: valid original trade license, documents to be submitted relating to the purpose of the journey.

**I. Business trip- Invitation from the inviting company (*Letter of Guarantee*) or an authority to attend a meeting, conference or event** (The invitation must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter of guarantee with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.) and other documents for work purpose (e.g. confirmed registration for trade fairs or congresses).

**II. Official delegation/mission-** Letter issued by the authority (-ies) concerned confirming identity of the applicant(s), purpose of the journey (meeting, consultation, negotiations or events held by intergovernmental organizations), period of intended stay and accommodation details.

**III. Tourism-** Full travel itinerary.

**IV. Private visit** - Invitation letter signed (*Letter of Guarantee*) by the host covering the period of the intended stay (The Invitation Letter must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.).

**V. Medical treatment** - A document issued by the medical institution in the Member State of destination confirming that the applicant will receive medical care in that institution; Pre-payment or other proof of sufficient financial means to cover the medical treatment and related expenses, such as insurance coverage.

**VI. Study or training** - A certificate of enrollment at an educational establishment for the purpose of attending vocational or theoretical courses within the framework

of basic and further training.; Student cards or certificates of the courses to be attended.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**Short-term visa (visa C)** - approval for transit through or intended stay in the territory of Croatia for a duration of no more than 90 days in any 180-day period;

**IMPORTANT:** A visa application must be submitted **at least 15 calendar days and no more than six months before** the intended visit. Croatia Tourist visa fee is **60 EUR**, to be paid upon submission of the application. Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. The fee may vary depending on your nationality or your country of submission. You will apply for a Croatia Tourist visa in Croatia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to

the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of the Croatia in Cairo (3, Abou El Feda St. Zamalek).**

**Each visa applicant shall enclose following documents with the application:**

- valid travel document

the validity period of the travel document should exceed that of the visa by three months

travel document must be issued in the previous 10 years

travel document must contain at least two empty pages for the visa

- a 35x45 mm colour photo
- evidence of travel health insurance
- evidence of paid visa fee
- documents that prove:
  - the purpose of the stay in Croatia
    - ensured accommodation
    - means of subsistence to cover the stay in Croatia and the return to the country of origin or to a third country
    - means of transport and the intention to return to the applicant's country of origin or to a third country.

Pursuant to the Government's Decision, starting with 22 July 2014, the Republic of Croatia applies the Decision No 565/2014/EU. **All third-country nationals who are holders of valid Schengen documents, as well as national visas and residence permits of Bulgaria, Cyprus, and Romania do not require an additional (Croatian) visa for Croatia.**

Third-country nationals who are holders of:

**uniform visa (C) for two or multiple entries, valid for all Schengen Area Member States;**

**visa with limited territorial validity (LTV visa), for two or multiple entries, issued to the holder of a travel document that is not recognized by one or more, but not all of the Schengen Area Member States, and which is valid for the territory of the Member States recognizing the travel document;**

**long-stay visa (D) for stays exceeding three months, issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;**

**residence permit** issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Bulgaria**, listed in Annex I of the **Decision No 565/2014/EU**;

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Cyprus**, listed in Annex III of the **Decision No 565/2014/EU**;

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Romania**, listed in Annex IV of the **Decision No 565/2014/EU**;

**do not require a visa for transit or intended stays in the territory of Croatia not exceeding 90 days in any 180-day period.**

Nationals of Palestine are required to obtain a visa to enter Montenegro. Visas may be obtained from diplomatic and consular posts of Montenegro. If you are unable to reach a diplomatic or consular post of Montenegro, you may apply for a visa at the nearest diplomatic or consular post of the Republic of Serbia.

**IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Montenegro Short-stay visa is **3-10 working days**. Montenegro Short-stay visa is **35 EUR**. The fee may vary depending on your nationality or your country of submission. You will apply for a Montenegro Short-stay visa in Montenegro visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case- **Embassy of the Republic of Serbia in Cairo, the Arab Republic of Egypt (33, Al Mansour Mohamed St. Zamalek)**.

You can enter Montenegro with your Schengen visa, provided the visa still has valid entries left as well as remaining days of stay. This also applies to holders of residence permits for a Schengen country.

Montenegro Short-stay visa (C) may be issued for one, two, or multiple entries into Montenegro for tourist, business, personal or other purposes. Continuous stay or the total duration of consecutive visits may not exceed 90 days in a period of 6 months, counting from the date of first entry. The validity period of Visa C for multiple entries is up to one year. Exceptionally this type of visa may be issued for a more extended period of validity, but no longer than five years. A short-stay visa may be given to a group of foreigners (collective visa). The validity period of a collective visa cannot exceed 30 days, and it may be affixed to a group passport. Montenegro

is not included in the Schengen Agreement. Therefore, Montenegro visas are valid only for its territory. You can't travel to Schengen countries with a Montenegro visa.

For a foreigner who is minor, i.e. legally incapable, visa application shall be filed by a parent or his legal representative.

In addition to the visa application, the foreigner shall submit:

- valid travel document (the period of validity of the travel document should exceed that of the visas by three months);
- one color photo 35x45 mm;
- proof of the purpose of stay in Montenegro (letter of guarantee by a physical person or letter of invitation by a legal entity, state authority in Montenegro or organizer of an international conference or event);
- proof of ensured accommodation (receipt from a tourist arrangement, hotel or other type of accommodation reservation that has been paid in);
- proof of possession of means for sustenance during his stay in Montenegro, as well as for return into the country where he comes from or for travel into a third state (cash, a bank account, traveler's checks, credit cards etc.);
- proof of the means of travel and intention to return into the state where a foreigner comes from or into a third state (a return airplane or other transportation ticket, a driving license);
- proof of health insurance;
- proof that the consular fee has been charged,
- as well as other corresponding documents based on which the purpose and ensured accommodation in Montenegro can be determined

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

The Serbia Tourist visa permits you to stay in Serbia and realize your tourist activities for a maximum period of 90 days at most per 180 days.

**IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Serbia Tourist visa is **3-10 calendar days**. It depends on your visa application country. Serbia Tourist visa fee is **80 EUR**. Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such

as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission.

You will apply for a Serbia Tourist visa in Serbia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of the Republic of Serbia in Cairo, Egypt, which covers Palestine on a non-residential basis** (33, Al Mansour Mohamed St. Zamalek).

On October 30, 2014, the Government of the Republic of Serbia adopted the Decision on visa free entry to the Republic of Serbia for holders of foreign national passports having a valid Schengen, UK and other Member States' visa, or visa of the United States of America, and for holders of foreign national passports having residence permit in the countries of the Schengen area, EU or the United States of America.

On basis of this decision, the above-mentioned categories of foreign nationals may, without prior visa application, enter, transit and stay in the Republic of Serbia up to 90 days during a six-month period, and within validity of said visas or residence permits. There is a possibility for foreign nationals to enter the Republic of Serbia with two passports e.g. expired national passport with valid visa or residence permit and valid national passport without valid visa or residence permit. Foreign nationals, holders of a residence permit in the form of a separate card (not a sticker affixed to their passport), must present their valid passport upon entering the territory of the Republic of Serbia.

#### **General visa requirements:**

- Valid passport (passport must be valid at least 90 days from issue date of visa)
- Letter of invitation:
  - for a private visit – invitation letter certified by the relevant authority of the Republic of Serbia
  - for a business visit – invitation letter by a company in Serbia;
  - for a tourist trip – a proof of payment for the trip issued by a travel agency (voucher or other type of payment receipt);
- Completed visa application form: (PDF) ;
- Photo (size 3.5x4.5cm);

- Return ticket or Itinerary (copy of Driving License and Insurance if you travel by car);
- Proof of sufficient funds for staying in Serbia;
- Health insurance
- Visa fee.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** There are no restrictions on entering the Republic of Serbia. The recommendation to wear masks indoors remains in force, while wearing masks in health facilities is mandatory.

**Citizens of the State of Palestine** are required visas when entering, exiting or travelling through Bosnia and Herzegovina. All visa applications must be submitted in person. The Embassy do not accept applications sent through email.

Short-term visa's validity period can be a maximum of **90 days**.

**IMPORTANT:** Applications should be made **at least 10-30 days before your intended departure date**. Bosnia & Herzegovina's fees cover only a part of the work necessary to process your application. Because processing fees are only for handling your application, you will not get your money back, even if your application is refused. The minimum amount of financial resources required for the

stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150,00 (or equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) for each day of intended stay. Bosnia and Herzegovina Short-term Visa fee is **31 EUR for single-entry and 57 EUR for a multiple-entry visa** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a Bosnia and Herzegovina Short-term visa in Bosnia and Herzegovina visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of the BiH in the Hashemite Kingdom of JORDAN or Embassy of BiH in Arab Republic of EGYPT.**

Nationals of the following states may enter into Bosnia and Herzegovina with a passport or a valid identity card proving identity and citizenship of:

- Member State of the European Union
- State signatory to the Schengen Agreement
- Andorra, Montenegro, Liechtenstein, Monaco, San Marino, Serbia, the Holy See and Swiss Confederation.

The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150.00 (or equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) - for each day of the intended stay.

**Listed below are the documents required when applying for a visa to Bosnia and Herzegovina:**

- A valid passport of the applicant
- Application form (completed and signed)
- Copy of a valid residence visa
- Copy of a round trip ticket or itinerary
- One passport size picture
- Travel insurance

No objection letter from your company or your sponsor

**In addition to the above, the following items must be presented:**

**If I travel as a tourist** : Voucher of the travel agency stating that the trip has been paid in full

Copy of your bank statement for the last 3 months

**If visiting friends and/or relatives:** Letter of invitation from the person(s) the applicant intends to visit, certified by the Ministry of Security of Bosnia and Herzegovina – Department for Foreign Citizens.

**If traveling on business:** Letter from the employer stating the purpose of the trip to Bosnia and Herzegovina

Letter of invitation from a company in Bosnia and Herzegovina, certified by the Ministry of Security of Bosnia and Herzegovina – Department for Foreign Citizens.

**Children under the age of 18:** For children under the age of 18 a birth certificate is required.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** The Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina has adopted a Decision on declaring a natural or other disaster on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina ('Official Gazette of BiH', 18/20), due to the danger of an epidemic of infectious disease caused by new coronavirus (COVID-19), in order to reduce the risk of accelerated spread of infection in Bosnia and Herzegovina and enable the engagement of additional resources to respond to this public health threat.

In order to prevent and suppress the spread of the SARS-COV-2 virus, the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina also adopted a **DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA**, as well as **DECISION ON AMENDMENT OF THE DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA** ('Official Gazette of BiH', 36/21').

**(Article 2) A foreigner who meets conditions for entry to BiH prescribed by Law on Aliens, may enter BiH if he/she at the BiH Border Crossing Points presents any of the following:**

- negative PCR test or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, not older than 48 hours if he/she comes from a European country, and if he/she comes from another country, not older than 72 hours until arrival at the border crossing point of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- certificate that a person has received the second dose of vaccine for COVID-19 before more than 14 days before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH or has received one dose before 14 days and more before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH, if it is a single dose vaccine,
- certificate issued by doctor showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19 in the previous period from 14 to 180 days until the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH.

**(Article 3) Exemptions from Article 2 of the Decision, foreigners who may enter Bosnia and Herzegovina without presenting a negative test result or certificates are:**

- citizens of Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and the Republic of Serbia, when they enter Bosnia and Herzegovina directly from the country of which they are citizens, as well as their minor children and spouses who are citizens of other countries,
- the crew and cabin crew of the aircraft whose final destination is Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- drivers and co-drivers of freight vehicles when performing international transport of goods by road, provided that their stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina does not last longer than 12 hours,
- crews of freight trains and ships in international traffic,
- diplomatic and consular staff and staff of international organizations in the performance of their official duties, who must have and present an appropriate valid passport upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- civil protection services and teams when their entry into Bosnia and Herzegovina is urgent and cannot be postponed,

- members of the military forces of the member states of the North Atlantic Treaty and other states participating in the Partnership for Peace and members of the NATO and EUFOR Headquarters in Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- heads of states and governments and members of their delegations whose arrival and departure from Bosnia and Herzegovina have been announced to Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina, through diplomatic channels or through protocols of the competent authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- foreigners transiting through the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the purpose of returning to the country of usual residence, without staying in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- a minor foreigner whose parent is a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as a foreigner who is the spouse of a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- children under the age of seven travelling with parents or guardians, if their parents or guardians possess negative PCR or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, or certificate on vaccination or certificate showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19,
- foreigners authorized to stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina temporarily or permanently, if they are returning to Bosnia and Herzegovina after exit and stay only in Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and/or the Republic of Serbia, provided that total duration of their stay in the above countries has not been longer than 48 hours since they left the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina, which could be proved by exiting stamp, i.e. entering stamp in a travel document of the foreigner,
- foreigners – citizens of the Republic of Turkey crossing the state border of Bosnia and Herzegovina daily due to construction of the bridge Rača in the framework of realization of the Project motorway/expressway Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo. Ministry of Communication and Transport of BiH shall submit to the BiH Border

Police a certified list of nationals of the Republic of Turkey Border Police hired as workers for construction of the Rača Bridge within the above mentioned Project, including their names, surnames and number of travel document they use for crossing of the BiH border; as well as certificate that the Project is implemented according to signed Agreement on Cooperation regarding realization of the Project motorway/expressway road Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo (“Official Gazette BiH – International Agreements”, no. 13/20).

***Ukrainian citizens who left Ukraine due to the security situation***

By the Decision on prescribing additional conditions for the entry of foreigners into BiH, it is not prescribed what kind/type of PCR or antigen tests, i.e. form of tests or certificates is required to present at the border crossing points during intended entry to BiH, and it is possible to present them in printed or electronic form.

**Remarks:** Currently, when entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, no quarantine or self-isolation measures are prescribed, while upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, all persons are obliged to follow the instructions and respect all orders of the competent epidemiological and health authorities (social distance, protective masks, hand disinfection, etc.).

You will apply for an Albania Short-term Visa in Albania visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location.

**General requirements:**

- **Application Form**
- **Passport**
- **Photo**
- **ID Card Copy**
- **Residence Permit/Visa Copy (if your country of residence and citizenship are different)**
- **Photocopies**
- **Travel Itinerary** (Flight reservation (return ticket), Valid (existing) hotel/accommodation booking/reservation with the full address (name, street, city, zip code, contact information, booking ref.)
- **Proof of Financial Means**
- **Travel Insurance**
- **Supporting Documents that Show Your Reason for a Trip**

**For tourism:** Confirmation of the accommodation (hotel confirmation, apartment rental contract, etc.), Round-trip ticket reservation

**For business/congress/sports travel:** Original invitation letter by the company/organization, Confirmation of the accommodation (hotel confirmation, apartment rental contract, etc.), Verbal Note from the institution where the foreigner is employed.

Albania applies visa-free travel, during the tourist period, from **01 May 2022 to 30 September 2022**, citizens of Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, Oman, Qatar, the Arab Republic of Egypt, India, Russia and Thailand, travel without a visa to Albania, without having to obtain a visa at the Albanian Embassy.

For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is **90 days within a period of 180 days** and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

All foreigners who have a valid multi – entry Schengen visa, type “C” or “D”, or a valid residence permit in one of the Schengen member states, can enter, stay and

transit Albania without visa, within the validity term of the visa or the residence permit. The same applies for all holders of Laissez-Passer issued by United Nations Organizations, and its branch, NATO, Council of Europe and European Union, regardless of nationality. For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the

General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

Holders of a valid type “C” multiple-entry Schengen visa (which has been previously used in one of the countries in Schengen area) or a Residence Permit to the Schengen Area, also holders of a valid UK, Canada and US visa (which has been previously used for entering that country) may enter to Albania without a visa for up to 15 days.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**Entry in Macedonia-** Entry visa for North Macedonia **REQUIRED.**

North Macedonia Short-term visa’s validity period can be a maximum of 90 days.

**IMPORTANT:** The foreigner submits a visa application to the competent (resident or non-resident) diplomatic-consular representation of the Republic of North Macedonia **no longer than six months and at least 15 days before the start of the intended trip.** The visa application is submitted in person. Upon exception, the visa application may be submitted by another natural or legal person authorized to act as the proxy of the applicant when the foreigner is a disabled person or when the foreigner is a well-known person and there is no doubt about his/her bona fide intentions. The application for a minor is submitted in person by a parent or a guardian. **It takes 3 to 10 working days for a North Macedonia visa to be issued.** In extreme cases, the application process can take up to a month. North Macedonia Short-term Visa fee is **60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and

nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a North Macedonia Short-term Visa in North Macedonia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location.

**The applicant encloses the following documentation with the visa application:**

- Valid travel document (the validity period of the travel document should exceed that of the visa by at least three months), the travel document must have been issued within the last 10 years and it must include at least two empty pages for visa purposes and one photograph size 35x45 mm
- Proof of valid travel medical insurance
- Proof of fees paid
- Documents that prove: the purpose of the visit to RNM, secured accommodation, means of subsistence to cover the stay in RNM and the repatriation or the travel to a third country, means of transport and the intention to return to the country of origin or the intention to travel to a third country

Nationals of EU Member States and signatories of the Schengen Agreement DO NOT need a visa to enter the Republic of North Macedonia (and are eligible to enter the Republic of North Macedonia with a valid national identity card).

- Third-country nationals with temporary residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with permanent residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with multiple-entry Schengen visa (type C) valid for at least 5 (five) days beyond the intended stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.

The Republic of North Macedonia has abolished short-term stay (Type C) visas for foreign nationals who are holders of valid passports of third countries and are simultaneously holders of valid UK, US, and Canadian visas, whereby the duration of their stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may not exceed 15 days, with the periods of validity of the valid UK, US, and Canadian visas they hold not exceeding more than 5 days from their planned stay in the Republic of North Macedonia. This decision is of a temporary character and shall be in force from 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2022.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** Visitors entering North Macedonia will no longer be required to present a vaccination certificate or a negative COVID-19 test.

**Visa is required.** The Representative office Ramallah is not authorized to perform consular services. Based on the agreement between Slovenia and Switzerland, the Representative Office of Switzerland Ramallah performs consular services for Slovenia. (<https://www.eda.admin.ch/ramallah>) You can find additional information on the <https://www.gov.si/en/topics/entry-and-residence/>

A short-stay visa (C type) is an authorization issued to a third-country national for entry and temporary stay (up to 90 days). An application for a C type visa should be submitted with the Schengen country that is the main destination. On behalf of Slovenia, this type of visa can also be issued by another Schengen country if the two countries have concluded a representation agreement. A C type visa may be extended in exceptional cases where the circumstances prevent the visa holder from returning to the country of origin.

**IMPORTANT:** A visa application must be submitted **at least 15 calendar days and no more than six months** before the intended visit. A visa application submitted **less than 15 calendar days** before may be accepted but the processing may take up to 15 calendar days. When applying for a Schengen visa, each person must pay a visa fee. This fee is non-refundable regardless of the visa result. The Schengen visa fee for citizens of Azerbaijan, Russia, and Armenia is currently **35 EUR**. These three countries benefit from reduced visa costs under an agreement with the Schengen countries. In other countries, this amount is **80 EUR** for people over

12 years old, **40 EUR** for children 6-12 years old, and free for children under six years old.

You will apply for Slovenia Tourism/Private Visit Visa in Slovenia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Slovenia (SI) Representation in Palestine** (Office of the Republic of Slovenia in Palestine, Al-Mobaadin Street, VIP Center 6th Floor, Al-Bireh, Ramallah, Palestine).

**Third-country nationals** - A national of a third country who wishes to enter and reside in the Republic of Slovenia for tourist, business, personal, or other purposes should obtain a visa prior to their entry into the country, unless they are citizens of countries that do not require a visa, or already hold one of the permits described below:

**Holders of a short-stay visa (C type)** issued by a Schengen country may, during the visa validity period, enter the Republic of Slovenia and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a long-stay visa (D type)** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this visa and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the long-stay visa, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the long-stay visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a residence permit** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this residence permit and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the residence permit, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the residence permit, whichever is sooner.

**Short-stay Visa (C type) application requirements:**

**All requested documents have to be submitted and translated into English or Slovenian.**

**General requirements**

- ***Valid passport or travel document.*** Must be valid for minimum 3 months after the journey and issued within the previous 10 years and have at least 2 blank pages. A copy of passport or travel document.
- ***Application form*** duly completed, dated and signed by the applicant.
- ***One (1) recent photograph.***
- ***Travel medical insurance*** covering the entire duration of the trip valid in the whole Schengen area. The minimum coverage of 30.000 euros, covering: emergency medical expenses, hospital treatment, repatriation for medical reasons, or repatriation of remains. Multi-entry visa applicants must have insurance for the duration of the first trip.
- ***Copy of flight ticket or flight reservation including return flight.***
- ***Verifiable evidence of sufficient*** means of subsistence during intended stay: payslips for the last 3 months, valid international credit card accompanied by bank statements, bank account statements for the last three (3) months or a national form for proof of sponsorship and/or accommodation.
- ***Proof of accommodation:*** hotel reservation, proof of rental or ownership of real estate in the member state of destination, confirmation of private accommodation, mentioning that the host will cover the accommodation costs, confirmation of accommodation by the company inviting the applicant, mentioning that the company will cover the accommodation costs.
- ***Minors traveling without their parents/legal guardian:*** Original authorisation signed by their parents/legal guardian in front of a visa officer or dully legalised and copy of the passport(s) of parents/legal guardian.
- ***Residence permit*** valid three months beyond the intended date of departure from the territory of the Member States or, for GCC citizens, a UAE ID-card, valid for three months after the intended departure date from the territory of the Member States.
- ***Employees:*** original letter from employer stating the applicant's employment status, position, length of the contract and salary, self-employed persons: valid original trade license, documents to be submitted relating to the purpose of the journey.

**I. Business trip- Invitation from the inviting company (*Letter of Guarantee*) or an authority to attend a meeting, conference or event** (The invitation must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter of guarantee with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.) and other documents for work purpose (e.g. confirmed registration for trade fairs or congresses).

**II. Official delegation/mission-** Letter issued by the authority (-ies) concerned confirming identity of the applicant(s), purpose of the journey (meeting, consultation, negotiations or events held by intergovernmental organizations), period of intended stay and accommodation details.

**III. Tourism-** Full travel itinerary.

**IV. Private visit** - Invitation letter signed (Letter of Guarantee) by the host covering the period of the intended stay (The Invitation Letter must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.).

**V. Medical treatment** - A document issued by the medical institution in the Member State of destination confirming that the applicant will receive medical care in that institution; Pre-payment or other proof of sufficient financial means to cover the medical treatment and related expenses, such as insurance coverage.

**VI. Study or training** - A certificate of enrollment at an educational establishment for the purpose of attending vocational or theoretical courses within the framework of basic and further training.; Student cards or certificates of the courses to be attended.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

# FOR CITIZENS OF THE REPUBLIC OF IRAQ

## Entry in Montenegro -

Nationals of Iraq are required to obtain a visa to enter Montenegro. Visas may be obtained from diplomatic and consular posts of Montenegro. If you are unable to reach a diplomatic or consular post of Montenegro, you may apply for a visa at the nearest diplomatic or consular post of the Republic of Serbia. You can find additional information and documents on the: <https://www.gov.me/en/article/visas-and-visa-regime>

**IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Montenegro Short-stay visa is 3-10 working days. Montenegro Short-stay visa is 35 EUR. The fee may vary depending on your nationality or your country of submission. You will apply for a Montenegro Short-stay visa in Montenegro visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case- **Embassy of the Republic of Serbia in Baghdad, the Republic of Iraq:** (Jadriya Babil District, Mahala No. 923, Zukak No. 35, Building No.16, P.O. Box 2061)

You can enter Montenegro with your Schengen visa, provided the visa still has valid entries left as well as remaining days of stay. This also applies to holders of residence permits for a Schengen country.

Montenegro Short-stay visa (C) may be issued for one, two, or multiple entries into Montenegro for tourist, business, personal or other purposes. Continuous stay or the total duration of consecutive visits may not exceed 90 days in a period of 6 months, counting from the date of first entry. The validity period of Visa C for multiple entries is up to one year. Exceptionally this type of visa may be issued for a more

extended period of validity, but no longer than five years. A short-stay visa may be given to a group of foreigners (collective visa). The validity period of a collective visa cannot exceed 30 days, and it may be affixed to a group passport.

Montenegro is not included in the Schengen Agreement. Therefore, Montenegro visas are valid only for its territory. You can't travel to Schengen countries with a Montenegro visa.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**For holders of ordinary passports and other travel documents:**      Visas required

The Serbia Tourist visa permits you to stay in Serbia and realize your tourist activities for a maximum period of 90 days at most per 180 days.

**IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Serbia Tourist visa is **3-10 calendar days**. It depends on your visa application country. Serbia Tourist visa fee is **80 EUR**. Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission.

You will apply for a Serbia Tourist visa in Serbia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of the Republic of Serbia in Baghdad** (Jadriya Babil District, Mahala No. 923, Zukak No. 35, Building No. 16)

**General visa requirements:**

- Valid passport (passport must be valid at least 90 days from issue date of visa)
- Letter of invitation:
  - for a private visit – invitation letter certified by the relevant authority of the Republic of Serbia
  - for a business visit – invitation letter by a company in Serbia;
  - for a tourist trip – a proof of payment for the trip issued by a travel agency (voucher or other type of payment receipt);
- Completed visa application form: (PDF) ;

- Photo (size 3.5x4.5cm);
- Return ticket or Itinerary (copy of Driving License and Insurance if you travel by car);
- Proof of sufficient funds for staying in Serbia;
- Health insurance
- Visa fee.

On October 30, 2014, the Government of the Republic of Serbia adopted the Decision on visa free entry to the Republic of Serbia for holders of foreign national passports having a valid Schengen, UK and other Member States' visa, or visa of the United States of America, and for holders of foreign national passports having residence permit in the countries of the Schengen area, EU or the United States of America.

On basis of this decision, the above-mentioned categories of foreign nationals may, without prior visa application, enter, transit and stay in the Republic of Serbia up to 90 days during a six-month period, and within validity of said visas or residence permits. There is a possibility for foreign nationals to enter the Republic of Serbia with two passports e.g. expired national passport with valid visa or residence permit and valid national passport without valid visa or residence permit. Foreign nationals, holders of a residence permit in the form of a separate card (not a sticker affixed to their passport), must present their valid passport upon entering the territory of the Republic of Serbia.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** There are no restrictions on entering the Republic of Serbia. The recommendation to wear masks indoors remains in force, while wearing masks in health facilities is mandatory.

Citizens of the Republic of Iraq are required visas when entering, exiting or travelling through Bosnia and Herzegovina. Visa shall be issued in Amman or in Kuwait. All visa applications must be submitted in person. The Embassy do not accept applications sent through email.

Short-term visa's validity period can be a maximum of **90 days**.

**IMPORTANT:** Applications should be made **at least 10-30 days before your intended departure date**. Bosnia & Herzegovina's fees cover only a part of the work necessary to process your application. Because processing fees are only for handling your application, you will not get your money back, even if your application is refused. The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150,00 (ore equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) for each day of intended stay.

Bosnia and Herzegovina Short-term Visa fee is **31 EUR for single-entry and 57 EUR for a multiple-entry visa** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a Bosnia and Herzegovina Short-term visa in Bosnia and Herzegovina visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location.

**Listed below are the documents required when applying for a visa to Bosnia and Herzegovina:**

A valid passport of the applicant

Application form (completed and signed)

Copy of a valid residence visa

Copy of a round trip ticket or itinerary

One passport size picture

Travel insurance

No objection letter from your company or your sponsor

**In addition to the above, the following items must be presented:**

**If I travel as a tourist** : Voucher of the travel agency stating that the trip has been paid in full

Copy of your bank statement for the last 3 months

**If visiting friends and/or relatives**: Letter of invitation from the person(s) the applicant intends to visit, certified by the Ministry of Security of Bosnia and Herzegovina – Department for Foreign Citizens.

**If traveling on business**: Letter from the employer stating the purpose of the trip to Bosnia and Herzegovina

Letter of invitation from a company in Bosnia and Herzegovina, certified by the Ministry of Security of Bosnia and Herzegovina – Department for Foreign Citizens.

**Children under the age of 18**: For children under the age of 18 a birth certificate is required.

Nationals of the following states may enter into Bosnia and Herzegovina with a passport or a valid identity card proving identity and citizenship of:

- Member State of the European Union
- State signatory to the Schengen Agreement

- Andorra, Montenegro, Liechtenstein, Monaco, San Marino, Serbia, the Holy See and Swiss Confederation.

The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150.00 (or equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) - for each day of the intended stay.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** The Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina has adopted a Decision on declaring a natural or other disaster on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina ('Official Gazette of BiH', 18/20), due to the danger of an epidemic of infectious disease caused by new coronavirus (COVID-19), in order to reduce the risk of accelerated spread of infection in Bosnia and Herzegovina and enable the engagement of additional resources to respond to this public health threat.

In order to prevent and suppress the spread of the SARS-COV-2 virus, the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina also adopted a **DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA**, as well as **DECISION ON AMENDMENT OF THE DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA** ('Official Gazette of BiH', 36/21').

**(Article 2) A foreigner who meets conditions for entry to BiH prescribed by Law on Aliens, may enter BiH if he/she at the BiH Border Crossing Points presents any of the following:**

- negative PCR test or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, not older than 48 hours if he/she comes from a European country, and if he/she comes from another country, not older than 72 hours until arrival at the border crossing point of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- certificate that a person has received the second dose of vaccine for COVID-19 before more than 14 days before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH or has received one dose before 14 days and more before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH, if it is a single dose vaccine,

- certificate issued by doctor showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19 in the previous period from 14 to 180 days until the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH.

**(Article 3) Exemptions from Article 2 of the Decision, foreigners who may enter Bosnia and Herzegovina without presenting a negative test result or certificates are:**

- citizens of Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and the Republic of Serbia, when they enter Bosnia and Herzegovina directly from the country of which they are citizens, as well as their minor children and spouses who are citizens of other countries,
- the crew and cabin crew of the aircraft whose final destination is Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- drivers and co-drivers of freight vehicles when performing international transport of goods by road, provided that their stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina does not last longer than 12 hours,
- crews of freight trains and ships in international traffic,
- diplomatic and consular staff and staff of international organizations in the performance of their official duties, who must have and present an appropriate valid passport upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- civil protection services and teams when their entry into Bosnia and Herzegovina is urgent and cannot be postponed,
- members of the military forces of the member states of the North Atlantic Treaty and other states participating in the Partnership for Peace and members of the NATO and EUFOR Headquarters in Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- heads of states and governments and members of their delegations whose arrival and departure from Bosnia and Herzegovina have been announced to Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina, through diplomatic channels or through protocols of the competent authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina,

- foreigners transiting through the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the purpose of returning to the country of usual residence, without staying in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- a minor foreigner whose parent is a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as a foreigner who is the spouse of a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- children under the age of seven travelling with parents or guardians, if their parents or guardians possess negative PCR or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, or certificate on vaccination or certificate showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19,
- foreigners authorized to stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina temporarily or permanently, if they are returning to Bosnia and Herzegovina after exit and stay only in Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and/or the Republic of Serbia, provided that total duration of their stay in the above countries has not been longer than 48 hours since they left the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina, which could be proved by exiting stamp, i.e. entering stamp in a travel document of the foreigner,
- foreigners – citizens of the Republic of Turkey crossing the state border of Bosnia and Herzegovina daily due to construction of the bridge Rača in the framework of realization of the Project motorway/expressway Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo. Ministry of Communication and Transport of BiH shall submit to the BiH Border Police a certified list of nationals of the Republic of Turkey Border Police hired as workers for construction of the Rača Bridge within the above mentioned Project, including their names, surnames and number of travel document they use for crossing of the BiH border; as well as certificate that the Project is implemented according to signed Agreement on Cooperation regarding realization of the Project motorway/expressway road Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo (“Official Gazette BiH – International Agreements”, no. 13/20).

***Ukrainian citizens who left Ukraine due to the security situation***

By the Decision on prescribing additional conditions for the entry of foreigners into BiH, it is not prescribed what kind/type of PCR or antigen tests, i.e. form of tests or certificates is required to present at the border crossing points during intended entry to BiH, and it is possible to present them in printed or electronic form.

**Remarks:** Currently, when entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, no quarantine or self-isolation measures are prescribed, while upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, all persons are obliged to follow the instructions and respect all orders of the competent epidemiological and health authorities (social distance, protective masks, hand disinfection, etc.).

Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for an Albania Short-term Visa in Albania visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location.

Albania applies visa-free travel, during the tourist period, from **01 May 2022 to 30 September 2022**, citizens of Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, Oman, Qatar, the Arab

Republic of Egypt, India, Russia and Thailand, travel without a visa to Albania, without having to obtain a visa at the Albanian Embassy.

For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

All foreigners who have a valid multi – entry Schengen visa, type “C” or “D”, or a valid residence permit in one of the Schengen member states, can enter, stay and transit Albania without visa, within the validity term of the visa or the residence permit. The same applies for all holders of Laissez-Passer issued by United Nations Organizations, and its branch, NATO, Council of Europe and European Union, regardless of nationality. For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

Holders of a valid type “C” multiple-entry Schengen visa (which has been previously used in one of the countries in Schengen area) or a Residence Permit to the Schengen Area, also holders of a valid UK, Canada and US visa (which has been previously used for entering that country) may enter to Albania without a visa for up to 15 days.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

North Macedonia Short-term visa's validity period can be a maximum of 90 days.

**IMPORTANT:** The foreigner submits a visa application to the competent (resident or non-resident) diplomatic-consular representation of the Republic of North Macedonia **no longer than six months and at least 15 days before the start of the intended trip**. The visa application is submitted in person. Upon exception, the visa application may be submitted by another natural or legal person authorized to act as the proxy of the applicant when the foreigner is a disabled person or when the foreigner is a well-known person and there is no doubt about his/her bona fide intentions. The application for a minor is submitted in person by a parent or a guardian. **It takes 3 to 10 working days for a North Macedonia visa to be issued.** In extreme cases, the application process can take up to a month. North Macedonia Short-term Visa fee is **60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a North Macedonia Short-term Visa in North Macedonia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location.

### **The applicant encloses the following documentation with the visa application:**

- Valid travel document (the validity period of the travel document should

exceed that of the visa by at least three months), the travel document must have been issued within the last 10 years and it must include at least two empty pages for visa purposes and one photograph size 35x45 mm

- Proof of valid travel medical insurance
  - Proof of fees paid
  - Documents that prove: the purpose of the visit to RNM, secured accommodation, means of subsistence to cover the stay in RNM and the repatriation or the travel to a third country, means of transport and the intention to return to the country of origin or the intention to travel to a third country.
- 
- Nationals of EU Member States and signatories of the Schengen Agreement DO NOT need a visa to enter the Republic of North Macedonia (and are eligible to enter the Republic of North Macedonia with a valid national identity card).
  - Third-country nationals with temporary residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
  - Third-country nationals with permanent residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
  - Third-country nationals with multiple-entry Schengen visa (type C) valid for at least 5 (five) days beyond the intended stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.

The Republic of North Macedonia has abolished short-term stay (Type C) visas for foreign nationals who are holders of valid passports of third countries and are simultaneously holders of valid UK, US, and Canadian visas, whereby the duration of their stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may not exceed 15 days, with the periods of validity of the valid UK, US, and Canadian visas they hold not exceeding more than 5 days from their planned stay in the Republic of North Macedonia. This

decision is of a temporary character and shall be in force from 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2022.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** Visitors entering North Macedonia will no longer be required to present a vaccination certificate or a negative COVID-19 test.

**Visa is required.** Visa is also required to enter an airport transit area (airport transit visa).

A short-stay visa (C type) is an authorization issued to a third-country national for entry and temporary stay (up to 90 days). An application for a C type visa should be submitted with the Schengen country that is the main destination. On behalf of Slovenia, this type of visa can also be issued by another Schengen country if the two countries have concluded a representation agreement. A C type visa may be extended in exceptional cases where the circumstances prevent the visa holder from returning to the country of origin.

**IMPORTANT:** A visa application must be submitted **at least 15 calendar days** and no more than six months before the intended visit. A visa application submitted **less than 15 calendar days** before may be accepted but the processing may take up to 15 calendar days. When applying for a Schengen visa, each person must pay a visa fee. This fee is non-refundable regardless of the visa result. The Schengen visa fee for citizens of Azerbaijan, Russia, and Armenia is currently **35 EUR**. These three countries benefit from reduced visa costs under an agreement with the Schengen countries. In other countries, this amount is **80 EUR** for people over 12 years old, **40 EUR** for children 6-12 years old, and free for children under six years old.

You will apply for Slovenia Tourism/Private Visit Visa in Slovenia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location.

**Third-country nationals** - A national of a third country who wishes to enter and reside in the Republic of Slovenia for tourist, business, personal, or other purposes should obtain a visa prior to their entry into the country, unless they are citizens of countries that do not require a visa, or already hold one of the permits described below:

**Holders of a short-stay visa (C type)** issued by a Schengen country may, during the visa validity period, enter the Republic of Slovenia and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the visa, whichever is sooner. The permitted number of days of your stay can be calculated by using [this online calculator](#).

**Holders of a long-stay visa (D type)** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this visa and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the long-stay visa, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the long-stay visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a residence permit** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this residence permit and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the residence permit, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the residence permit, whichever is sooner.

#### **Short-stay Visa (C type) application requirements:**

**All requested documents have to be submitted and translated into English or Slovenian.**

#### **General requirements**

- ***Valid passport or travel document.*** Must be valid for minimum 3 months after the journey and issued within the previous 10 years and have at least 2 blank pages. A copy of passport or travel document.
- ***Application form*** duly completed, dated and signed by the applicant.
- ***One (1) recent photograph.***
- ***Travel medical insurance*** covering the entire duration of the trip valid in the whole Schengen area. The minimum coverage of 30.000 euros, covering:

emergency medical expenses, hospital treatment, repatriation for medical reasons, or repatriation of remains. Multi-entry visa applicants must have insurance for the duration of the first trip.

- ***Copy of flight ticket or flight reservation including return flight.***
- ***Verifiable evidence of sufficient*** means of subsistence during intended stay: payslips for the last 3 months, valid international credit card accompanied by bank statements, bank account statements for the last three (3) months or a national form for proof of sponsorship and/or accommodation.
- ***Proof of accommodation:*** hotel reservation, proof of rental or ownership of real estate in the member state of destination, confirmation of private accommodation, mentioning that the host will cover the accommodation costs, confirmation of accommodation by the company inviting the applicant, mentioning that the company will cover the accommodation costs.
- ***Minors traveling without their parents/legal guardian:*** Original authorisation signed by their parents/legal guardian in front of a visa officer or duly legalised and copy of the passport(s) of parents/legal guardian.
- ***Residence permit*** valid three months beyond the intended date of departure from the territory of the Member States or, for GCC citizens, a UAE ID-card, valid for three months after the intended departure date from the territory of the Member States.
- ***Employees:*** original letter from employer stating the applicant's employment status, position, length of the contract and salary, self-employed persons: valid original trade license, documents to be submitted relating to the purpose of the journey.

**I. Business trip- *Invitation from the inviting company (Letter of Guarantee) or an authority to attend a meeting, conference or event*** (The invitation must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter of guarantee with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.) and other documents for work purpose (e.g. confirmed registration for trade fairs or congresses).

**II. Official delegation/mission-** Letter issued by the authority (-ies) concerned confirming identity of the applicant(s), purpose of the journey (meeting, consultation, negotiations or events held by intergovernmental organizations), period of intended stay and accommodation details.

**III. Tourism-** Full travel itinerary.

**IV. Private visit** - Invitation letter signed (Letter of Guarantee) by the host covering the period of the intended stay (The Invitation Letter must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.).

**V. Medical treatment** - A document issued by the medical institution in the Member State of destination confirming that the applicant will receive medical care in that institution; Pre-payment or other proof of sufficient financial means to cover the medical treatment and related expenses, such as insurance coverage.

**VI. Study or training** - A certificate of enrollment at an educational establishment for the purpose of attending vocational or theoretical courses within the framework of basic and further training.; Student cards or certificates of the courses to be attended.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**IMPORTANT:** A visa application must be submitted **at least 15 calendar days** and no more than six months before the intended visit. Croatia Tourist visa fee is **60 EUR**, to be paid upon submission of the application. Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. The fee may vary depending on your nationality or your country of submission. You will apply for a Croatia Tourist visa in Croatia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. **Each visa applicant shall enclose following documents with the application:**

  - means of transport and the intention to return to the applicant's country of origin or to a third country.

Pursuant to the Government's Decision, starting with 22 July 2014, the Republic of Croatia applies the Decision No 565/2014/EU. **All third-country nationals who are holders of valid Schengen documents, as well as national visas and residence permits of Bulgaria, Cyprus, and Romania do not require an additional (Croatian) visa for Croatia.**

Third-country nationals who are holders of:

**uniform visa (C) for two or multiple entries, valid for all Schengen Area Member States;**

**visa with limited territorial validity (LTV visa), for two or multiple entries, issued to the holder of a travel document that is not recognized by one or more, but not all of the Schengen Area Member States, and which is valid for the territory of the Member States recognizing the travel document;**

**long-stay visa (D) for stays exceeding three months, issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;**

**residence permit issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;**

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Bulgaria, listed in Annex I of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Cyprus, listed in Annex III of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Romania, listed in Annex IV of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

**do not require a visa for transit or intended stays in the territory of Croatia not exceeding 90 days in any 180-day period.**

**Short-term visa (visa C) - approval for transit through or intended stay in the territory of Croatia for a duration of no more than 90 days in any 180-day period;**

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions: No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.**

## Entry in Montenegro -

Nationals of Iran are required to obtain a visa to enter Montenegro. Visas may be obtained from diplomatic and consular posts of Montenegro. If an applicant is unable to reach a diplomatic or consular post of Montenegro, you may apply for a visa at the nearest diplomatic or consular post of the Republic of Serbia.

**IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Montenegro Short-stay visa is 3-10 working days. Montenegro Short-stay visa is 35 EUR. The fee may vary depending on your nationality or your country of submission. You will apply for a Montenegro Short-stay visa in Montenegro visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case- **Embassy of the Republic of Serbia in Teheran, the Islamic Republic of Iran or Embassy of Montenegro in Republic of Turkey.**

For a foreigner who is minor, i.e. legally incapable, visa application shall be filed by a parent or his legal representative.

### **In addition to the visa application, the foreigner shall submit:**

- valid travel document (the period of validity of the travel document should exceed that of the visas by three months);
- one color photo 35x45 mm;
- proof of the purpose of stay in Montenegro (letter of guarantee by a physical person or letter of invitation by a legal entity, state authority in Montenegro or organizer of an international conference or event);
- proof of ensured accommodation (receipt from a tourist arrangement, hotel or other type of accommodation reservation that has been paid in);

- proof of possession of means for sustenance during his stay in Montenegro, as well as for return into the country where he comes from or for travel into a third state (cash, a bank account, traveler's checks, credit cards etc.);
- proof of the means of travel and intention to return into the state where a foreigner comes from or into a third state (a return airplane or other transportation ticket, a driving license);
- proof of health insurance;
- proof that the consular fee has been charged,
- as well as other corresponding documents based on which the purpose and ensured accommodation in Montenegro can be determined

You can enter Montenegro with your Schengen visa, provided the visa still has valid entries left as well as remaining days of stay. This also applies to holders of residence permits for a Schengen country.

Montenegro Short-stay visa (C) may be issued for one, two, or multiple entries into Montenegro for tourist, business, personal or other purposes. Continuous stay or the total duration of consecutive visits may not exceed 90 days in a period of 6 months, counting from the date of first entry. The validity period of Visa C for multiple entries is up to one year. Exceptionally this type of visa may be issued for a more extended period of validity, but no longer than five years. A short-stay visa may be given to a group of foreigners (collective visa). The validity period of a collective visa cannot exceed 30 days, and it may be affixed to a group passport.

Montenegro is not included in the Schengen Agreement. Therefore, Montenegro visas are valid only for its territory. You can't travel to Schengen countries with a Montenegro visa.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Serbia Tourist visa is **3-10 calendar days**. It depends on your visa application country. Serbia Tourist visa fee is **80 EUR**. Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a Serbia Tourist

visa in Serbia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of the Republic of Serbia in Tehran.**

#### **General visa requirements:**

- Valid passport (passport must be valid at least 90 days from issue date of visa)

  - for a private visit – invitation letter certified by the relevant authority of the Republic of Serbia
  - for a business visit – invitation letter by a company in Serbia;
  - for a tourist trip – a proof of payment for the trip issued by a travel agency (voucher or other type of payment receipt);
- Completed visa application form: (PDF) ;
- Photo (size 3.5x4.5cm);
- Return ticket or Itinerary (copy of Driving License and Insurance if you travel by car);
- Proof of sufficient funds for staying in Serbia;
- Health insurance
- Visa fee.

On October 30, 2014, the Government of the Republic of Serbia adopted the Decision on visa free entry to the Republic of Serbia for holders of foreign national passports having a valid Schengen, UK and other Member States' visa, or visa of the United States of America, and for holders of foreign national passports having residence permit in the countries of the Schengen area, EU or the United States of America.

On basis of this decision, the above-mentioned categories of foreign nationals may, without prior visa application, enter, transit and stay in the Republic of Serbia up to 90 days during a six-month period, and within validity of said visas or residence permits. There is a possibility for foreign nationals to enter the Republic of Serbia with two passports e.g. expired national passport with valid visa or residence permit and valid national passport without valid visa or residence permit. Foreign nationals, holders of a residence permit in the form of a separate card (not a sticker affixed to their passport), must present their valid passport upon entering the territory of the Republic of Serbia.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** There are no restrictions on entering the Republic of Serbia. The recommendation to wear masks indoors remains in force, while wearing masks in health facilities is mandatory.

**Entry in Bosnia and Herzegovina - Citizens of the Islamic Republic of Iran are required visas** when entering, exiting or travelling through Bosnia and Herzegovina.

**Holders of diplomatic and service passports of the Islamic Republic of Iran are exempted from the visa requirement** when entering, exiting or travelling through Bosnia and Herzegovina up to 90 days.

All visa applications must be submitted in person. The Embassy do not accept applications sent through email.

Short-term visa's validity period can be a maximum of **90 days**.

**IMPORTANT:** Applications should be made **at least 10-30 days before your intended departure date**. Bosnia & Herzegovina's fees cover only a part of the work necessary to process your application. Because processing fees are only for handling your application, you will not get your money back, even if your application is refused. The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150,00 (ore equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) for each day of intended stay. Bosnia and Herzegovina Short-term Visa fee is **31 EUR for single-entry and 57 EUR for a multiple-entry visa** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such

as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a Bosnia and Herzegovina Short-term visa in Bosnia and Herzegovina visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location.

**Listed below are the documents required when applying for a visa to Bosnia and Herzegovina:**

A valid passport of the applicant

Application form (completed and signed)

Copy of a valid residence visa

Copy of a round trip ticket or itinerary

One passport size picture

Travel insurance

No objection letter from your company or your sponsor

**In addition to the above, the following items must be presented:**

**If I travel as a tourist** : Voucher of the travel agency stating that the trip has been paid in full

Copy of your bank statement for the last 3 months

**If visiting friends and/or relatives**: Letter of invitation from the person(s) the applicant intends to visit, certified by the Ministry of Security of Bosnia and Herzegovina – Department for Foreign Citizens.

**If traveling on business**: Letter from the employer stating the purpose of the trip to Bosnia and Herzegovina

Letter of invitation from a company in Bosnia and Herzegovina, certified by the Ministry of Security of Bosnia and Herzegovina – Department for Foreign Citizens.

**Children under the age of 18**: For children under the age of 18 a birth certificate is required.

Nationals of the following states may enter into Bosnia and Herzegovina with a passport or a valid identity card proving identity and citizenship of:

- Member State of the European Union
- State signatory to the Schengen Agreement
- Andorra, Montenegro, Liechtenstein, Monaco, San Marino, Serbia, the Holy See and Swiss Confederation.

The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150.00 (or equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) - for each day of the intended stay.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** The Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina has adopted a Decision on declaring a natural or other disaster on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina ('Official Gazette of BiH', 18/20), due to the danger of an epidemic of infectious disease caused by new coronavirus (COVID-19), in order to reduce the risk of accelerated spread of infection in Bosnia and Herzegovina and enable the engagement of additional resources to respond to this public health threat.

In order to prevent and suppress the spread of the SARS-COV-2 virus, the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina also adopted a **DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA**, as well as **DECISION ON AMENDMENT OF THE DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA** ('Official Gazette of BiH', 36/21').

**(Article 2) A foreigner who meets conditions for entry to BiH prescribed by Law on Aliens, may enter BiH if he/she at the BiH Border Crossing Points presents any of the following:**

- negative PCR test or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, not older than 48 hours if he/she comes from a European country, and if he/she comes from another country, not older than 72 hours until arrival at the border crossing point of Bosnia and Herzegovina,

- certificate that a person has received the second dose of vaccine for COVID-19 before more than 14 days before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH or has received one dose before 14 days and more before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH, if it is a single dose vaccine,
- certificate issued by doctor showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19 in the previous period from 14 to 180 days until the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH.

**(Article 3) Exemptions from Article 2 of the Decision, foreigners who may enter Bosnia and Herzegovina without presenting a negative test result or certificates are:**

- citizens of Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and the Republic of Serbia, when they enter Bosnia and Herzegovina directly from the country of which they are citizens, as well as their minor children and spouses who are citizens of other countries,
- the crew and cabin crew of the aircraft whose final destination is Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- drivers and co-drivers of freight vehicles when performing international transport of goods by road, provided that their stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina does not last longer than 12 hours,
- crews of freight trains and ships in international traffic,
- diplomatic and consular staff and staff of international organizations in the performance of their official duties, who must have and present an appropriate valid passport upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- civil protection services and teams when their entry into Bosnia and Herzegovina is urgent and cannot be postponed,
- members of the military forces of the member states of the North Atlantic Treaty and other states participating in the Partnership for Peace and members of the NATO and EUFOR Headquarters in Bosnia and Herzegovina,

- heads of states and governments and members of their delegations whose arrival and departure from Bosnia and Herzegovina have been announced to Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina, through diplomatic channels or through protocols of the competent authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- foreigners transiting through the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the purpose of returning to the country of usual residence, without staying in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- a minor foreigner whose parent is a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as a foreigner who is the spouse of a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- children under the age of seven travelling with parents or guardians, if their parents or guardians possess negative PCR or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, or certificate on vaccination or certificate showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19,
- foreigners authorized to stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina temporarily or permanently, if they are returning to Bosnia and Herzegovina after exit and stay only in Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and/or the Republic of Serbia, provided that total duration of their stay in the above countries has not been longer than 48 hours since they left the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina, which could be proved by exiting stamp, i.e. entering stamp in a travel document of the foreigner,
- foreigners – citizens of the Republic of Turkey crossing the state border of Bosnia and Herzegovina daily due to construction of the bridge Rača in the framework of realization of the Project motorway/expressway Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo. Ministry of Communication and Transport of BiH shall submit to the BiH Border Police a certified list of nationals of the Republic of Turkey Border Police hired as workers for construction of the Rača Bridge within the above mentioned Project, including their names, surnames and number of travel document they use for crossing of the BiH border; as well as

certificate that the Project is implemented according to signed Agreement on Cooperation regarding realization of the Project motorway/expressway road Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo (“Official Gazette BiH – International Agreements”, no. 13/20).

***Ukrainian citizens who left Ukraine due to the security situation***

By the Decision on prescribing additional conditions for the entry of foreigners into BiH, it is not prescribed what kind/type of PCR or antigen tests, i.e. form of tests or certificates is required to present at the border crossing points during intended entry to BiH, and it is possible to present them in printed or electronic form.

**Remarks:** Currently, when entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, no quarantine or self-isolation measures are prescribed, while upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, all persons are obliged to follow the instructions and respect all orders of the competent epidemiological and health authorities (social distance, protective masks, hand disinfection, etc.).

Albania Short-term visa’s validity period can be a maximum of **90 days**.

**IMPORTANT:** A visa is issued up to 15 days from the acceptance of the application and in exceptional cases may take up to 30 days. Albania Short-term Visa fee is **35-60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for an Albania Short-term Visa in Albania visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location.

General requirements:

**For business/congress/sports travel:** Original invitation letter by the company/organization, Confirmation of the accommodation (hotel confirmation, apartment rental contract, etc.), Verbal Note from the institution where the foreigner is employed.

Albania applies visa-free travel, during the tourist period, from **01 May 2022 to 30 September 2022**, citizens of Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, Oman, Qatar, the Arab Republic of Egypt, India, Russia and Thailand, travel without a visa to Albania, without having to obtain a visa at the Albanian Embassy.

For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

All foreigners who have a valid multi – entry Schengen visa, type “C” or “D”, or a valid residence permit in one of the Schengen member states, can enter, stay and transit Albania without visa, within the validity term of the visa or the residence permit. The same applies for all holders of Laissez-Passer issued by United Nations Organizations, and its branch, NATO, Council of Europe and European Union, regardless of nationality. For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

**Holders of a valid type “C” multiple-entry Schengen visa (which has been previously used in one of the countries in Schengen area) or a Residence Permit to the Schengen Area, also holders of a valid UK, Canada and US visa (which has been previously used for entering that country) may enter to Albania without a visa for up to 15 days.**

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**Entry in Macedonia-** Entry visa for North Macedonia **REQUIRED.**

North Macedonia Short-term visa’s validity period can be a maximum of 90 days.

**IMPORTANT:** The foreigner submits a visa application to the competent (resident or non-resident) diplomatic-consular representation of the Republic of North Macedonia **no longer than six months and at least 15 days before the start of the intended trip.** The visa application is submitted in person. Upon exception, the visa

application may be submitted by another natural or legal person authorized to act as the proxy of the applicant when the foreigner is a disabled person or when the foreigner is a well-known person and there is no doubt about his/her bona fide intentions. The application for a minor is submitted in person by a parent or a guardian. **It takes 3 to 10 working days for a North Macedonia visa to be issued.** In extreme cases, the application process can take up to a month. North Macedonia Short-term Visa fee is **60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a North Macedonia Short-term Visa in North Macedonia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case, **Macedonian Embassy in Tehran, Iran.**

**The applicant encloses the following documentation with the visa application:**

- Valid travel document (the validity period of the travel document should exceed that of the visa by at least three months), the travel document must have been issued within the last 10 years and it must include at least two empty pages for visa purposes and one photograph size 35x45 mm
- Proof of valid travel medical insurance
- Proof of fees paid
- Documents that prove: the purpose of the visit to RNM, secured accommodation, means of subsistence to cover the stay in RNM and the repatriation or the travel to a third country, means of transport and the intention to return to the country of origin or the intention to travel to a third country.
  
- Nationals of EU Member States and signatories of the Schengen Agreement **DO NOT** need a visa to enter the Republic of North Macedonia (and are eligible to enter the Republic of North Macedonia with a valid national identity card).
- Third-country nationals with temporary residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with permanent residence in an EU Member State or

a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.

- Third-country nationals with multiple-entry Schengen visa (type C) valid for at least 5 (five) days beyond the intended stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.

The Republic of North Macedonia has abolished short-term stay (Type C) visas for foreign nationals who are holders of valid passports of third countries and are simultaneously holders of valid UK, US, and Canadian visas, whereby the duration of their stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may not exceed 15 days, with the periods of validity of the valid UK, US, and Canadian visas they hold not exceeding more than 5 days from their planned stay in the Republic of North Macedonia. This decision is of a temporary character and shall be in force from 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2022.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** Visitors entering North Macedonia will no longer be required to present a vaccination certificate or a negative COVID-19 test.

**Short-term visa (visa C)** - approval for transit through or intended stay in the territory of Croatia for a duration of no more than 90 days in any 180-day period;

**IMPORTANT:** A visa application must be submitted **at least 15 calendar days** and no more than six months before the intended visit. Croatia Tourist visa fee is **60 EUR**, to be paid upon submission of the application. Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. The fee may vary depending on your nationality or your country of submission. You will apply for a Croatia Tourist visa in Croatia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **DM/CO Republic of Croatia**.

**Each visa applicant shall enclose following documents with the application:**

- valid travel document

the validity period of the travel document should exceed that of the visa by three months

travel document must be issued in the previous 10 years

travel document must contain at least two empty pages for the visa

- a 35x45 mm colour photo
- evidence of travel health insurance
- evidence of paid visa fee
- documents that prove:
  - the purpose of the stay in Croatia
  - ensured accommodation
  - means of subsistence to cover the stay in Croatia and the return to the country

- of origin or to a third country
- means of transport and the intention to return to the applicant's country of origin or to a third country.

Pursuant to the Government's Decision, starting with 22 July 2014, the Republic of Croatia applies the Decision No 565/2014/EU. **All third-country nationals who are holders of valid Schengen documents, as well as national visas and residence permits of Bulgaria, Cyprus, and Romania do not require an additional (Croatian) visa for Croatia.**

Third-country nationals who are holders of:

**uniform visa (C) for two or multiple entries, valid for all Schengen Area Member States;**

**visa with limited territorial validity (LTV visa), for two or multiple entries, issued to the holder of a travel document that is not recognized by one or more, but not all of the Schengen Area Member States, and which is valid for the territory of the Member States recognizing the travel document;**

**long-stay visa (D) for stays exceeding three months, issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;**

**residence permit issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;**

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Bulgaria, listed in Annex I of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Cyprus, listed in Annex III of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Romania, listed in Annex IV of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

**do not require a visa for transit or intended stays in the territory of Croatia not exceeding 90 days in any 180-day period.**

Nationals of Afghanistan are required to obtain a visa to enter Montenegro. Visas may be obtained from diplomatic and consular posts of Montenegro. If you are unable to reach a diplomatic or consular post of Montenegro, you may apply for a visa at the nearest diplomatic or consular post of the Republic of Serbia.

**IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Montenegro Short-stay visa is 3-10 working days. Montenegro Short-stay visa is 35 EUR. The fee may vary depending on your nationality or your country of submission. You will apply for a Montenegro Short-stay visa in Montenegro visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case- **Embassy of the Republic of Serbia in New Delhi, the Republic of India.**

Montenegro Short-stay visa (C) may be issued for one, two, or multiple entries into Montenegro for tourist, business, personal or other purposes. Continuous stay or the total duration of consecutive visits may not exceed 90 days in a period of 6 months, counting from the date of first entry. The validity period of Visa C for multiple entries is up to one year. Exceptionally this type of visa may be issued for a more extended period of validity, but no longer than five years. A short-stay visa may be given to a group of foreigners (collective visa). The validity period of a collective visa cannot exceed 30 days, and it may be affixed to a group passport.

For a foreigner who is minor, i.e. legally incapable, visa application shall be filed by a parent or his legal representative.

In addition to the visa application, the foreigner shall submit:

- valid travel document (the period of validity of the travel document should exceed that of the visas by three months);
- one color photo 35x45 mm;
- proof of the purpose of stay in Montenegro (letter of guarantee by a physical person or letter of invitation by a legal entity, state authority in Montenegro or organizer of an international conference or event);
- proof of ensured accommodation (receipt from a tourist arrangement, hotel or other type of accommodation reservation that has been paid in);
- proof of possession of means for sustenance during his stay in Montenegro, as well as for return into the country where he comes from or for travel into a third state (cash, a bank account, traveler's checks, credit cards etc.);
- proof of the means of travel and intention to return into the state where a foreigner comes from or into a third state (a return airplane or other transportation ticket, a driving license);
- proof of health insurance;
- proof that the consular fee has been charged,
- as well as other corresponding documents based on which the purpose and ensured accommodation in Montenegro can be determined.

You can enter Montenegro with your Schengen visa, provided the visa still has valid entries left as well as remaining days of stay. This also applies to holders of residence permits for a Schengen country.

Montenegro is not included in the Schengen Agreement. Therefore, Montenegro visas are valid only for its territory. You can't travel to Schengen countries with a Montenegro visa.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

The Serbia Tourist visa permits you to stay in Serbia and realize your tourist activities for a maximum period of 90 days at most per 180 days.

**IMPORTANT:** The average processing time for a Serbia Tourist visa is **3-10 calendar days**. It depends on your visa application country. Serbia Tourist visa fee is **80 EUR**. Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission.

You will apply for a Serbia Tourist visa in Serbia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location.

#### **General visa requirements:**

- Valid passport (passport must be valid at least 90 days from issue date of visa)
- Letter of invitation:
  - for a private visit – invitation letter certified by the relevant authority of the Republic of Serbia
  - for a business visit – invitation letter by a company in Serbia;
  - for a tourist trip – a proof of payment for the trip issued by a travel agency (voucher or other type of payment receipt);
- Completed visa application form: (PDF) ;
- Photo (size 3.5x4.5cm);
- Return ticket or Itinerary (copy of Driving License and Insurance if you travel by car);
- Proof of sufficient funds for staying in Serbia;
- Health insurance
- Visa fee.

On October 30, 2014, the Government of the Republic of Serbia adopted the Decision on visa free entry to the Republic of Serbia for holders of foreign national passports having a valid Schengen, UK and other Member States' visa, or visa of the United States of America, and for holders of foreign national passports having

residence permit in the countries of the Schengen area, EU or the United States of America.

On basis of this decision, the above-mentioned categories of foreign nationals may, without prior visa application, enter, transit and stay in the Republic of Serbia up to 90 days during a six-month period, and within validity of said visas or residence permits. There is a possibility for foreign nationals to enter the Republic of Serbia with two passports e.g. expired national passport with valid visa or residence permit and valid national passport without valid visa or residence permit. Foreign nationals, holders of a residence permit in the form of a separate card (not a sticker affixed to their passport), must present their valid passport upon entering the territory of the Republic of Serbia.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** There are no restrictions on entering the Republic of Serbia. The recommendation to wear masks indoors remains in force, while wearing masks in health facilities is mandatory.

**Citizens of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan are required visas** when entering, exiting or travelling through Bosnia and Herzegovina. All visa applications

must be submitted in person. The Embassy do not accept applications sent through email.

Short-term visa's validity period can be a maximum of **90 days**.

**IMPORTANT:** Applications should be made **at least 10-30 days before your intended departure date**. The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150,00 (ore equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) for each day of intended stay. Bosnia & Herzegovina's fees cover only a part of the work necessary to process your application. Because processing fees are only for handling your application, you will not get your money back, even if your application is refused. Bosnia and Herzegovina Short-term Visa fee is **31 EUR for single-entry and 57 EUR for a multiple-entry visa** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a Bosnia and Herzegovina Short-term visa in Bosnia and Herzegovina visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location.

**Listed below are the documents required when applying for a visa to Bosnia and Herzegovina:**

A valid passport of the applicant

Application form (completed and signed)

Copy of a valid residence visa

Copy of a round trip ticket or itinerary

One passport size picture

Travel insurance

No objection letter from your company or your sponsor.

**In addition to the above, the following items must be presented:**

**If I travel as a tourist** : Voucher of the travel agency stating that the trip has been paid in full

Copy of your bank statement for the last 3 months

**If visiting friends and/or relatives:** Letter of invitation from the person(s) the applicant intends to visit, certified by the Ministry of Security of Bosnia and Herzegovina – Department for Foreign Citizens.

**If traveling on business:** Letter from the employer stating the purpose of the trip to Bosnia and Herzegovina

Letter of invitation from a company in Bosnia and Herzegovina, certified by the Ministry of Security of Bosnia and Herzegovina – Department for Foreign Citizens.

**Children under the age of 18:** For children under the age of 18 a birth certificate is required.

Nationals of the following states may enter into Bosnia and Herzegovina with a passport or a valid identity card proving identity and citizenship of:

- Member State of the European Union
- State signatory to the Schengen Agreement
- Andorra, Montenegro, Liechtenstein, Monaco, San Marino, Serbia, the Holy See and Swiss Confederation.

The minimum amount of financial resources required for the stay of foreigners on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina is KM 150.00 (or equivalent in freely convertible foreign currency) - for each day of the intended stay.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** The Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina has adopted a Decision on declaring a natural or other disaster on the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina ('Official Gazette of BiH', 18/20), due to the danger of an epidemic of infectious disease caused by new coronavirus (COVID-19), in order to reduce the risk of accelerated spread of infection in Bosnia and Herzegovina and enable the engagement of additional resources to respond to this public health threat.

In order to prevent and suppress the spread of the SARS-COV-2 virus, the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina also adopted a **DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA**, as well as **DECISION ON AMENDMENT OF THE DECISION ON PRESCRIBING ADDITIONAL**

**CONDITIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF FOREIGNERS INTO BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA** ('Official Gazette of BiH', 36/21').

**(Article 2) A foreigner who meets conditions for entry to BiH prescribed by Law on Aliens, may enter BiH if he/she at the BiH Border Crossing Points presents any of the following:**

- negative PCR test or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, not older than 48 hours if he/she comes from a European country, and if he/she comes from another country, not older than 72 hours until arrival at the border crossing point of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- certificate that a person has received the second dose of vaccine for COVID-19 before more than 14 days before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH or has received one dose before 14 days and more before the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH, if it is a single dose vaccine,
- certificate issued by doctor showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19 in the previous period from 14 to 180 days until the arrival to a Border Crossing Point of BiH.

**(Article 3) Exemptions from Article 2 of the Decision, foreigners who may enter Bosnia and Herzegovina without presenting a negative test result or certificates are:**

- citizens of Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and the Republic of Serbia, when they enter Bosnia and Herzegovina directly from the country of which they are citizens, as well as their minor children and spouses who are citizens of other countries,
- the crew and cabin crew of the aircraft whose final destination is Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- drivers and co-drivers of freight vehicles when performing international transport of goods by road, provided that their stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina does not last longer than 12 hours,
- crews of freight trains and ships in international traffic,

- diplomatic and consular staff and staff of international organizations in the performance of their official duties, who must have and present an appropriate valid passport upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- civil protection services and teams when their entry into Bosnia and Herzegovina is urgent and cannot be postponed,
- members of the military forces of the member states of the North Atlantic Treaty and other states participating in the Partnership for Peace and members of the NATO and EUFOR Headquarters in Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- heads of states and governments and members of their delegations whose arrival and departure from Bosnia and Herzegovina have been announced to Border Police of Bosnia and Herzegovina, through diplomatic channels or through protocols of the competent authority of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- foreigners transiting through the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the purpose of returning to the country of usual residence, without staying in the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- a minor foreigner whose parent is a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as a foreigner who is the spouse of a citizen of Bosnia and Herzegovina,
- children under the age of seven travelling with parents or guardians, if their parents or guardians possess negative PCR or rapid antigen test on SARS-CoV-2, or certificate on vaccination or certificate showing that he/she has recovered from COVID-19,
- foreigners authorized to stay in Bosnia and Herzegovina temporarily or permanently, if they are returning to Bosnia and Herzegovina after exit and stay only in Montenegro, the Republic of Croatia and/or the Republic of Serbia, provided that total duration of their stay in the above countries has not been longer than 48 hours since they left the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina, which could be proved by exiting stamp, i.e. entering stamp in a travel document of the foreigner,

- foreigners – citizens of the Republic of Turkey crossing the state border of Bosnia and Herzegovina daily due to construction of the bridge Rača in the framework of realization of the Project motorway/expressway Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo. Ministry of Communication and Transport of BiH shall submit to the BiH Border Police a certified list of nationals of the Republic of Turkey Border Police hired as workers for construction of the Rača Bridge within the above mentioned Project, including their names, surnames and number of travel document they use for crossing of the BiH border; as well as certificate that the Project is implemented according to signed Agreement on Cooperation regarding realization of the Project motorway/expressway road Sarajevo-Beograd-Sarajevo (“Official Gazette BiH – International Agreements”, no. 13/20).

***Ukrainian citizens who left Ukraine due to the security situation***

By the Decision on prescribing additional conditions for the entry of foreigners into BiH, it is not prescribed what kind/type of PCR or antigen tests, i.e. form of tests or certificates is required to present at the border crossing points during intended entry to BiH, and it is possible to present them in printed or electronic form.

**Remarks:** Currently, when entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, no quarantine or self-isolation measures are prescribed, while upon entering Bosnia and Herzegovina, all persons are obliged to follow the instructions and respect all orders of the competent epidemiological and health authorities (social distance, protective masks, hand disinfection, etc.).

Albania Short-term visa's validity period can be a maximum of **90 days**.

**IMPORTANT:** A visa is issued up to 15 days from the acceptance of the application and in exceptional cases may take up to 30 days. Albania Short-term Visa fee is **35-60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for an Albania Short-term Visa in Albania visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location.

General requirements:

- **Application Form**
- **Passport**

**For tourism:** Confirmation of the accommodation (hotel confirmation, apartment rental contract, etc.), Round-trip ticket reservation

**For business/congress/sports travel:** Original invitation letter by the company/organization, Confirmation of the accommodation (hotel confirmation, apartment rental contract, etc.), Verbal Note from the institution where the foreigner is employed.

Albania applies visa-free travel, during the tourist period, from **01 May 2022 to 30 September 2022**, citizens of Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, Oman, Qatar, the Arab Republic of Egypt, India, Russia and Thailand, travel without a visa to Albania, without having to obtain a visa at the Albanian Embassy.

For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

All foreigners who have a valid multi – entry Schengen visa, type “C” or “D”, or a valid residence permit in one of the Schengen member states, can enter, stay and transit Albania without visa, within the validity term of the visa or the residence permit. The same applies for all holders of Laissez-Passer issued by United Nations Organizations, and its branch, NATO, Council of Europe and European Union, regardless of nationality. For the citizens that enter the territory of the Republic of Albania without visas, the permit of stay is 90 days within a period of 180 days and during the first 30 days of their stay, they should show up to the General Border Directorate of Migration to inform about their generalities and time of stay otherwise they will be fined when they departure Albania.

**Holders of a valid type “C” multiple-entry Schengen visa (which has been previously used in one of the countries in Schengen area) or a Residence Permit to the Schengen Area, also holders of a valid UK, Canada and US visa (which has been previously used for entering that country) may enter to Albania without a visa for up to 15 days.**

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**Entry in Macedonia-** Entry visa for North Macedonia **REQUIRED.**

North Macedonia Short-term visa's validity period can be a maximum of 90 days.

**IMPORTANT:** The foreigner submits a visa application to the competent (resident or non-resident) diplomatic-consular representation of the Republic of North Macedonia **no longer than six months and at least 15 days before the start of the intended trip.** The visa application is submitted in person. Upon exception, the visa application may be submitted by another natural or legal person authorized to act as the proxy of the applicant when the foreigner is a disabled person or when the foreigner is a well-known person and there is no doubt about his/her bona fide intentions. The application for a minor is submitted in person by a parent or a guardian. **It takes 3 to 10 working days for a North Macedonia visa to be issued.** In extreme cases, the application process can take up to a month. North Macedonia Short-term Visa fee is **60 EUR** (it can vary depending on your country and nationality). Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. You will apply for a North Macedonia Short-term Visa in North Macedonia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location.

**The applicant encloses the following documentation with the visa application:**

- Valid travel document (the validity period of the travel document should exceed that of the visa by at least three months), the travel document must have been issued within the last 10 years and it must include at least two empty

pages for visa purposes and one photograph size 35x45 mm

- Proof of valid travel medical insurance
- Proof of fees paid
- Documents that prove: the purpose of the visit to RNM, secured accommodation, means of subsistence to cover the stay in RNM and the repatriation or the travel to a third country, means of transport and the intention to return to the country of origin or the intention to travel to a third country.
- Nationals of EU Member States and signatories of the Schengen Agreement DO NOT need a visa to enter the Republic of North Macedonia (and are eligible to enter the Republic of North Macedonia with a valid national identity card).
- Third-country nationals with temporary residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with permanent residence in an EU Member State or a country signatory of the Schengen Agreement may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.
- Third-country nationals with multiple-entry Schengen visa (type C) valid for at least 5 (five) days beyond the intended stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may stay no longer than 15 (fifteen) days upon every entry into the territory of the Republic of North Macedonia as long as the total length of stay does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period.

The Republic of North Macedonia has abolished short-term stay (Type C) visas for foreign nationals who are holders of valid passports of third countries and are simultaneously holders of valid UK, US, and Canadian visas, whereby the duration of their stay in the Republic of North Macedonia may not exceed 15 days, with the periods of validity of the valid UK, US, and Canadian visas they hold not exceeding more than 5 days from their planned stay in the Republic of North Macedonia. This decision is of a temporary character and shall be in force from 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2022.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** Visitors entering North Macedonia will no longer be required to present a vaccination certificate or a negative COVID-19 test.

**IMPORTANT:** A visa application must be submitted **at least 15 calendar days** and no more than six months before the intended visit. Croatia Tourist visa fee is **60 EUR**, to be paid upon submission of the application. Additionally, you may also need to pay other Administrative fees such as the Visa Application center fee, courier service fee, etc., depending on the country and location of your documents' submission. The fee may vary depending on your nationality or your country of submission. You will apply for a Croatia Tourist visa in Croatia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location.

**Each visa applicant shall enclose following documents with the application:**

- valid travel document

the validity period of the travel document should exceed that of the visa by three months

travel document must be issued in the previous 10 years

travel document must contain at least two empty pages for the visa

- a 35x45 mm colour photo
- evidence of travel health insurance
- evidence of paid visa fee
- documents that prove:
  - the purpose of the stay in Croatia
  - ensured accommodation

- means of subsistence to cover the stay in Croatia and the return to the country of origin or to a third country
- means of transport and the intention to return to the applicant's country of origin or to a third country.

Pursuant to the Government's Decision, starting with 22 July 2014, the Republic of Croatia applies the Decision No 565/2014/EU. **All third-country nationals who are holders of valid Schengen documents, as well as national visas and residence permits of Bulgaria, Cyprus, and Romania do not require an additional (Croatian) visa for Croatia.**

Third-country nationals who are holders of:

**uniform visa (C) for two or multiple entries, valid for all Schengen Area Member States;**

**visa with limited territorial validity (LTV visa), for two or multiple entries, issued to the holder of a travel document that is not recognized by one or more, but not all of the Schengen Area Member States, and which is valid for the territory of the Member States recognizing the travel document;**

**long-stay visa (D) for stays exceeding three months, issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;**

**residence permit issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;**

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Bulgaria, listed in Annex I of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Cyprus, listed in Annex III of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

**national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Romania, listed in Annex IV of the Decision No 565/2014/EU;**

**do not require a visa for transit or intended stays in the territory of Croatia not exceeding 90 days in any 180-day period.**

**Short-term visa (visa C) - approval for transit through or intended stay in the territory of Croatia for a duration of no more than 90 days in any 180-day period;**

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.

**Entry in Slovenia** - Afghan citizens need a visa to enter Slovenia. Visa is required to enter an airport transit area too (airport transit visa). You can find additional information on the <https://www.gov.si/en/topics/entry-and-residence/>

A short-stay visa (C type) is an authorization issued to a third-country national for entry and temporary stay (up to 90 days). An application for a C type visa should be submitted with the Schengen country that is the main destination. On behalf of Slovenia, this type of visa can also be issued by another Schengen country if the two countries have concluded a representation agreement. A C type visa may be extended in exceptional cases where the circumstances prevent the visa holder from returning to the country of origin.

**IMPORTANT:** A visa application must be submitted **at least 15 calendar days** and no more than six months before the intended visit. A visa application submitted **less than 15 calendar days** before may be accepted but the processing may take up to 15 calendar days. When applying for a Schengen visa, each person must pay a visa fee. This fee is non-refundable regardless of the visa result. The Schengen visa fee for citizens of Azerbaijan, Russia, and Armenia is currently **35 EUR**. These three countries benefit from reduced visa costs under an agreement with the Schengen countries. In other countries, this amount is **80 EUR** for people over 12 years old, **40 EUR** for children 6-12 years old, and free for children under six years old.

You will apply for Slovenia Tourism/Private Visit Visa in Slovenia visa application centers, embassies, or consulates, whichever accepts visa applications in your

country of residence. If there is none of them in your country, you need to apply to the nearest embassy or consulate to your location. In this case - **Embassy of the Republic of Slovenia in Cairo.**

**Third-country nationals** - A national of a third country who wishes to enter and reside in the Republic of Slovenia for tourist, business, personal, or other purposes should obtain a visa prior to their entry into the country, unless they are citizens of countries that do not require a visa, or already hold one of the permits described below:

**Holders of a short-stay visa (C type)** issued by a Schengen country may, during the visa validity period, enter the Republic of Slovenia and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the visa, whichever is sooner. The permitted number of days of your stay can be calculated by using this online calculator.

**Holders of a long-stay visa (D type)** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this visa and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the long-stay visa, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the long-stay visa, whichever is sooner.

**Holders of a residence permit** issued by a Schengen country may enter the Republic of Slovenia with this residence permit and a valid travel document and stay in its territory, provided that the total length of their stay in Schengen countries, except in the territory of the Schengen country that issued the residence permit, does not exceed 90 days in any 180-day period, or until the expiry of the residence permit, whichever is sooner.

#### **Short-stay Visa (C type) application requirements:**

**All requested documents have to be submitted and translated into English or Slovenian.**

#### **General requirements**

- ***Valid passport or travel document.*** Must be valid for minimum 3 months after the journey and issued within the previous 10 years and have at least 2 blank pages. A copy of passport or travel document.

- **Application form** duly completed, dated and signed by the applicant.
- **One (1) recent photograph.**
- **Travel medical insurance** covering the entire duration of the trip valid in the whole Schengen area. The minimum coverage of 30.000 euros, covering: emergency medical expenses, hospital treatment, repatriation for medical reasons, or repatriation of remains. Multi-entry visa applicants must have insurance for the duration of the first trip.
- **Copy of flight ticket or flight reservation including return flight.**
- **Verifiable evidence of sufficient** means of subsistence during intended stay: payslips for the last 3 months, valid international credit card accompanied by bank statements, bank account statements for the last three (3) months or a national form for proof of sponsorship and/or accommodation.
- **Proof of accommodation:** hotel reservation, proof of rental or ownership of real estate in the member state of destination, confirmation of private accommodation, mentioning that the host will cover the accommodation costs, confirmation of accommodation by the company inviting the applicant, mentioning that the company will cover the accommodation costs.
- **Minors traveling without their parents/legal guardian:** Original authorisation signed by their parents/legal guardian in front of a visa officer or duly legalised and copy of the passport(s) of parents/legal guardian.
- **Residence permit** valid three months beyond the intended date of departure from the territory of the Member States or, for GCC citizens, a UAE ID-card, valid for three months after the intended departure date from the territory of the Member States.
- **Employees:** original letter from employer stating the applicant's employment status, position, length of the contract and salary, self-employed persons: valid original trade license, documents to be submitted relating to the purpose of the journey.

**I. Business trip- Invitation from the inviting company (Letter of Guarantee) or an authority to attend a meeting, conference or event** (The invitation must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter of guarantee with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.) and other documents for work purpose (e.g. confirmed registration for trade fairs or congresses).

**II. Official delegation/mission-** Letter issued by the authority (-ies) concerned confirming identity of the applicant(s), purpose of the journey (meeting, consultation, negotiations or events held by intergovernmental organizations), period of intended stay and accommodation details.

**III. Tourism-** Full travel itinerary.

**IV. Private visit** - Invitation letter signed (Letter of Guarantee) by the host covering the period of the intended stay (The Invitation Letter must be certified by a Slovenian administrative unit. A copy of the certified letter with the seal of the administrative authority and the registration number clearly visible is sufficient.).

**V. Medical treatment** - A document issued by the medical institution in the Member State of destination confirming that the applicant will receive medical care in that institution; Pre-payment or other proof of sufficient financial means to cover the medical treatment and related expenses, such as insurance coverage.

**VI. Study or training** - A certificate of enrollment at an educational establishment for the purpose of attending vocational or theoretical courses within the framework of basic and further training.; Student cards or certificates of the courses to be attended.

**COVID-19 Entry restrictions:** No Restrictions. Travelers are not required to present a certificate of vaccination, certificate of recovery from COVID-19, or a COVID-19 test.
